The Chore Program

The Chore Program is for all Southfield homeowners who are senior citizens, 62 or older, living alone, OR Certified handicapped living alone and whose annual income meets Federal guidelines: for a family of ONE the income must be \$27,500 or less and for a family of TWO the income must be \$31,400 or less.

Chore services include yard work (lawn care, shrub and tree trimming and leaf pick-up), snow removal, window and gutter cleaning, minor plumbing, minor furnace repair, minor electrical repair, minor painting and carpentry. Each qualified homeowner is allowed \$500 per year for the labor involved, while the client is responsible for material used. By helping with home and yard maintenance, the Chore Program enables homeowners to stay in their homes.

TOSS (Transportation of Southfield Seniors)

Transportation of Southfield Seniors - TOSS is currently providing transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, pharmacies, some retail stores and banks between the hours of 8:30 am-3:30 pm, Monday - Friday. The dispatcher is available to take your reservation Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8:30-11:30 am. Appointments must be made with the dispatcher, at least 2 business days in advance.

Masks are required for all riders and drivers. The number of riders on each bus are limited, all touch points are being wiped after each rider and buses are being cleaned daily.

Bus service is provided in the geographical area of 8 Mile to 14 Mile and Coolidge to Middle Belt. If you have any questions, or would like to schedule a reservation, please call the TOSS office at 248-796-4658 and leave a message with your name, phone number and someone will return your call as soon as possible.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

This program takes place Dec 15 at the Southfield Human Services office at the 26000 Evergreen Road. It is open to any Oakland County resident, and allows participants to pick up 1 bag of non-perishable food. Please contact Human Services for program eligibility.

Focus Hope

Michigan Prescription Discount Cards

Michigan Prescription Card is a free statewide prescription assistance program available to Michigan residents. There are no restrictions or eligibility requirements—anyone can use the card regardless of age, income, or preexisting conditions.

Commission on Senior Adults (COSA): Taking Care of Southfield Seniors

Welcome to fall, a favorite time of the year for many. Though some people have been vaccinated, COVID continues to evolve calling for us to remain cautious and in some cases, continue masking and social distancing. Today, we would like to discuss how important it is to focus on communication, and sharing of information, so that others might learn.

Recently, a COSA commissioner received a phone call requesting help with a transportation issue. Portia Tremholm-Hamlar's regular transporter was unable to provide a ride to a regularly scheduled doctor's appointment. COSA referred her to *Go Senior Transportation* based in Birmingham. She was about to get a real surprise in how some transportation companies have evolved.

Her request was urgent. Go Senior responded immediately. Keep in mind, Southfield offers free rides via TOSS (*Transportation of Southfield Seniors*) and SMART bus, but sometimes, it does not work out due to the urgency of the request, rider capacity or trip distance. Portia stated she was so delighted with the first experience, she decided to use them again, several times. She enjoyed the driver's use of GPS, so the trip was quick, "from here to there". She felt safe. The vehicle was clean; and she was the only passenger. The driver stayed with her the entire time and returned her to her home so there was never a wait. Upon arriving at start and finish, he exited the vehicle and provided assistance from "door to door". She expressed how quiet and pleasant the ride was.

Another trip was to get her vaccination. Portia uses a walker. The driver took her inside, waited in line and helped the staff in processing her visit quickly. On another occasion, she went to the beauty shop and he waited until she was done to drive her home. Fortunately, the same driver was always available, even though she had not requested it. As she was describing her experience, it was obvious the driver presented compassionate care, consideration and kindness that you rarely see in today's world.

Further, Ms. Tremholm-Hamlar said that he was a good driver; always on time, helpful to assist in storing her walker, and the vehicle was clean and quiet. When asked about the cost, she indicated "there is a cost, but worth it"; and that was important. Overall, she was thrilled and very satisfied with the whole experience. By the way, Portia recently celebrated her 89th birthday. We applaud her desire to live independent and safe. Belated Happy Birthday, Portia!


