Eastern Daylight Savings Time, in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 26000 Evergreen Road, City of Southfield, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, at which time and place the Southfield City Council will conduct a Public Hearing to discuss the Five Year Consolidated Plan 2021/2026 and the proposed use of Community Development Block Grant funds (Annual Action Plan for Program Year 2022/2023).

Background: Each year the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocates each entitlement community grant funding for the development of programs and activities that will benefit low and moderate income people and/or areas. The CDBG planning committee, evaluates the proposals based on HUD criteria and city priorities

and provides recommendations to Council. Fiscal Impact: The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has not, as of 5/4/22, provided the City's funding levels for the 2022-23 program year. The entitlement grant is anticipated to be similar to last year's \$411.507. The CDBG regulations allow for up to 20% of the grant to be used for administrative (and fair housing) costs. The CDBG

regulations also allow for up to 15% of the grant to fund eligible public services. Last year the public service activities

included: Human Services/Emergency Relief Fund, Southfield Youth Assistance, HAVEN and South Oakland Shelter. The proposed statement of Community Development Objectives projected use of funds for the 2022/2023 CDBG Program Year is as follows:
