

# **TOSS** (Transportation of Southfield Seniors)

Are you familiar with our TOSS Pass? They are the new, easy, and convenient way to use our Transportation of Southfield Seniors service, no need to carry cash. You will need a TOSS pass each time you ride with us. Check out the next page for all the details.



Transportation of Southfield Seniors - TOSS is currently providing transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, pharmacies, some retail stores and banks between the hours of 8:30 am-3:30 pm, Monday - Friday. The dispatcher is available to take your reservation Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 8:30-11:30 am. If calling Thursday or Friday, please leave a message and the dispatcher will return your call on Monday. Appointments must be made with the dispatcher, at least 2 business days in advance.

Masks are required for all riders and drivers. The number of riders on each bus are limited, all touch points are being wiped after each rider and buses are being cleaned daily.

Bus service is provided to Southfield residents in the geographical area of 8 Mile to 14 Mile and Coolidge to Middlebelt. If you have any questions, or would like to schedule a reservation, please call the TOSS office at 248-796-4658 and leave a message with your name, phone number and someone will return your call as soon as possible.

If you need service outside of TOSS hours, or are not a Southfield resident, please call the SMART Connector at 866-962-5515.

This service is funded and operated by the joint efforts of the City of Southfield, SMART funds, Beaumont Health and Ascension SE Michigan Mission Fund.

Passes can be purchased by calling the Senior Services Office at (248) 796-4650.



### How the process works:

- Call Senior Services to purchase passes using your credit card; passes can also be purchased in person at the Senior Services office (cash or credit card, no checks) Mon.-Thur. from 9 am - 4 pm.
- Passes will be mailed to you as long as they are purchased no less than a week in advance of your scheduled ride.
- Passes purchased less than a week prior to your ride, will be handed to you by the TOSS driver on your next ride (tickets must be paid for through our office)
- · There are no refunds for passes; The passes do not expire
- · We are not responsible for lost tickets

# Commission on Senior Adults (COSA) MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT

#### **COSA needs your support!**

Who we are: The Commission on Senior Adults (COSA) is currently continuing the work of bringing the voice of the senior adults (ages 50+) to the leadership of the City of Southfield. We are working closely with, reaching out to, and have the commitment of all appropriate city departments, boards, commissions, and other communities toward our completion of the AARP Age-Friendly Community process. We have reached out to other communities and organizations to ensure the success of our process.



Where we are: COSA has received official endorsement and support from the Mayor and City Council on September 26, 2016. We have surveyed seniors in Southfield using the AARP designated survey. In late 2017, Southfield became a designated AARP Age-Friendly Community and in late 2019 the State of Michigan was designated an Age-Friendly state. To date, we have held three community conversations with seniors in order to gather input on issues affecting their quality of life. Our Action Plan is to complete the AARP Age-Friendly project and continue efforts and to advocate for seniors in the community. The process is divided into eight domain workgroups:

- Outdoor spaces and Buildings
- Transportation
- Housing
- Social Participation
- Respect and Social Inclusion
- Civic Participation and Employment
- Communication and Information
- Community Support and Health Services

#### What we need:

We need interested persons or organizations who have an interest in improving the lives of seniors to attend our monthly meetings and participate on a domain committee. Our meetings are held the third Thursday of each month, from 4 - 6 p.m. at the City of Southfield offices. As my service with COSA comes to an end, it is appropriate to look back on the things that have been accomplished in that time.

Jun 2016	Under the leadership of Karen Schrock, former COSA Chair, COSA pursued designation as an "Age Friendly Community".
Aug 2016	COSA requested that the City Council and Mayor endorse the effort.
Sep 2016	The Mayor and City Council passed a joint resolution endorsing the effort.
May 2017	COSA sponsored a community wide kickoff event where Karen Kafantaris, the <i>Michigan AARP Associate State Director</i> , spoke to those present and provided
	an overview of the designation process. Attendees submitted suggestions for consideration for each of the eight areas to be addressed during the planning phase.
	In addition, participants volunteered for the workgroups being established to review each of the eight areas.
Jun 2017 –	COSA organized its work around the eight "domain" areas identified by AARP
Mar 2020	with chairs for each area. Presentations were made to the appropriate City Boards and Commissions to inform them of the process and enlist their support.
May 2020	Even amidst the pandemic, COSA continued its work toward an Age Friendly
	Community in a virtual environment.
Jun 2022	COSA submitted the project results to AARP.
Jul 2022	COSA and the city of Southfield were recognized for successful completion of
	a cycle of improvement and for its age-friendly leadership, achievements, and
	continuing commitment toward being a livable community for people of all ages at
	the City Council meeting.

It has truly been a team effort between COSA, volunteers, city staff and council members and of course our mayor. My sincere personal thanks go out to you, the residents, for caring about our city. You have not only been diligent in investing in the city by living, working, and shopping in Southfield, but you have also generously given of your time through volunteering in our community. ### Michigan Prescription Discount Cards

Michigan Prescription Card is a free statewide prescription assistance program available to Michigan residents. There are no restrictions or eligibility requirements—anyone can use the card regardless of age, income or preexisting conditions.

# **The Chore Program**

The Chore Program is for all Southfield homeowners who are senior citizens, 62 or older, living alone, OR Certified handicapped living alone and whose annual income meets Federal guidelines: for a family of ONE the income must be \$27,500 or less and for a family of TWO the income must be \$31,400 or less.

Chore services include yard work (lawn care, shrub and tree trimming and leaf pick-up), snow removal, window and gutter cleaning, minor plumbing, minor furnace repair, minor electrical repair, minor painting and carpentry. Each qualified homeowner is allowed \$500 per year for the labor involved, while the client is responsible for material used. By helping with home and yard maintenance, the Chore Program enables homeowners to stay in their homes.


