### **AARP Tax Aide Returns**

Scheduling of appointments will start on January 17, 2023.

Appointments can be made by calling the Senior Services office at (248) 796-4650 after this date.

All participants must have an email address to utilize this service.

AARP will once again be assisting senior residents with their taxes this season. This program's goal is to offer complimentary tax preparation help to anyone regardless of age, but the emphasis is on those over 50 years of age who cannot afford to have professional tax assistance. Tax-Aide volunteers are trained and IRS certified each year.

All tax help is by appointment only and space will be limited. Appointments will be scheduled for weekdays from February 1 through April 7. Appointments take place in the Marcotte Room of the Parks & Recreation Building. Underground parking is available providing easy access to the Marcotte Room.



### **TOSS** (Transportation of Southfield Seniors)

Are you familiar with our TOSS Pass? They are the new, easy, and convenient way to use our Transportation of Southfield Seniors service, no need to carry cash. You will need a TOSS pass each time you ride with us.



Transportation of Southfield Seniors - TOSS is currently providing transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, pharmacies, some retail stores and banks between the hours of 8:30 am-3:30 pm, Monday - Friday. The dispatcher is available to take your reservation Monday, through Friday from 8:30 am -1:30 pm. Appointments must be confirmed with the dispatcher. No same day or next day rides available.

Masks are required for all riders and drivers. The number of riders on each bus are limited, all touch points are being wiped after each rider and buses are being cleaned daily.

Bus service is provided to Southfield residents in the geographical area of 8 Mile to 14 Mile and Coolidge to Middlebelt. If you have any questions, or would like to schedule a reservation, please call the TOSS office at 248-796-4658 and leave a message with your name, phone number and someone will return your call as soon as possible.

If you need service outside of TOSS hours, or are not a Southfield or Lathrup Village resident, please call the SMART Connector at 866-962-5515.



## We Want You! Southfield Commission on Senior Adults (COSA) Urges You to Make Your Voice Heard

As you are reading this we have made it partially through another cold, Michigan winter. We hope that you have enjoyed the festive time of the year whether you spent it celebrating with loved ones, sauntering around the City Centre viewing the decorations, volunteering, or attending one of the host of events that Southfield's Parks and Recreation Department has hosted.

Together with COSA, the City of Southfield completed the *Age Friendly City* process which had been underway for the past 5-years. This process culminated in the City of Southfield being recognized by American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) as an "Age Friendly Community" alongside four other Michigan communities; Jackson, Lansing, East Lansing, and Grand Rapids. This recognition follows the State of Michigan receiving designation from AARP as an Age Friendly State in late 2019. As Ms. Murphy moves on to serve the Southfield Community in her new capacity as a member of the Total Living Commission (TLC) COSA would like to recognize Kendell for her strong leadership and the instrumental role that she played in obtaining the Age Friendly designation. In her place, the COSA board elected Brenda Chambers-Threatt to serve as Chairperson. Mrs. Chambers-Threat previously served as COSA's Vice Chairperson. Denise Stewart was elected to the role of Vice Chairperson, and David Walker II was re-elected as Secretary. The new leadership team is eager to continue to be a good steward of Southfield's senior community.

While COSA celebrates the achievement of the Age Friendly designation, it does not signify the completion of our work and we will continue to support the needs of our Senior Community. With a new leadership team, a renewed vigor, and new challenges to tackle, COSA is ready to hit the ground running in the New Year. As we move forward, COSA welcomes all to join us as we maintain the privilege of bringing the voice of Senior Adults (ages 50+) to the leadership of the City of Southfield. COSA is always seeking interested persons or organizations to attend our monthly meetings and participate in our work. COSA prides itself on the diversity of its membership as everyone's unique perspective helps to improve the quality of the work that we can do for our Seniors. You don't even have to be a Senior to be a COSA member! #### Michigan Prescription Discount Cards

Michigan Prescription Card is a free statewide prescription assistance program available to Michigan residents. There are no restrictions or eligibility requirements—anyone can use the card regardless of age, income or preexisting conditions.

## **The Chore Program**

The Chore Program is for all Southfield homeowners who are senior citizens, 62 or older, living alone, OR Certified handicapped living alone and whose annual income meets Federal guidelines: for a family of ONE the income must be \$27,500 or less and for a family of TWO the income must be \$31,400 or less.

Chore services include yard work (lawn care, shrub and tree trimming and leaf pick-up), snow removal, window and gutter cleaning, minor plumbing, minor furnace repair, minor electrical repair, minor painting and carpentry. Each qualified homeowner is allowed \$500 per year for the labor involved, while the client is responsible for material used. By helping with home and yard maintenance, the Chore Program enables homeowners to stay in their homes.


