City of Southfield offers new online water bill payment option for residents and businesses

Service is safe, convenient and easy-to-use

The City of Southfield has launched a convenient and cost-effective new service to allow online water bill payments through a secure Web site at https://water.cityofsouthfield.com.

Southfield's new online water bill payment service is the result of a collaborative effort between the City's Water, Treasurer's and Technology Services Department to provide residents and businesses with a safe and secure method of paying water bills online. The site is Payment Card Industry (PCI) compliant and meets all legal requirements for online credit card payments in order to mitigate the potential for credit card fraud. The site was first developed nearly two years ago – providing Southfield residents and businesses with instant access to

their accounts allowing them to check account balances, view transaction history, and examine usage information with ease. Registered users will now also have the ability to pay water bills online with payments posted to their accounts immediately.

To participate, simply logon to https://water.cityofsouthfield.com and click on the 'Utilities' button on the top left-hand side of the page. From here click on the 'New Users' button to create a new account and register for specific services. All users must read the City's Privacy and Refund Policy prior to using the service.

Residents and businesses are also encouraged to sign up for the City's Automatic Bill Payment Plan to have water bill payments automatically deducted from any participating bank, savings and loan, or credit union account. The service is free, convenient and available to any city of Southfield water customer. To sign up, complete the enrollment form on the City's Web site at www.cityofsouthfield.com or https://water.cityofsouthfield.com and return the form and a voided check to the Water and Sewer Department, 26000 Evergreen Road, P.O. Box 2055, Southfield, MI 48037-2055.

City of Southfield accepts \$2 million SAFER grant

Funds will be used to hire four new firefighters and to maintain existing firefighters

The Southfield City Council voted unanimously at the July 16 City Council Meeting to approve the acceptance of a \$2,022,298 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to hire four trained reservists and to maintain existing fire department staff.

"This agreement represents an excellent example of intergovernmental cooperation," commented Southfield City Council President Joan Seymour. "This grant will not only allow us to hire four highly trained and qualified reservists, but also to maintain all of the City's existing firefighters."

The Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants (SAFER) was created to provide funding directly to fire departments in order to help them increase the number of trained. "frontline" firefighters available in their communities. The grant is payable over a two-year period. The goal of SAFER is to enhance the local fire departments' abilities to comply with staffing, response and operational standards established by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and the Occupational Safety and



Health Administration (OSHA).

"This is a mutually beneficial agreement that will increase fire department staff and strengthen the City's ability to continue to provide 'Top Quality City Services," stated Acting Fire Chief Keith Rowley. "This agreement enables the Southfield Fire Department to continue to provide the highest quality fire prevention, emergency medical care and fire protection possible."

Senators Carl Levin and Debbie Stabenow, Congressman Sander Levin and Southfield Fire Department staff were instrumental in securing the SAFER grant for Southfield. The funds will cover the total cost of the firefighters (salaries, benefits, equipment and continued training) for two years with no cost share to the City. The City does not have to retain the SAFER-funded firefighters after the grant expires; however, the grant stipulates that no layoffs may occur during the grant performance period.


Southfield's 2012 City Calendar selected as finalist in 3CMA Savvy Awards Competition

Tax bills can be paid by mail, in person (at City Hall), at First Place Bank locations (no longer Comerica Bank), or online at www.paylocaltaxes.com. Please remember that August 31 is the last day to pay 2012 summer taxes and special assessments without penalty and December 1 is the first day to pay 2012 winter taxes.

Tax deferments are available for people ages 62 and older, veterans, and disabled individuals residing in households with income less than \$40,000. The deadline to file for 2012 summer tax deferments is September 15.

Basement Flooding Legal Notice

Any resident experiencing an overflow or sewage back up should contact the Water Department at (248) 796-4850. After hours, the message will advise you to call (248) 796-4899 or you can call the Police desk at (248) 796-5500 to be put in touch with the supervisor on call.

Under Public Act 222, any resident having experienced an overflow or back up of a sewage disposal system or storm water system, must file a written claim with the City within 45 days after the overflow or backup was discovered or in the exercise of reasonable diligence, should have been discovered. Notice should be mailed to the Office of Management and Budget at the City of Southfield. Failure to provide the required notice to the City will limit your rights under the law. For more information, contact the Office of Management and Budget at (248) 796-5260. The source of the back up must be the City sewer. Problems caused by the property's plumbing are the homeowner's responsibility.

Southfield residents will be going to the polls for the Presidential General Election on Tuesday, November 6, 2012:

Did you know that Michigan IS NOT an early voting state? At the last Presidential Election, many people stood in line for hours at the Clerk's Office to obtain an Absent Voter Ballot. Did you know that you can request an Absent Voter Ballot by mail and avoid waiting in line? Also, the majority of voters came out to the polls first thing in the morning and again stood in long lines. Remember: the polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. In the afternoon, you can just walk right in and vote – no waiting in line.

If you need an Absent Voter Ballot for the November Election, please call the Clerk's Office or download an Application for Absent Voter Ballot available on our Web site. Avoid standing in long lines to vote in 2012!

Close of Registration and **Voting Precinct**

The Close of Registration deadline for the Presidential General Election is October 9. Are you registered to vote? Do you know your voting precinct and polling location? In an effort to provide better service for our residents, and to help cut down the number of phone calls and/or waiting in line on Election Day, you can verify your voter information by contacting the City Clerk's Office or viewing our Web site at www. cityofsouthfield.com. Click-on the Government Tab at the top, select City Clerk's Office, Election Information. A direct link to the Michigan Voter Information Center can be accessed on the City Clerk's home page, "Are you registered to vote?" or by using the related link.

A newly released Geographic Information System (GIS) application entitled Election Polling Places, is also available on the City Clerk's Web page. The Election Polling Places application allows residents to locate their polling place and obtain information about current elected officials. Simply click on the map or enter an address in the search box. The application also provides

directions from the searched address to the polling place location. To view the Election Polling Place map, visit our Web site, www.cityofsouthfield. com, click on the Government tab, City Clerk's Office, Election Information, and the link to the Polling Place Maps is included in the "Are You Registered to Vote" information.

Michigan Election Law states that you must be registered to vote 30 days prior to an election. If you are a Southfield resident and not currently registered to vote, please visit the City Clerk's Office or any Secretary of State branch office. You can also download a voter registration form on the City Web site at www.cityofsouthfield.com. If you are physically unable to appear in person, please call City Clerk Nancy Banks at (248) 796-5150, to make arrangements.

Absent Voter Information

Michigan law requires that registered voters wishing to receive an absent voter ballot must complete an Application for each election for which an absentee ballot is needed. Voters whose names are on the Permanent Absent Voter List, who have requested same, were mailed an Absent Voter Application in June 2012. The Application must be returned to the City Clerk's Office, completed and signed, before an absentee ballot can be mailed to the voter.

If you need an absentee ballot for the November 6 General Election, contact the City Clerk's Office at (248) 796-5150, or visit the City's Web site to download the Application form. (You must print your full name and address on the Application form.)



The City Clerk's Office will be open from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. on Saturday November 3 to accept and process absentee ballot applications. The last day for qualified electors to obtain an Absent Voter Ballot for the Presidential General Election is Monday, November 5 until 4 p.m.

Absentee ballots issued on November 5 must be voted on-site and cannot leave the building. All Absent Voter Ballots must be returned to the City Clerk's Office by 8 p.m. on Election Night in order to be counted.

Permanent Absent **Voter Information**

Did you Know? The City Clerk's Office maintains a "Permanent" Absent Voter List. Qualified electors who are eligible to receive an Absent Voter Ballot can register for the Permanent Absent Voter List by completing the form below. Prior to each election, residents whose names are on the Permanent Absent Voter List will automatically receive an Application for Absent Voter Ballot. If you choose to register for the Permanent Absent Voter List, you can still vote in person at the polls for any given election by simply not returning the Application for Absent Voter Ballot for processing.

Military and Overseas Voters

New state and federal laws make it easier for military and overseas civilian voters to register and participate in elections. Under the new laws, military and overseas civilian voters can now receive a ballot by email or fax to speed the voting process. The voted ballot must be returned by mail for security purposes. If you or someone you know is a member of the military or a U.S. citizen overseas, contact the City Clerk's Office or visit the Web site for the new procedures that permit eligible voters to receive a ballot.

Election Workers Wanted

The City Clerk's Office is accepting applications for Election Inspectors to work in the November General Election. Individuals with proficient computer skills are needed to utilize the new Electronic Poll Book. Michigan Election Law requires all voting precincts to have Inspectors representing opposite political parties, therefore, applicants representing any of the recognized political parties are encouraged to apply. Visit the City Clerk's Office or download the Election Inspector Application from the City's Web site. Encourage your high school and college students to become an election inspector.

Business Licenses and Permits

The City Clerk's office is responsible for issuing various types of licenses. Garage sale permits, taxicab licenses, vendor licenses, and certain business licenses to include but not limited to landscaping and snow removal, auto dealerships, vending machines, movie theaters etc. Those businesses required to be licensed to operate in the City of Southfield are required to have a current business license for each location. If you are opening a new business, buying an existing business, or transferring a business to your ownership, you must apply for a new business license.

An applicant must complete the application detailing business activity, location and ownership. Applicants

must present a valid driver's license, state identification card or other official photo ID, and a Federal Tax Employment Identification Number. Document requirements vary by license type. Some business licenses require inspection and approval from various city departments prior to obtaining a license. Common inspections are: building, fire prevention and background checks.

For businesses already licensed, the City of Southfield mails annual renewal notices to all business owners of record as a courtesy. All Southfield businesses are responsible for the timely filing of annual business license renewal application and payment, which must be received or postmarked by January 1. Businesses that fail to meet this deadline

will incur penalties and interest. If you close your business, you are required to file a Closing Business Statement. If you sell your business, the new owner must apply for a new business license, and may be required to revise or file new permits. Business licenses are not transferable to new business owners.

If you require assistance or have not received a business license renewal form in the mail, please contact the City Clerk's Office at (248) 796-5150.Please refer to the Southfield City Code for information regarding the city's business license requirements, regulations and types of business licenses.

Oakland County Clerk's office is responsible for marriage licenses,

assumed names and corporate partnership filings; and notary public applications.

With the winter season around the corner, make sure that any company you contract with to remove snow from your driveway has a City License.
