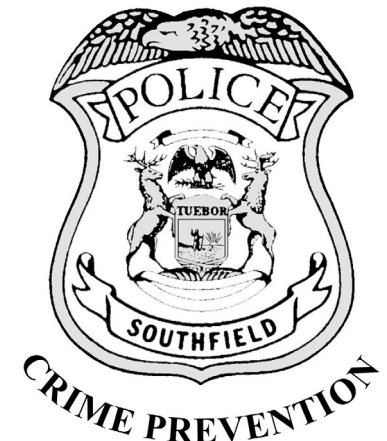
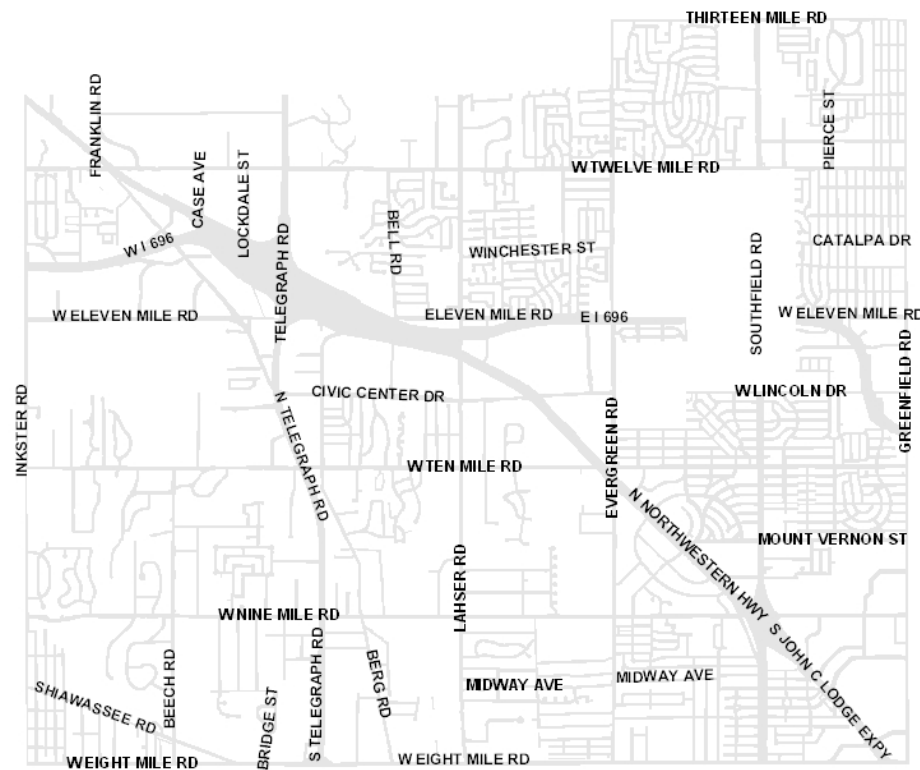

On 04/21/2023 at 5:53am, Officers responded to Southfield and Edwards Ave for a personal injury accident. Dispatch advised that a pickup truck and small sedan collided head-on. No one was seen exiting the vehicles and it was unknown on injuries. Officers arrived on scene and contacted the two drivers. It was determined that the female that was driving the sedan was driving w/o her headlights on and struck the pickup truck head on while it was stopped in the left turn lane waiting to make a left turn. The driver of the sedan was in Life Unit for medical evaluation. Officer began to look around inside the sedan vehicle and observed a black handgun in plain view. Officer unloaded and secured the gun. Dispatch ran the vehicle via LEIN and it came back clear, unregistered. Dispatch advised that driver did not have a valid CPL. The driver of this vehicle was identified and handcuffed by Officer to the stretcher & advised she was being arrested for CCW and was being investigated for Operating her vehicle while under the influence. The driver got upset she was arrested and used her right hand and struck/clawed at officers left jaw. Officers secured both drivers' hands down. While securing her hands the driver kicked a Southfield Firefighter in the chest area. Other Southfield Fire Fighters were all present during the assaults and resisting and obstructing. During Officers contact with the driver, she had slurred speech, watery eyes, bloodshot eyes, inconsistent responses, inability to follow directions, abusive language, unusual statements, and responses, and lacked mental clarity. The driver made statements about taking prescription Xanax.

A search warrant was obtained to take blood from suspect.

Suspect had to be sedated due to her behavior. After the blood draw it

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage, you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but do not leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you do not have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

On 04/21/2023, Officers were on patrol near Telegraph Rd. and W Nine Mile Rd. Officers observed a Ford Fusion with tinted windows parked in the 23000 Block of Telegraph Rd. (Hotel) The vehicle's registered owner returned with multiple warrants. Officers conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and contacted the driver, identified as the vehicle owner. He was advised on the reason for the traffic stop and was asked if anything illegal was in the vehicle, including narcotics and he responded no. He was taken into custody for the warrants. He was searched and gave consent to search his vehicle. Officers searched the vehicle and located a corner tie baggie containing a white powdery substance underneath the driver seat and believed to be suspected cocaine. The driver was now charged with Possession of Cocaine. He was taken to Southfield jail, processed, and lodged.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of suspected substance. It tested positive for possible presence of cocaine. The case was presented to OCPO. Complaint & Warrant for Possession of Cocaine was secured.

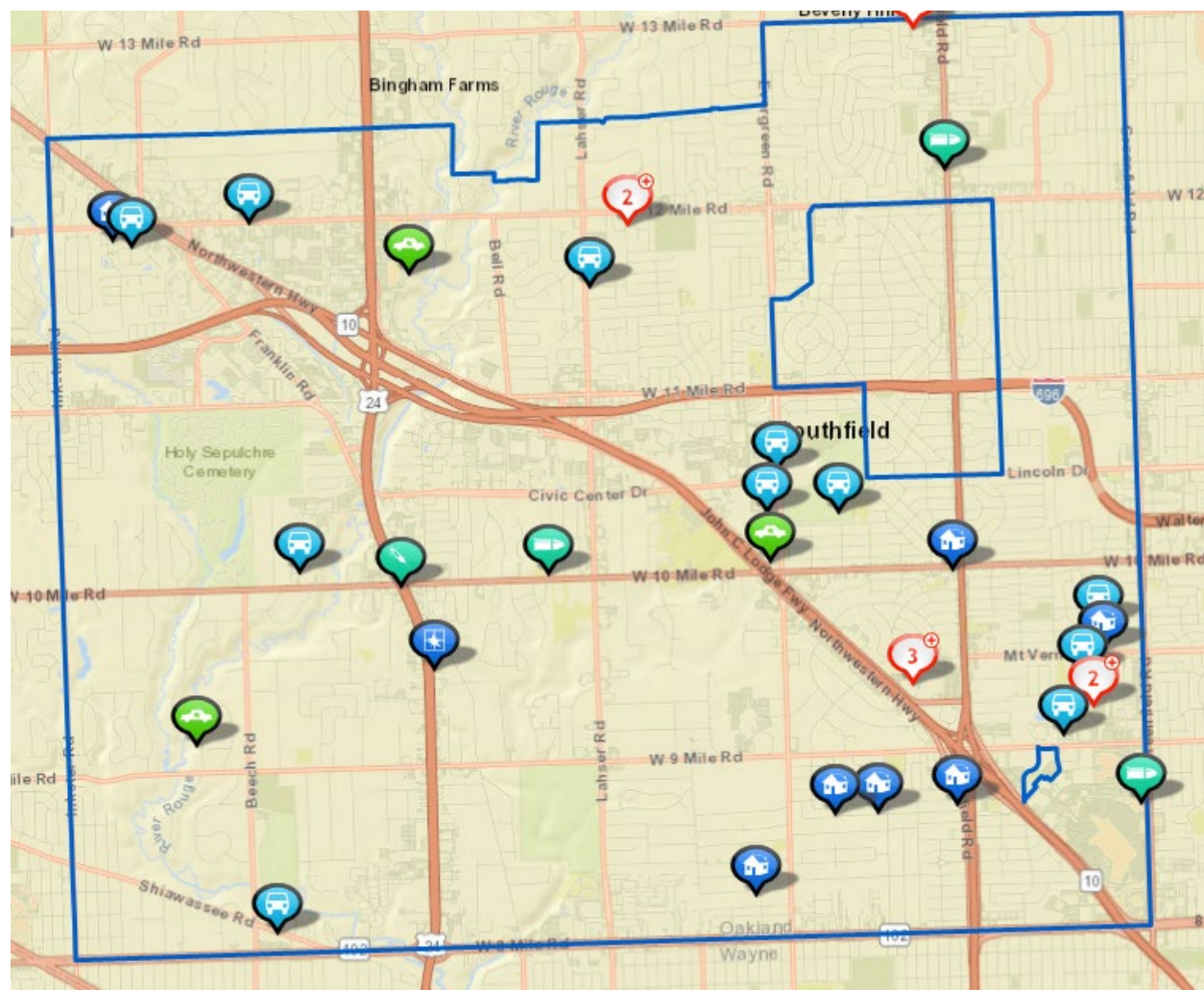

28000 Block of San Carlos St.







On 04/23/2023 at 10:36pm, several Southfield Officers responded to the area of the 28000 Block of San Carlos St reference shots fired during an LFA. Officer contacted the victim from residence in the 28000 block of San Carlos. Victim states he observed an individual inside his 2022 Jeep Wrangler after hearing his car horn being activated. When he saw the suspect in the driver seat, he ran back upstairs to get his firearm, he then fired two rounds into the air attempting to scare the suspect away. The suspect began running across the street and victim fired two more rounds into the air.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected victim's handgun and four 9mm shell casings from the scene and had victim go through his car to see if anything was stolen. Victim verified that a diamond ring was taken from his vehicle. Several additional officers arrived in the area and were searching for the suspects. Officers on scene canvassed the area and got a description of the suspects involved in breaking into multiple vehicles. Officer located two males matching the description of suspects at nearby Senior Living Complex. Both males began running into the courtyard of the complex. One Southfield Officer pursued on foot and yelled out they will be tased if they were to not stop running. After no compliance from the suspects, Officer discharged his taser with no effect and the suspects continued to flee. Officers continued to pursue on foot and observed one of the suspects dives into the bushes and his feet were still sticking out onto grass. Officers observed the other suspect, in a black hoodie with white lettering down the sleeve, laying in the same set of bushes. Both suspects were advised to show their hands and lay on the ground. They both complied. Both suspects were taken into custody.

Further investigation revealed that the suspects were responsible for several attempt LFA's and LFA's in the area. A K-9 Unit conducted an article track and located a handgun near a dumpster where the suspects had concealed themselves. The handgun was collected by a Southfield Police Evidence Technician. The serial# had been removed from the handgun. Both suspects are Juveniles and were later transported to Children's Village. Investigation is on-going.
