


Victim states he had just left a jewelry store after getting some jewelry cleaned and making a payment on a chain, he bought a few weeks ago. Just before he got out to the parking lot, he was struck with a pistol in the back of his head. Victim did not know where the male came from that struck him. When he turned around, he saw a black male in a ski mask armed with a handgun. The suspect demanded victim to give him his stuff. Victim took his chain off and gave it to the suspect. Victim states there was a dark grey Kia sedan with tinted windows parked in front of the entrance facing southbound. Another black male in a ski mask got out of the back seat on the driver side. He walked around the back of the vehicle and approached victim. This male was also armed with a handgun. This male asked him what else he had. Victim told him he did not have anything else but his phones. He reached out and gave his two cell phones to the suspects, who then got back into their car. Victim said there was a third male in the driver seat that never got

	out. The windows were tinted, and victim could only make out that the driver was a black male and had something in his hand. Suspect/ Suspect Vehicle Description: The suspect vehicle was described as a dark/ Charcoal Grey Kia Sedan, possibly an Optima. The vehicle had dark tinted windows and was described as an older model Kia, possibly around 2010- year model. The vehicle had a license plate attached in the rear, but the plate number was unknown. There was a black male with an unknown description in the driver seat. The rear passenger behind the driver was a black male, possibly mid 20's, wearing a ski mask and armed with a handgun. The suspect who struck the victim and left in the front passenger seat was described as a tall (around 6'1") black male, thin, possibly late 20's or early 30's, wearing a ski mask and armed with a handgun.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

- -Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage, you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- -After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- -If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- -If you are here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early

morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately calls 911, (Do Not

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages. Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package. Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Officers responded to the area of 9 Mile and Southfield Service Drive to assist another Officer with the arrest of a suspect from a prior incident. The previous incident was a Domestic violence call where the suspect had fled the area on foot and was not located. During the search for the suspect the suspects cousin, was in the parking lot, sitting in his vehicle. The subject stated his cousin had called him to come pick him up. The cousin was in possession of a handgun and had a valid MI-CPL. The gun was in the car, in the cupholder. The subject indicated he was not aware that his cousin was in a domestic altercation and stated he wanted to leave. He was advised to leave. A short time later Officer observed the suspect from earlier Domestic Assault get in the same vehicle that his cousin was in. Officer stopped the vehicle. Officers took the suspect from earlier Domestic Assault into custody. The cousin was asked why he came back if he wanted to leave, and he knew the Police were looking for his cousin and why he would pick him up to drive him away. The cousin stated he saw his cousin walking down the road and decided to pick him up anyway. The subject was asked if his handgun was still in the car. He stated it was. He was asked if he had any other weapons. He responded he had a shotgun and a rifle in the car.

Further investigation by Officers they located an AR-15 Rifle with an illegal configuration with a rifle stock on it. Officers explained to subject that it was an illegal short barrel rifle in its current configuration. This firearm was confiscated, and the subject was RPI'd for this offense and possible charges for aiding and abetting suspects

Officer T. McCormick and Barlow were dispatched to 18000 Block of Jeanette for a reported family trouble. Officers arrived on scene and met with the R/P (mother of combatants). R/P advises she woke up the morning to a physical fight between her son and daughter. The son had the daughter into a choke hold when she had to intervene. The son stated he is withdrawing from marijuana and while he was watching TV his withdrawing started to hit and he became aggravated. When he becomes aggravated, he wants to throw items around. While he was explaining the events of what happened his sister came into his room, he overheard his sister tell Officer T. McCormick that he put her in a "choke hold". Once he heard this he motioned with his right hand towards his sister and said something. When he motioned with his right hand, Officer T. McCormick observed a small unknown object in his hand. Officer McCormick patted subject down for weapons and asked him if he had any weapons on him. He instantly dropped a pair of black brass knuckles onto the ground. The brass knuckles were confiscated, and the subject was taken into custody for Possession of Brass Knuckles and DV Strangulation.
