



03/02/2023 11:26pm 1-Arrest	28000 Franklin Rd. (Abandoned Building)	Door was breached on the north side of building.	On 03/03/2023, Southfield Officers were dispatched to the 28000 Block of Franklin Rd. (Abandoned Building) on a report of four people breaking into the building and breaking windows. Upon arrival, officers conducted an area check and observed an unsecured door on the north side of the building. Officers attempted to secure the door with negative results. Officers observed multiple windows broken on the building and furniture that appeared to be thrown from the building into the parking lot. Officers conducted stationary surveillance of the building. Officers observed several subjects running from the east side of the building. Two subjects were observed running towards a nearby hotel. Officer observed one of the subjects wearing all black trip and fall to the ground. Officer contacted this subject and questioned him about being in the building. When Officer asked the subject if he had any weapons on his persons the subject. Miranda was given and the suspect made admissions to being in the building and braking out windows. He was taken into custody for CCW & B&E. He did not have a CPL.

On February 27, 2023, around 6:20pm R/P called 911 to advise that she witnessed suspect breaking into her home, while viewing her surveillance camera. Officers responded to the victim's residence in the 16000 Block of Oxley Rd. (Apartment Complex) at 6:32pm. The responding officers indicated that there appeared to be forced entry into the residence but there was no suspect(s) located. Victim states that she recognized the suspect, and she has a PPO served against the suspect. She gave officers the name of the suspect and officers found no record of the PPO in the system. R/P was advised to get the PPO again and have it served properly. There was evidence of forced entry into victim's apartment and the suspect contacted victim and told her that she needed to get her door fixed. Investigation is on-going

			the door. Female suspect was yelling at the caller to

			people inside the apartment. R/P reported he thinks
			he knew who the female suspect was but would not
			give any further information and disconnected.
			Second caller (girlfriend of original caller) reconnected
			and believed she heard a gunshot in the hallway.
			Officers arrived on scene and the suspect was not
			located. Officers spoke with the original caller. He
			explained to Officers that the intruder was his ex-
			girlfriend. She kicked at his door until it was forced
			open. The ex-girlfriend was able to kick in the door
			after multiple attempts. R/P attempted to place his
			body weight and forearm to prevent the door from
			opening. The suspect was able to force open the door.
			The door caused R/P to stumble back into the kitchen.
			A neighbor started yelling and that was when the
			suspect fled on foot. Suspect drives a Silver 2013 Kia
			Rio Officers located the vehicle in the apartment
			complex. Further investigation at the victim's
			apartment Officers recovered a loaded magazine on
			the couch and one spent round was in the ceiling just
			inside the apartment. R/P was not totally being
			cooperative and stated he did not see a gun or hear a
			gunshot? R/P's new girlfriend stated she was hiding in
			the bathroom during the incident and heard lots of
			yelling and one gunshot.

			She also advised she had been receiving a lot of harassing phone calls from the female suspect. Officers observed the suspects' vehicle to be nosed in and occupied by two subjects. The suspect was in the driver's seat of her vehicle. The suspect was wearing a purse. Officers requested permission to search her purse, which she stated "yes". A search of the purse located a handgun with the magazine missing. Officer attempted to clear the handgun, observing a spent casing that was stuck in the chamber. The handgun and casing both smelled like it had been recently fired. The suspect was taken into custody for Home Invasion, Discharging a Firearm in Occupied Dwelling and Felony Firearm. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and collected evidence.

Dispatch advised R/P, received a notification 20 minutes ago that showed a male in a black hoodie and jeans run out of her residence with a black bag. Officers arrived on scene and observed an open front door. Officers entered the residence and found it to be ransacked. No suspects were located. Victim and her boyfriend arrived on scene while officers were there. Victim advised that several items are missing. Victim showed officers video of incident. On 03/05/2023 at 10:15pm, a B/M wearing a lighter colored hoodie, jeans, and reflective shoes walks in front of her address, leans in (appeared to be looking at the address number), then moves quickly through a bush towards a downstairs window. At 10:21pm, the same male is then seen walking out of the front door of the residence, with a black trash bag that was full, and walked swiftly W/B towards Saint James. Investigation is on-going.

Arrests by SPD Officers:
A&B/ CCW/ Possession of a Firearm in The Commission of a
Felony/ Resisting Police Officer- 1- Arrest
02/28/2023 4:48am
27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy
(Hotel)
On 02/28/2023 Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) regarding a possible domestic situation. Dispatch advised a couple was heard fighting and things were being thrown around. Upon arrival officers located female victim sitting in the lobby crying and with obvious injuries. Investigation revealed that the male suspect (victims' boyfriend) was pimping out the female for prostitution and when he discovered that she did not want to do it anymore and she had no money he assaulted her numerous times causing injury that required hospitalization. Officers located the suspect in the back seat of a vehicle in the parking lot and asked him to exit the vehicle. The suspect exited the vehicle and began to take off running, fleeing from the Officers. Officers gave chase on foot, and the suspect left his backpack where he first exited the vehicle and officers searched it. Officers located an extended .45 cal. magazine loaded with several live rounds in it. Officers interviewed the driver of the vehicle. The driver stated he was a Lyft driver and had picked up suspect from a gas station at Telegraph and 12 Mile. The suspect had asked him to drive him to his vehicle that was parked in
the parking lot at the hotel. (Suspect had earlier fled from hotel on foot) Officers located a handgun that was missing the magazine under the passenger seat of the Lyft vehicle where the suspect was earlier seated. The Lyft Driver did not know suspect and provided a written

statement as to the gun recovered was not his. The suspect was taken

into custody for CCW/ Domestic Assault/ Felon in Possession of a Firearm in the commission of a Felony/ & Resisting Police. **Note:** Two Southfield Officers sustained substantial injuries requiring treatment and damages to their equipment during the pursuit of suspect and his apprehension. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician took photos of Officers injuries and damage to their equipment. The case was presented to OCPO for their review. On March 1, 2023, the suspect was arraigned on 5 Charges: DV, Assault on PO x2, CCW, Felon in Possession.

A&B/ Disorderly Person 1- Arrest 03/04/2023 6:51am 15000 Block of Town Ctr. (Hotel)

On March 04, 2023, Officers were dispatched to an A&B investigation at hotel in the 15000 Block of Town Ctr. Per dispatch a B/M wearing a red jacket with braids had assaulted a male at the location. Officers arrived on scene and met with the victim. The victim stated he was in his room and the suspect was out in the hallway making all kinds of noise. When victim opened his door to see what was going on the unknown suspect got up into his face and assaulted him. Witness confirmed the Incident & Assault.

Officers located the suspect who was intoxicated and disorderly in the lobby. When Officers confronted the suspect, he began to scream and threaten Officers and hotel staff in the front lobby.

Numerous patrons (10-15) were in the lobby witnessing suspect's disorderly conduct. It was determined that this suspect was the primary aggressor, and he was taken into custody for A&B and Disorderly Person.

Disorderly Conduct-1- Arrest 03/02/2023 12:03am 29000 Block of Northwestern Hwy (Commercial Bar/ Saloon) On 03/02/2023, Officers were dispatched to the 29000 Block of Northwestern, Bar/Saloon reference an intoxicated customer who wanted to drive home. The customer was currently outside the business. Officer arrived on scene and observed the subject in front of the business standing to the side of the entrance. He was showing signs of intoxication stumbling and leaning against the building. Officer approached the subject and immediately could smell alcohol emanating from him. Officers attempted to identify the subject and advised him that they were concerned about him getting home safely. The subject had a cut on his forehead from falling after exiting the bar prior to officers' arrival. The subject refused to identify himself and refused any medical treatment. R/P, employee from the bar advised that the subject was intoxicated inside the bar and fell several times. Several customers attempted to help the subject, but he refused help and started to yell at them. This is when the subject left the bar. After numerous attempts by Officers to help the subject, he was taken into custody for Disorderly Person. He refused a PBT and was taken to the hospital for evaluation & treatment. He was later cleared, released, and was processed and lodged at the Southfield Jail.
