


#### **27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel)**

On 2/4/2023 at approx. 2:00am several Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) for a CSC Investigation. Officers arrived on scene and spoke to the female victim.

Victim was distraught and uncooperative at first. She had a swollen bloody bottom lip, swollen forehead, a bald spot on the right side of her head and both of her arms were heavily bruised. The room had significant damage including multiple broken mirrors, broken television, and damaged furniture. Officers observed clumps of hair throughout the room. Victim stated that her boyfriend assaulted her, damaged their hotel room, and forcefully sexually assaulted her.

Victim stated her boyfriend, left prior to officer's arrival.

Suspect vehicle information was given over the radio and Officers conducted an area check for the vehicle.

On 02/04/2023, Officer observed a black female and a black male (purple coat and dreads) enter a Blue Ford Focus on the south side of hotel where incident took place. Officer confirmed that the vehicle was the suspect's vehicle. Officer confirmed that the suspect was in the passenger seat of the vehicle. Additional Officers responded and the vehicle was stopped on Northwestern Service Drive and Phillip St.

The suspect resisted arrest and refused to exit the vehicle.

Officers used the necessary force to effect the arrest.

The female driver of the vehicle was released on scene.

The suspect was taken into custody for 1. CSC III, 2. R&O on PO, 3. MDOP less than \$1,000, 4. Domestic Violence.

On 02/04/2023, Officers received information regarding a vehicle that had fled from them a day earlier. The suspect vehicle had just fled from Redford Police Officers and may be headed towards Southfield. Officer was patrolling along the border between Southfield and Redford when he located the Dodge Charger (suspect vehicle) traveling W/B on 8 Mile Rd at Telegraph Rd. Officer advised dispatch of his location, the license plate, and informed them this was the same vehicle Redford pursued today and Southfield Officers had pursued yesterday. The Charger was traveling in the left lane of Westbound 8 Mile Rd and was traveling within the posted 45 mph speed limit. The suspect vehicle got into the turn-around to go east on 8 Mile Rd. As additional vehicles were coming into the area the suspect vehicle disobeyed the red traffic signal and began fleeing s/b into Redford. Officer activated his lights and siren and the vehicle fled to the first cross street where it turned E/B. Another Southfield Unit was traveling W/B on cross street driving towards the Charger. The Charger abruptly swerved to the right to avoid Officers vehicle. As it did so, the Charger struck a wooden pole lost control and then struck a tree causing it to be disabled. After crashing, the driver fled the vehicle on foot, running E/B. The driver was a black male wearing all black clothing. The driver jumped over two chain link fences running S/B through the residential yards. Officers continued to pursue the suspect until he ran into backyard where he unable to jump over the tall, wooden plank fence. The driver ran behind the detached garage and became trapped. Officers instructed the driver to show his hands and he complied. The driver was arrested without incident. Officers later, conducted a search of the Charger (stolen vehicle) and located a firearm on the

## **Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles**

### **How to prevent this from happening to you!**

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage, you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but do not leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you do not have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

passenger's side floorboard. The driver was asked if he had a valid CPL and the driver said no. Dispatch confirmed no CPL.

Redford PD arrived on scene and Officers provided information regarding their earlier pursuit with the same vehicle.

The recovered stolen vehicle was impounded and a LEIN message was sent to reporting agency that the vehicle has been recovered.

## **OWID/ Possession of Heroin 1- Arrest**

### **Evergreen Rd. & Northwestern Hwy.**

On February 5, 2023, Officers were dispatched to s/b Northwestern Highway Service Dr. and Evergreen Rd. for a slumped driver. Officers arrived on scene and observed vehicle stopped in the center lane not moving. The light was green and other vehicles had to drive around the stopped vehicle. Officers observed driver slumped behind the wheel, the vehicle was running, in gear with the driver's foot on the brake. Officers were able to awaken the driver and had him put the vehicle in park and turn the vehicle off. The drivers' eyes were bloodshot, he was sweating profusely, and he thought he was in Troy. During questioning of the driver, he advised that he was a heroin user. When the driver exited the vehicle Officers noticed a plastic baggie with a white powdery substance, consistent with narcotics. While completing an inventory search of the vehicle, a Southfield Police Evidence Technician recovered the suspected substance. It was later Field Tested and came back positive for possible presence of Heroin. The driver was transported to the hospital by FD for medical treatment. Officers

suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals do not like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it is difficult to see them.

#### **Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.**

#### **How to prevent this from happening to you!**

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.



He was unresponsive to officers at first but appeared to be breathing and not injured. Officer then observed the rear of a black firearm sticking out of the drivers' jeans near his right hand. Officers got the driver out of the vehicle and secured the firearm for the duration of the investigation for safety. The driver stated he thought his vehicle was in park, and he was just taking a nap. He did not understand why Officers were concerned that he had crashed his vehicle into a snowbank, and he was slumped behind the wheel of the vehicle. Further investigation by officers revealed that the handgun recovered from subject registered to his mother and he did not have a CPL to carry the handgun. He was taken into custody for CCW.
