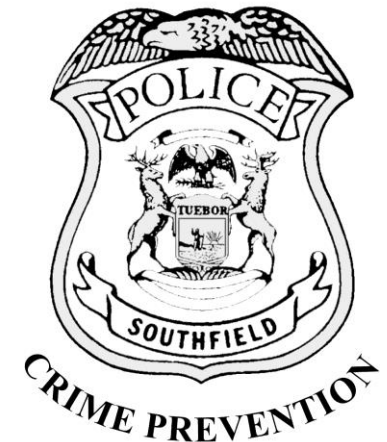

Officer was on routine patrol when he discovered the front door glass had been shattered at business in the 25000 Block of W. Eight Mile Rd. Entry had not been made into the business. Attempt only. No suspects were located. <b>Note:</b> The same business in another jurisdiction had also been attacked.
01/18/2022 4:07am  <b>(Arrest was made. Suspect is responsible for several other recent incidents)</b>	18000 W Nine Mile Rd. (Gas Station)	Suspect threw bricks at the front door glass. Entry was not made into the business.	On 01/18/2022 Officers were dispatched to Gas Station in the 18000 Block of W. Nine Mile Rd. regarding an alarm with the indicator of front door glass breakage. Upon arrival, Officers observed that the glass on the front door was broken. It did not appear that entry was made into the business. Surveillance video shows at 4:07am a Cadillac/no plate/gold in color, drives up to the front door of the gas station. The suspect exits the driver seat of the vehicle and walks up to the door and looks in. At 4:09am suspect throws a brick at the front door two times, cracking the glass. Suspect then walks back to the vehicle, re-enters it, and drives away leaving E/B Nine Mile Rd. (No entry was made) <b>Note:</b> At 4:21am Southfield Officers were dispatched to business in the (21000 Block of W Nine Mile Rd) on a

			<p>report of an alarm. Upon arrival, Officers observed a broken red brick, in front of the door.</p> <p>At 4:28am Southfield Officers were also dispatched to business in the (25000 Block of W Eight Mile Rd) on a report of an alarm. Upon arrival, Officers observed damage to the front glass door.</p> <p>At 4:50am Officer observed a Gold Cadillac with no plate matching description of suspect vehicle from Attempt B&amp;E at business in 18000 Block of W. Nine Mile Rd. with its lights off. Officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. The suspect vehicle and the suspect driving the vehicle matched the description from surveillance video at previous business.</p> <p>He was taken into custody for The Attempt B&amp;E at that location. Officers located the license plate for the suspect's vehicle on the front passenger seat.</p> <p>It returned to a 2009 Cadillac DTS abandoned out of the City of Southfield registering to suspect.</p> <p>It's believed the suspect is responsible for several other B&amp;E's and Attempt B&amp;E's in Southfield.</p> <p>Investigation into those incidents is on-going.</p>

(Commercial- Medical)</p>	<p>Most likely a key was used by former employee.</p>	<p>Manager for business showed up to work and discovered door to business was unlocked and the business had been ransacked. A former employee was sent an email requesting that she return her keys and other items. The former employee sent an email that she had come to the business to return her keys and pick up some of her belongings. The former employee was no longer employed at the business and didn't have permission to enter the office. It's believed she used her keys to enter the business. Nothing was taken. Investigation is on-going.</p>

(Commercial- Storage Units)</p>	<p>Status S - Stolen Description Numerous tools were taken.</p>	<p>Victim states he went to his storage unit on 10/10/2021. He immediately noticed his step ladder was leaned up against his storage unit in the hallway. The victim thought it was strange that his property was in the hallway when it was initially left in his storage unit. He then noticed that his storage unit had a lock on it that didn't belong to him and he couldn't unlock it. R/P contacted the on-duty staff at the premises, they removed the lock and stated they did not know why his lock had been changed or why his step ladder was in the hallway. Numerous tools are missing from the unit. No suspect information.</p>

01/21/2022 7:56pm	22000 Twyckingham	Front door was closed and opened w/o permission by suspect.	<p>On 01/21/2022 at 7:56pm, several Officers were dispatched to the 22000 Block of Twyckingham Way regarding a possible shooting. Dispatch advised Officers that a male broke into the homeowner's house and there were possibly shots fired. Officers arrived on scene and it was determined that the suspect had left in a Black Mercedes SUV prior to Officers arrival.</p> <p>Investigation revealed that the suspect was the ex-husband of R/P. (He doesn't live at this residence.) The female was having a couple's party when the ex-husband entered the residence w/o permission. R/P attempted to stop the subject but he forced his way in and hit her, knocking her off to the side. After entering the house, he walked into the room where all the couples were located and told them all to get out of the house. He then knocked several items onto the floor damaging them.</p> <p>One witness, advised Officers that the suspect raised his shirt and exposed a handgun in his waistband. R/P attempted to call 911 but the suspect took her cell phone from her and went out onto the front porch. R/P then shut and locked the front door.</p> <p>It was at this point that R/P thought she heard a gunshot. Officers found evidence that possibly a large object had been thrown at a front window breaking the window and possibly sounding like a gun shot. There was no evidence located that shots were fired.</p>

			<p><b>Note:</b> R/P tracked her cell phone to the suspects residence located in another city. The suspect wasn't located at this residence but phone contact was made with the suspect. He stated he would turn himself in later that evening.</p> <p>A BOL was sent out to area departments with suspects information and vehicle description.</p> <p>He did not turn himself in. Investigation is on-going.</p>

(Apartment Complex) R/P stated that her ex-boyfriend assaulting her and then stole her 2014 Silver Chevy Cruze. The suspect was gone prior to Officers arrival. Investigation revealed that R/P's ex-boyfriend got into argument with her regarding their breakup. R/P was packing up her stuff and getting ready to leave. Her ex-boyfriend wouldn't let her leave and assaulted her numerous times, threw her on the floor and threw furniture on top of her and stole her keys to her car. Victim had several substantial injuries and many items were damaged in her apartment. Investigation revealed that the suspect drove off with victim's vehicle but returned it and then took the R/P's vehicle which was left running unattended. That vehicle was recovered at a different location within the same complex. The suspect was eventually interviewed over the phone. He stated he was at a hospital in another jurisdiction getting treated for injuries alleging he sustained from his girlfriend and getting hit by car driven by the original R/P. (Victims male Friend). - ❖ Park in areas where your vehicle is viewable if possible
- ❖ Use commercially available security devices

The area checked negative but dispatch received a call from a juvenile female stating she was in one of the vehicles and had been dropped off at an office building. Two shell casings were found in the general area where she stated the incident happened but no involved vehicles or other persons were located. **Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles**  
**How to prevent this from happening to you!**

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. On 01/17/2022, Southfield Officers were dispatched to Hotel in the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy regarding trouble with subject. Officers met with witnesses and a male subject that was involved in incident. The male subject had several unconfirmed warrants. Officers confirmed one of the warrants and took subject into custody. During the search of suspects backpack Officers recovered several items of narcotic paraphernalia and suspected Methamphetamine. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of the suspected substance. It tested positive for possible presence of Methamphetamine. Suspect was taken into custody and conveyed to the Southfield Jail.

**Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.**

**How to prevent this from happening to you!**

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Southfield Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Sutton Dr. (Apartments) for a Domestic Investigation.

Upon arrival Officers were met by a black male who was aggressively screaming "It's Me", "Take Me to Jail". The subject was pushing past members inside of the home and continued to walk towards Officers in an aggressive manner screaming and hollering "take me to jail".

Due to subject's aggressive and confrontational behavior Officers had to detain the subject in handcuffs. The subject was highly intoxicated.

Officers continued their investigation and determined that the Domestic dispute between the male and female was verbal only.

After arrangements were made by Officers to have the male go with friend for the evening he again became aggressive & combative with Officers. He was taken into custody for Disorderly Person and conveyed to The Southfield Jail.

**M-10 Evergreen Rd.**

On 01/18/2022 at approx.2:45pm, Officers were assisting another Agency, looking for subject that was wanted for weapons charges. Officers located the suspect getting into his vehicle near 10 Mile Rd & Evergreen Rd. When Officers attempted to stop the vehicle, it was slow to pull over and continued to move forward until Officers got the vehicle boxed in so it had to stop.

Officers approached the vehicle and ordered suspect to exit the vehicle. Suspect refused to comply and repeatedly made furtive movements putting his hands out of view towards the floorboard of the vehicle. The suspect then accelerated forward and rammed into Officers vehicle that was stopped in front of his. The force from the impact pushed his vehicle into Officer causing him to get knocked off balance. Suspect attempted to ram through Officers vehicle several more times until his front wheels were wedged off the ground. Officers continued to see furtive movement from suspect until he was extracted from the vehicle and taken into custody.

On 01/20/2022 Officer was S/B on Evergreen Rd. at 10 Mile Rd. when he observed a Black Pontiac G6. This vehicle had a Michigan License Plate attached to it and had heavy front tinted windows. The license plate on vehicle indicated there was no insurance attached to the vehicle.

Officer attempted to stop the vehicle after activating his lights & siren. The vehicle failed to stop and fled from Officer. Officer terminated the chase and turned off his lights & siren.
