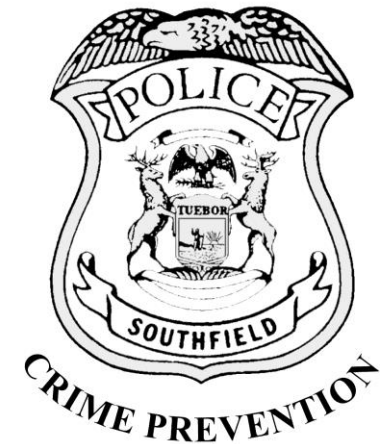
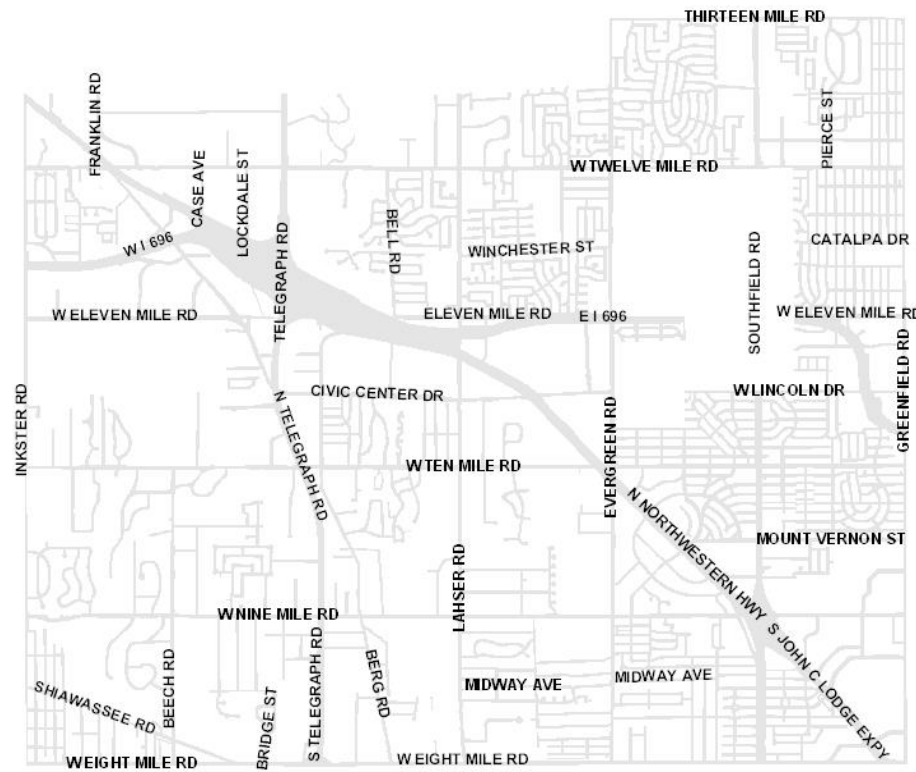

On 01/30/2022 at approx. 7:00am Officers responded to the 26000 Block of Telegraph Rd. (Gas Station) for a B&E just discovered. Representative from business arrived at work on 01/30/2022 at 6:49am. R/P discovered the front right glass door shattered and observed a brick inside the business. Surveillance Video shows at approx. 5:54am a B/M with a black puffy coat, black pants, black shoes, approached the business from the s/w corner. The suspect approached the front door and began to strike the door with an orange brick in his hand. The suspect eventually broke the right glass door and the brick was thrown into the business. The suspect took approx. two-three steps into the business and looked around. The suspect then ran out of the business and ran S/B. Nothing was taken from the business.

(This room belongs to a family member who is staying with them.)</p> <p>It is believed someone entered the home through the unlocked side door and went into this bedroom. The room was ransacked and a TV was taken off the wall. It's believed that the TV was handed to someone waiting outside through the bedroom window. The suspect inside the home then left through the same side entrance. There was no forced entry.</p> <p>R/P states prior to incident she observed a Black Sedan and then a White Sedan parked in front of her house.</p>

R/P advises she met the suspect online and had agreed to meet him for the first time at hotel in the 10000 Block of Corporate Dr.
The R/P met with suspect who had already rented a hotel room for the two of them.
R/P advises she fell asleep at approx. 3:00am and when she woke up at 11:00am, she noticed the suspect was gone and had taken her vehicle with keys. R/P made phone contact with the suspect and asked him to return the vehicle. He stated he would and he was on the way back to the hotel. He never returned the vehicle. The vehicle is a Rental Vehicle. R/P contacted the suspect again and this time he stated he would bring the vehicle back tomorrow.
On 1/31/2022 Officer was working the front desk. At approx. 3:30am Southfield Dispatch advised the vehicle was recovered on 01/31/2022 in another state. Suspect has been identified and Investigation is on-going.

- ❖ Never leave your vehicle running unattended
 - ❖ Park in areas where your vehicle is viewable if possible
 - ❖ Use commercially available security devices

R/P believed the elderly male was getting carjacked.</p> <p>As Officers were pulling into area, Southfield Police Dispatch advised the Red 2020 Toyota Corolla was now on the move. Officer located the vehicle exiting the parking lot at the 12 Mile Rd exit. The vehicle was stopped.</p> <p>Officers approached the passenger side of the vehicle and heard the driver state "I need some help". Officers observed a black male wearing a brown jacket, black jeans, and a black baseball hat sitting in the passenger seat. The male's hands were in his pants. Officers drew their handguns and ordered the male to show his hands and he complied. They ordered the male to put his hands on his head and he complied. He was removed from the vehicle. There was a knife recovered from the seat, under where the suspect was seated. He was handcuffed and detained while Officers investigated further. Officers interviewed the witness and the victim and determined that the crime of Carjacking</p>

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and recovered the suspects knife.</p> <p>Note: Further investigation Officers recovered items that had been confirmed as stolen from business by the Carjacking suspect.</p> <p>Retail Fraud (Separate Incident) Photos were taken of the stolen items and they were returned to the store.</p> <p>Note: Victim came into the station on 01/27/2022 to report that he had several areas of bruising that developed since the incident occurred. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician took photos of the injuries.</p> <p>Great job by the citizen to report this!!!</p>

Officers were dispatched to the 26000 Block of Telegraph Rd. (Hotel) for a report of a Sexual Assault. Suspect was a B/M wearing all black, pulled a gun on the caller. Suspect left the hotel in a Black Ford Fusion. Caller did not know the suspect.

Officers arrived on scene and interviewed R/P.

R/P advised she was a prostitute and arranged to have sex with a subject for a price that was agreed upon. When the suspect arrived, he was intoxicated and failed to produce the agreed upon price.

R/P decided not to go through with the transaction and asked the subject to leave.

The suspect then sexually assaulted R/P. When she yelled "You raped me" her three female friends in the connecting room opened the door and entered the room. The suspect was surprised by this and stated, "What is this"? He then pulled out a handgun and pointed it at R/P and her three friends. The suspect then fled the room. He was observed leaving the parking lot in a Black vehicle.

Assault with Intent to Murder- 1- Arrest

01/28/2022 7:26am

17000 Block of Coral Gables St.

On 01/28/2022 several Southfield Officers responded to the 17000 Block of Coral Gables for a shooting. Officers were advised the shooting happened between a stepfather and stepson in the home. Upon arrival, Officers observed a female drive up to the residence at a high rate of speed. The female exited the vehicle and walked toward the home. The female was identified as the suspects wife and was asked to step away from the home. An elderly black male in boxer shorts and a gray shirt exited the home. The male would later be identified as the suspect. He was ordered to show officers his hands. Officers observed a holstered pistol in his right hand. The suspect dropped the pistol and was detained while Officers investigated further.

Officers approached the home and ordered the residents out. The victim stated he had been shot. Officers observed a gunshot wound to the victim's right hip. Life Support was called to the scene.

Victim stated his step father asked him to exit the bathroom. Victim wasn't sure why he wanted him to exit the bathroom, but when he did his step father shot him for no apparent reason.

Victim was transported to local hospital for treatment.

Southfield Police Detectives and Evidence Technicians responded to the scene and are investigating. The suspect was arrested and lodged in the Southfield Detention Center. Investigation is on-going.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

Reckless Driving/ R&O- 1- Arrest

A White Chrysler 300C passed Officer at a high rate of speed. The 300C was observed weaving in and out of traffic with reckless disregard for others safety. Officer activated his lights & siren and attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle failed to stop but eventually stopped after traveling approx. ½ mile.

After the vehicle was stopped Officer advised the driver to turn the vehicle off. The driver complied. Officer approached the vehicle and requested the driver to give him the keys for the vehicle.

The driver refused. Additional Officers arrived on scene and the driver was ordered to exit the vehicle. He refused to exit the vehicle.

Officers removed the driver from the vehicle and took him into custody for Reckless Driving. While escorting the suspect to their police vehicle the suspect resisted Officers. He was eventually secured in the back of the police vehicle.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
