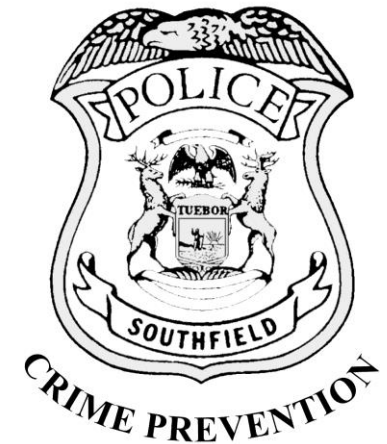
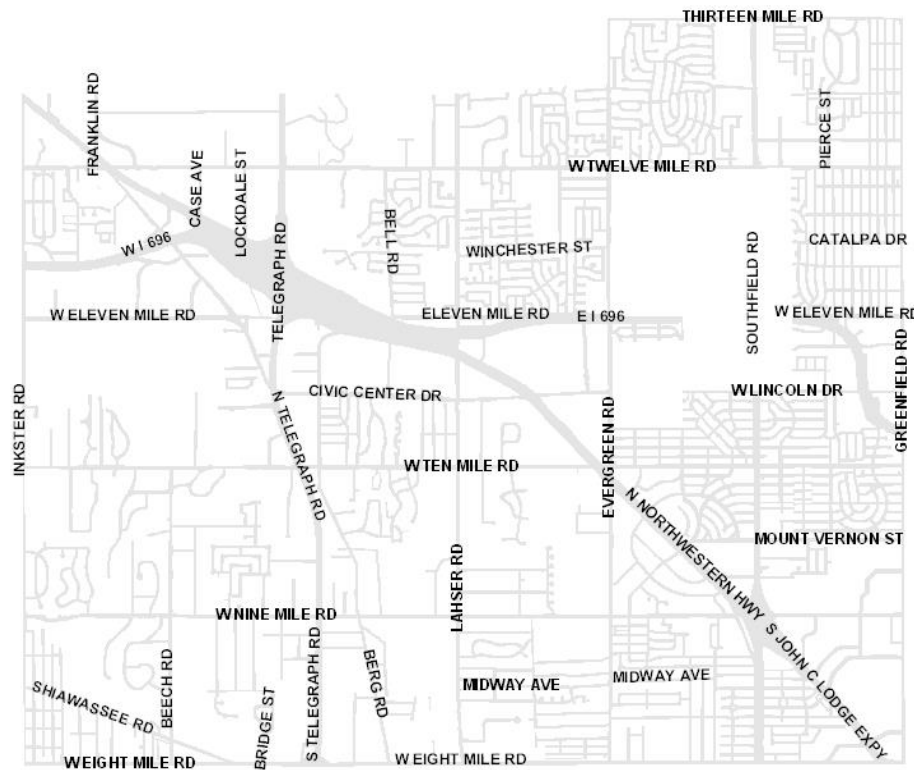

Dispatch advised the R/P (Victim) was selling Marijuana to two individuals, one of the individuals pulled out a handgun and took the Marijuana. The two individuals drove away in a Black Buick Lacrosse with tinted windows. A short time later Officers located the suspect vehicle and stopped it. Officers located a black BB gun and the two containers of marijuana that were taken from victim inside the suspects vehicle. The two males matched the description of the suspects and were taken into custody for Armed Robbery.

On 04/02/2022, Officer Passinault and Hanosh were dispatched to 26409 Shiawasse for a Robbery that occurred at approx. 5:20pm at Shiawasse & Poinciana. R/P reported that his daughter had her money stolen from her. R/P advised his daughter is diagnosed as a high functioning autistic and was out for a walk after arriving home. An unknown suspect stole money from her while she was on her own and she came back home and told her father. Victim states she was walking on Shiawasse Rd. and noticed a black SUV behind her traveling slowly. The SUV was black all around without any insignias and had overhead lights. The unknown suspect was a B/M, unknown age, wearing a blue baseball hat (no further description) was driving the vehicle. He pulled up next to her as she approached Poinciana St. and rolled his window down halfway. The suspect asked for her ID and then snatched her backpack from her. He opened it up, grabbed her wallet, and gave her the backpack back. There was an undisclosed amount of cash in victim's wallet. The suspect fled towards Inkster Rd. and went an unknown direction.

During this investigation a suspect was developed. A photo show was later put together by Southfield Detectives with the suspects photo included in the photo show. The victim from the Dry Cleaners positively identified the suspect that was developed as the person that robbed the business. Investigation is on-going.</p>

<p>Special Attention: Incident- CSC IV 03/28/2022 2:26pm 25000 Block of Southfield Rd. (Commercial- Hair Salon) Officers were dispatched to the 25000 Southfield Rd. (Hair Salon) regarding CSC IV that had just occurred at the business. R/P (female employee) advised she had someone come in wanting to use the restroom. The subject began asking questions and grabbed her inappropriately before going to the restroom. The suspect was located by Officer and was questioned. He denied being at the store or doing anything wrong. Officers and the R/P both noted that the suspect seemed a little off, possibly mentally challenged. After speaking further with the R/P she stated she didn't wish to prosecute. Officers advised victim on getting a PPO. Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage, you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Felonious Assault/ CCW- 2- Arrests

(Apartment Complex)

On today's date, 04/01/2022, several Officers responded to the 27000 Block of Franklin Rd. for a report of trouble with a subject.

Security was advising that subject, who was identified, was currently in the lobby and had feloniously assaulted several people on yesterday's date, 03/31/2022. He was attempting to get a key for apartment which belongs to his girlfriend who was arrested yesterday.

Officers arrived on scene and located the male suspect in the lobby. He was identified as the subject from yesterday's incident. When questioned about the incident he stated he had an altercation in the lobby with some residents and he pulled out his handgun because he felt threatened.

Officers asked if he had that firearm on his person now? He stated yes. He was asked if he had a CPL and he stated, no.

Officers recovered the handgun from subject's pocket. He was taken into custody for CCW & for F/A regarding yesterday's incident.

Note: When Officers originally responded the day prior to this incident the suspect wasn't located. The female that was with him however was located and she was in possession of a handgun and did not have a CPL as well and was taken into custody for CCW.

The information in this incident was the male suspect had a confrontation with several persons in the lobby. During this confrontation the male suspect pulled out a handgun and presented it so everyone could see it and threatened the victims.

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
