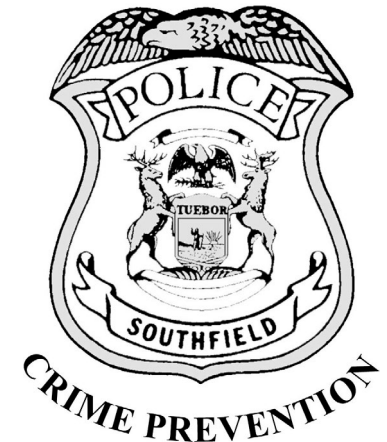
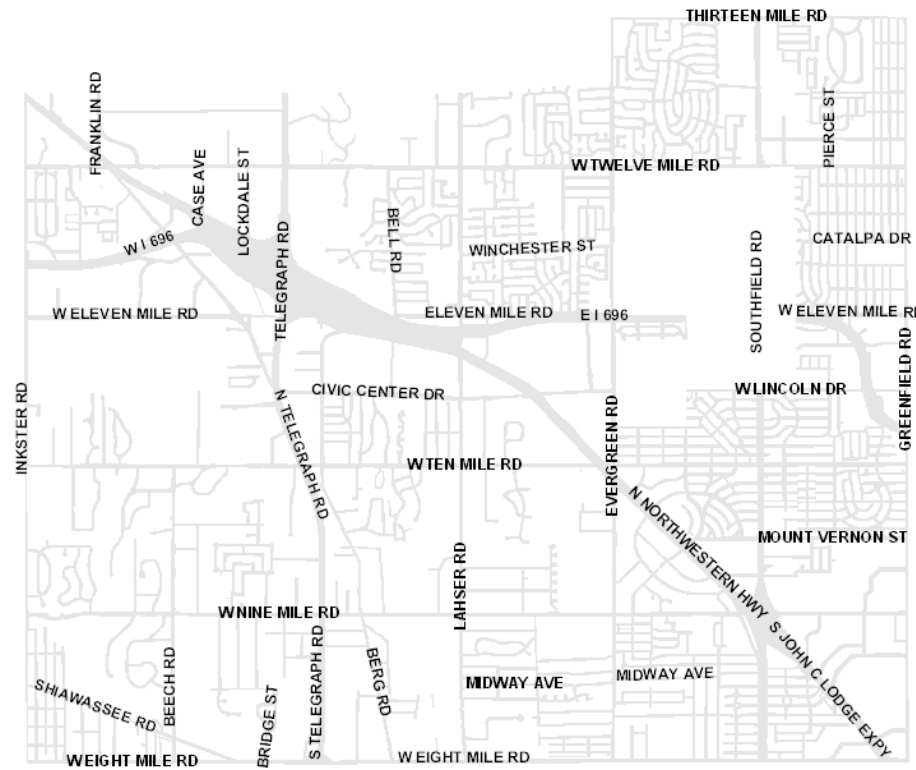

R/P advises on 11/05/2022 she was engaged in a verbal dispute with her boyfriend concerning his aggressive behavior while drinking alcohol. R/P advised her boyfriend not to return to her residence and that he could pick up his clothing later. To avoid a possible confrontation R/P left her residence to stay with her mother overnight. When she returned home at approx. 9:30am she discovered damage to the rear entry door going into the garage. A single pane glass window was broken allowing access to the locked door leading into the garage. In addition, an entry door leading into the kitchen from the garage had been compromised by using an unknown tool to defeat a deadbolt and door lock. R/P wishes to prosecute her boyfriend for the damages & Home Invasion. Note: On 10/20/2022 a Southfield Officer served suspect with a PPO and filed same with the County. Suspect has been identified and incident is under further investigation.

A B/M wearing all black and a black ski mask got out of the backseat of the vehicle. The suspect put a handgun to his head and told him to get on his knees. Victim got on his knees and the suspect put victims' hands behind his back and handcuffed him. Officers observed bruising around both of victim's wrists. Victim was placed in the back of the suspects' vehicle and the suspect who had the gun sat in the backseat with him. There were two other suspects in the front seat, both wearing all black and black ski masks as well. Victim stated the suspects were posing as Police Officers and announced themselves as such. 24000 Block of Lahser Rd.**(Southfield Public School)**

A 15-year-old student made threats (via note) to shoot students on November 4th. The note was turned in by a student who found it on the floor. The suspect was identified by School Resource Officers. The suspect's mother was notified, and he was transported to the Southfield Police Department without incident. A Referee at Children's Village was notified, and he authorized the suspect to be released to his parents.

Officers interviewed the suspect. He admitted to writing the note and stated that he wrote the note because the students behind him would not move. He also stated that it was written as a joke. Officers conducted follow up investigation and responded to the suspects residence in Detroit and were given permission to search his bedroom. No weapons were located.

Fleeing & Eluding/ R&C Motor Vehicle/ DWLS- 1- Arrest

Evergreen Rd. & W Nine Mile Rd.

On 10/31/2022 at 10:12am Officer was patrolling the area of Southfield Rd and 9 Mile Rd, when he observed a Blue Kia Sportage going W/B on 9 Mile Rd through Southfield Rd. He ran the license plate in LEIN, which returned as a stolen vehicle out of Southfield PD. Officer Radioed the information in and requested back-up.

Additional Officers responded to Officers request. Officer attempted to stop the vehicle and it immediately fled from Officers. The vehicle fled S/B on Evergreen Rd from M-10 at high rate of speed until it turned E/B on Saxton St.

Officer was able to initiate a PIT maneuver on the suspect vehicle to disable it in a ditch on Saxton Ave, just East of Evergreen Rd. Officer deployed his K-9 holding him by his harness in near proximity of the suspect to encourage the suspect to surrender. Officers were able to secure the suspect and take him into custody without incident. The vehicle that suspects was driving was stolen out of Southfield on 10/05/2022. Upon recovery/arrest, the ignition on the vehicle was broken and there were no keys recovered with the vehicle. Suspect was also in possession of a USB cable that is known to be used to steal Kia vehicles. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician responded to process the vehicle and collect evidence. The case was forwarded to The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for review. OCPD issued for R&C Motor Vehicle & Fleeing & Eluding 3rd Degree.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

- Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage, you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately calls 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

Officers were dispatched to the 29000 Block of Fairfax on a report of a Felonious Assault and subject armed. Female caller stated her sister asked her to come to the location to pick her up. Upon arrival the male at the home pulled out a gun and pointed it at her and her boyfriend. The suspect left the residence in a 2017 Jeep Grand Cherokee. Vehicle was last seen heading South on Fairfax towards Twelve Mile Rd. Southfield Lathrup Officer located the suspect vehicle, he observed the suspect throw a black handgun from the vehicle. Southfield Officers made the area and together they stopped the vehicle. The handgun was located and recovered. The suspect was taken into custody for CCW and after speaking with victims and witnesses the suspect was also charged with two counts of Felonious Assault.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

21000 Block of Telegraph Rd.

(Towing Company)

On October 31, 2022, at approx. 2:39am Officers responded to a call for Malicious Destruction of Property at Towing Company located in the 21000 Block of Telegraph Road. The caller (Owner) was reporting an unknown male parked in the business next door was cutting the fence in the rear of the towing lot.

Upon arrival, Officers began calling out directions to the suspect's location as they were viewing it via live view of the Southfield Police Department drone.

Officers trained to fly the department drone were using the infrared to get a better view on the suspect. Officers were advised the male was running SB through the lot and jumping the fence. The male then began to run EB. The male was then seen running SB behind 21000 Block of Telegraph. Drone operators advised officers that the male was running SE in the wood line and was continuing EB. Officers were advised the male was hunkered down near the 21000 Block of Sherman. Officers walked into the woods near this area and were directed to the suspect as he continued to run away from Officers. Officers identified themselves as Southfield Police and ordered him to stop. The suspect continued to run away until he was ordered 3-4 more times to stop. The suspect eventually stopped and laid on the ground while Officers handcuffed him. The suspect was searched, and Officers located a black cell phone and a set of keys in his right pants pocket that included a Dodge vehicle key. Officers discovered they were the keys to the suspect vehicle parked in the business next to the towing yard. The suspect was placed under arrest (for Malicious Destruction of Property, Resisting and Obstructing, and Possession of

Burglary Tools) and conveyed to the Southfield Jail without incident. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and took photos. Great job by everyone that was involved in this investigation and arrest!! Great use of the drone as well!!!
