INTERESTING SOUTHFIELD FACTS

- The City of Southfield was named one of the nation's most livable metro-area suburbs by Forbes magazine based on market research conducted by NeighborhoodScout.com, a statistical database that gathers figures from the U.S. Census, the National Center for Education Statistics, the Office of Federal Housing Enterprise Oversight, the FBI and the U.S. Justice Department.
- Southfield was selected as metro Detroit's "most livable" community by Forbes for its large commercial district, affordable housing, quality schools and safe neighborhoods. The research measured the education level of residents, home ownership rates, home values, quality of schools, and the crime index.
- Southfield ranked as top U.S. city for black women to flourish financially by MoneyGeek in 2021 and 2024.
- Southfield is home to nine outstanding colleges, universities and trade schools, including Lawrence Technological University, one of the nation's "top 40" institutions specializing in engineering, architecture and business.
- Nearly 200 restaurants of every fare from neighborhood delis to upscale bistros make dining in Southfield a pleasurable experience for business entertainment, or just a family night out.
