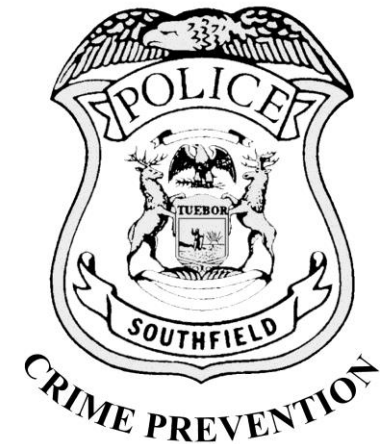
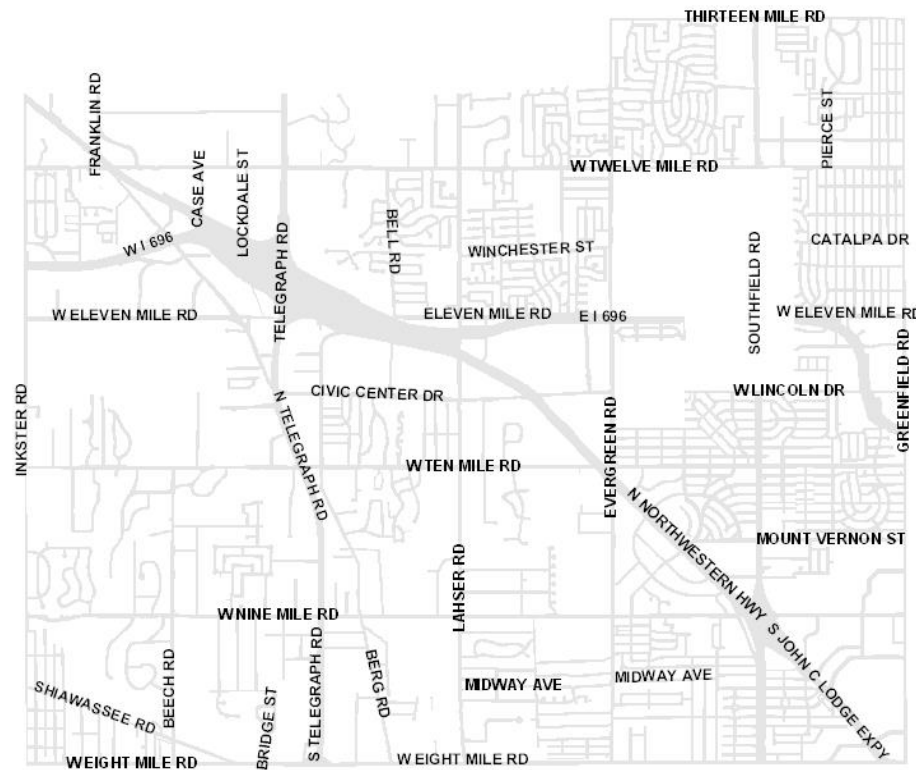

04/18/2021 3:00am	25000 Northwestern (Hotel)	Screen was removed and window was opened.	<p>On 04/18/2021 Officer was dispatched to the 25000 Block of Northwestern (Hotel) reference an unwanted subject. The subject was recently advised on trespassing on 04/17/2021 by Hotel Security. The manager for the hotel called stating subject was on the premises again making threats about stabbing someone.</p> <p>Officers arrived on scene and attempted to locate the suspect. He was not located but Officers discovered a screen removed and window open in one of the ground level hotel rooms.</p> <p>Officers and the manager attempted to make contact at this room. Nobody answered the knock at the door so the manager opened the door. The room was not rented out to anyone. Officers found the room in disarray, the bed appeared to have been slept in and there were feces smeared on the wall. It's believed that the person Officers were looking for is responsible. The suspect has been identified and investigation is on-going.</p>

The license plate on the vehicle came back improper on a 2015 Ford Truck. The subject driving the vehicle parked and walked into the Office Building. Other TCSU units made the location and set up surveillance of the vehicle. There was a flag on the vehicle plate indicating an incident out of Warren PD, on 4/15/2021 where the vehicle fled from Warren Officers. Officer ran the VIN on the vehicle which came back as a stolen vehicle out of Sterling Heights, taken on 3/11/2021. The suspect saw Officers driving towards the vehicle, he then turned and began walking at a fast pace back towards the Office Building. Marked units immediately moved in and took the suspect into custody. Officers recovered a working Dodge Charger key for the stolen vehicle in the suspects

(Gas Station)	Status S - Stolen Description 2019 Android Cell Phone with Black Case containing victims Driver's License, Four Credit Cards, Food Card, Registration & Insurance.	<p>Victim states he was stopped for red light at S/B Telegraph at Swanson. When the light turned green he started to move forward but the car in front of him didn't and he ran into the rear of that car. They all pulled off into the Gas Station. There was a female driver and one male passenger in the other vehicle.</p> <p>After pulling off the male passenger in the other vehicle got out of his car and started taking pictures of R/P and his vehicle. The R/P got his phone out and started taking pictures as well. The male passenger was upset with this and struck R/P with his fist three times knocking him to the ground. R/P isn't sure, but one of the subjects then took his cell phone and fled the scene.</p> <p>Officers reviewed surveillance video from the Gas Station and determined the suspect vehicle to be a Black BMW with chrome rims. (Minor damage to rear bumper)</p> <p>Surveillance Video shows the suspect Assaulting victim and then picking up something from the</p>

			<p>ground. (Most likely victims cell phone) The suspect was then picked up by the female and they fled the area. Suspect#1 is a B/M approx. 6'1", medium build, wearing green or brown doo rag, sweat shirt, and sweat pants. Suspect #2 is a B/F, approx. 5'6", medium build, wearing a long sleeve black shirt with a blue denim vest over top.</p>

Officer met with the female victim and Security from Hotel. Victim states she is pregnant with her boyfriend's child and she has been with him for approx. 1- year. They are both currently staying at the Hotel.</p> <p>On today's date, her boyfriend was upset with her because she took so long to get to the Hotel. When she arrived, he started yelling at her and she got scared and ran towards the hotel lobby and sat down on a rock. Her boyfriend followed her and was threatening her and was getting aggressive with her. Security Person for the hotel intervened and told the boyfriend to leave the complex. The boyfriend took victims keys to her 2017 Silver Chevrolet Malibu and left the complex.</p> <p>Victim stated that her boyfriend threatened bodily harm to her several times prior to leaving.</p> <p>The boyfriend called victim while Officers were investigating. Victim put her phone on speaker and Officers heard her boyfriend say, "This is the last time you'll be calling the police on me." &amp; "F you and F the police." #### **Greenfield Rd. & Stratford Dr.**

Southfield Police and Emergency Rescue Personnel were dispatched to the area of Greenfield & Stratford Drive on a report of a car versus motorcycle. Southfield Fire and Rescue personnel transported a 26-year-old male (Southfield resident) to an area hospital.

Once at the hospital the male was pronounced deceased. The driver of the other involved vehicle sustained non-life-threatening injuries and was treated at the scene.

Southfield Police Specialists and Accident Investigator were on scene working the Fatal Vehicular Crash.

Investigation is on-going.

#### **24000 Block of Northwestern (Hotel)**

On 04/13/21, Officers were dispatched to the 18000 Block of Westhampton reference a Suspicious Incident.

R/P stated she stopped at the Gas Station at Evergreen and Northwestern and saw 3 teenage girls. They seemed like they needed help. They were talking with a few older men and it didn't seem right to her. She spoke to the girls and found out they were from Indiana. R/P brought all 3 girls back to her home on Westhampton. She spoke to them a bit and believes one of the girls was sexually assaulted. R/P then called the police. Officers arrived on scene and interviewed the girls. The girls were 13, 16 & 19 Years old. The girls all attended a Family Service Center in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. They all ran away from the facility. Two of the girls have learning disabilities.

Investigation revealed that the girls came across two Hispanic males at a gas station in Indiana and asked them for a ride. They had a red full- size van that was filled with construction equipment. The two men were Hispanic with heavy accents. They drove to a hotel in Southfield in the 24000 Block of Northwestern. One of the males took two of the girls into the hotel so the girls could use the bathroom. The other male stayed in the car with the third female. While these two were in the car the male sexually assaulted the female against her will.

The other two girls went to room in the hotel and the two girls went into the bathroom together. While they were in the bathroom the male that was with them tried to open the door to the bathroom several times.

Nothing happened and the girls returned to the male's vehicle.

**27000 Block of Dover St.**

On 04/13/2021, Officers were dispatched to residence on a report of R/P finding his sister with an apparent gunshot wound in her garage. Initial investigation revealed that this may have been a self-inflicted wound.

Southfield Police Detectives and Specialists were on scene and investigation is on-going.

**Special Attention:****Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.****How to prevent this from happening to you!**

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

When they got to the vehicle they could tell that something happened and their friend was very upset. The victim later told Police that she was sexually assaulted and gave them the details of the assault.

Officers responded to the Hotel, located the suspect's vehicle and located the suspects in their Hotel Room. Both suspects were interviewed. The suspect in CSC that occurred in the vehicle was taken into custody for CSC III. The second suspect was issued Ordinance Violation for Contributing to a Minor and released. Haven was contacted as well as CPS.

The victim was transported to Haven for evaluation.

Guardians for the three girls were contacted as was the Family Services in Indiana. The Ft Wayne Police were contacted and the three girls were reported as Missing & Endangered.



## **Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles**

### **How to prevent this from happening to you!**

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers

## **OWI/ CCW/ MDOP Police Property/ Possession of Prescription Drugs w/o Prescription- 1- Arrest**

### **W Eleven Mile Rd. & Franklin Rd**

Officer was dispatched to the intersection of W Eleven Mile Rd. and Franklin Rd. on report of a single-vehicle collision, car vs. utility pole. The R/P reported that he observed a White SUV leave the roadway and strike a sign in the roundabout. Officer arrived on scene and located the vehicle in question with heavy front end damage. It was apparent that the vehicle had hit a sign in the roundabout. There was a strong odor of intoxicants emanating from the driver and he made admissions that he had been drinking. Additional Officers arrived on scene and assisted on this investigation.

The driver refused to do sobriety tests and refused PBT. He was taken into custody for OWI. After securing subject in the back seat of patrol vehicle he became irate and started kicking the inside of the door damaging the door.

When Officers were putting leg restraints on the driver he kept kicking and one of his shoes fell off. A bag of pills fell from the suspects boot onto the ground. (Later identified as Oxycodone) The suspect was taken to hospital where a search warrant was obtained and a blood draw was completed.

Officers located a functioning Taser and a large amount of suspected marijuana in the vehicle. The marijuana was taken for safe keeping and the Taser was placed into evidence for CCW charge.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.
