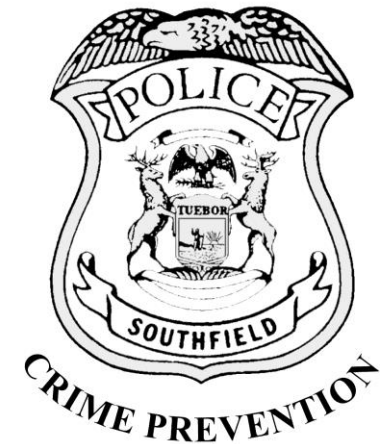

R/P states she observed her boyfriend walk over to her bedroom window and began to bang on it. He then walked over to the sliding door wall and forced the door wall open. He entered the apartment breaking several blinds. Once inside a verbal argument ensued and escalated to the point that her boyfriend hit her. R/P then phoned the police. As the suspect was leaving he stated he was going to kill her. He knocked over her Apple MacBook and damaged it.</p> <p>It's believed that the suspect left in his Black Charger with a loud exhaust.</p> <p>Victim states this incident is a continuation from a previous incident where suspect was assaulted in another jurisdiction. Suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.</p>

<p>LFA's/ Armed Robberies: Several incidents recently at Office Building in the 23000 Block of Greenfield Rd. (Multi- Office Building) This past week we had two incidents:</p> <p>Incident#1 (LFA) 08/21/2021 4:02pm Victim was inside the building shopping at jewelry store. When he came back outside his vehicles window had been broken out and several items were taken. Cash. Louis Vuitton Purse, Louis Vuitton Small Purse, 9 various Debit and Credit Cards were taken. A witness stated the suspects arrived in a Dark Blue Chrysler 300. Suspects were two males wearing masks.</p> <p>Incident #2 (Armed Robbery) 08/20/2021 4:32pm Victim was at the Office Building shopping in the stores by himself. Nobody else knew he was at the building. When he exited the front doors, two armed males rushed up to him and demanded his necklace. They took his necklace, glasses, and iPhone. The suspects then entered a Black Dodge Charger and fled the area in an unknown direction. The two suspects were both B/M's estimated to be aged 20-30 years old. Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

(Hotel)

On 08/21/2021 at 1:25am Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Telegraph Rd. (Hotel) reference a Domestic Assault between a male and a female.

Officers located the male and female at two separate locations.

The female stated the male forced entry into her motel room and assaulted her. He took an undisclosed amount of cash from the dresser in the room and fled on foot. When contact was made with the male he reached into his pants for something and resisted Officers.

Officers were concerned that the suspect may be armed and used the necessary force in gaining control of the male suspect. When the subject removed his hand from inside his pants a clear plastic baggie came out with a white powdery substance in it. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician later, Field Tested the substance and it tested positive for possible presence of Cocaine.

Officers also located some pills on suspect. They identified as Amphetamine and Dextroamphetamine.

The male subject was taken into custody for Domestic A&B/ R&O/ Poss. Cocaine/ Poss. Prescription Drugs w/o prescription and for a PPO Violation out of 46th District Ct. The protected person in the PPO was the female in this incident. The case was presented to the OCPO for review and warrants were secured.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Domestic A&B/ MDOP/ Larceny- 1- Arrest

(Apartments)

Officers were dispatched to the 16000 Block of North Park Dr. (Apartments) for reports of a Domestic Assault. R/P (Female) stated she was involved in a physical altercation with her boyfriend. She stated to Police Dispatch he has a pistol and is afraid he might get it out. While in route Officers were advised that the female wasn't in the apartment anymore and her location was unknown.

Officers arrived at the apartment in question and knocked on the door. A male from inside the apartment answered through the door. He refused to open the door stating it was all just verbal nothing physical happened. He later opened the door and spoke to Officers. The female was located and she advised that the male subject became irate and threw a chair at her, striking her on the leg. They continued arguing in the bedroom, where the male broke her iPad. Victim began to collect her belongings and some items for their child. When the male realized she was leaving he then punched her in the nose. Victim then left the apartment with their child and went out to her vehicle. The male subject confronted her at her vehicle and he had a handgun and began to hit the trunk of the vehicle with the pistol. After hitting the car with the pistol, he attempted to light the front driver door handle of the vehicle on fire and then began to chase victim around with a can of hair spray and a lighter. He was trying to light her on fire.

The handgun was recovered and it came back stolen out of Southfield. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician was on scene and collected evidence and took photos of victim's injuries. The male subject was taken into custody for Domestic F/A, R&C Stolen Property & MDOP.

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.
