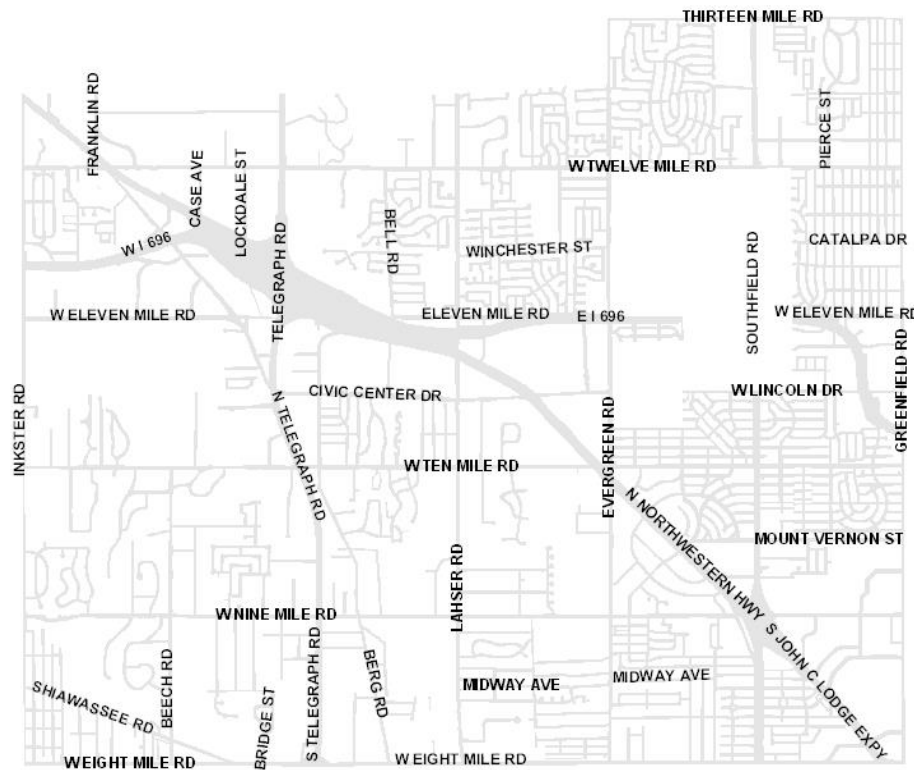

<p>Special Attention: Domestic F/A Knife & Scissor Stabbing. 09/07/2020 10:44pm 29000 Block of Franklin Hills Dr. (Apartments) Several Officers responded to Domestic F/A between boyfriend & girlfriend, one child in common. Investigation revealed that both subjects were at a party in Detroit. They both were drinking heavily and got into a verbal dispute regarding the male half talking to some other females. Later the same evening when they got home in Southfield the dispute escalated to the point that the male allegedly assaulted the female. The female then stabbed the male several times with a knife and a pair of scissors. Both subjects had extensive injuries and there were blood smears and a trail of blood all over the apartment and outside the apartment. The female was highly intoxicated and refused treatment. She was taken into protective custody and transported to the hospital for treatment. The male subject wasn't immediately located. A K-9 was used to attempt to locate the male subject. He was located near 12 Mile and Northwestern. He had several lacerations and stab wounds and was also transported to the hospital where he was treated. Neither party had life threatening injuries. It was learned that the two combatants have a</p>	<p>F/A/ Resisting Arrest/ Child Endangerment- 1- Arrest 09/03/2020 12:06am 23000 Providence Dr. Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Providence Dr. regarding a male assaulting a female in the parking lot. The female half was holding a baby and the female could be heard screaming by Southfield Dispatchers. Officers arrived on scene and located the male half walking away, in the street holding the baby and he was screaming. When ordered to stop the subject refused and told Officers to tase him. The female was then observed running after the male and the two were fighting over possession of the baby. When Officers attempted to intervene, the male subject resisted them and threatened Officers. At some point during the incident Officers gained enough control of subject so the female could take the baby. The male subject continued to resist Officers. He was taken into custody. 2- Arrests

09/07/2020 7:25pm

24000 Block of W Twelve Mile Rd.

(Parking Lot)

Officers responded to possible F/A in progress. Dispatch advised that a B/F, wearing a pink shirt with gray pants was assaulting a B/M, near a Silver Chrysler 300 in the parking lot. Dispatch received additional calls stating that the female was assaulting the male with a weapon, possibly a knife.

Investigation by Officers determined that the incident was a Domestic F/A, CCW (Stun Gun) & Parole Violation.

The two combatants were driving in a car together when the female asked to see the males phone. She was suspicious that the male was talking to other females. The male alleges that the female struck him in the face with her hand when he wouldn't give her his cell phone.

At some point both subjects were out of the vehicle near 12 Mile & Telegraph. Witnesses and the male state that the female started chasing him around the vehicle with a knife. The male grabbed a bat from the vehicle to protect himself. Officers observed that the male had a stab wound to his thigh and he was transported to the hospital for treatment. The female was taken into custody Domestic F/A & CCW (Stun Gun). The male would later (after treatment) be brought in for Parole Violation.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
