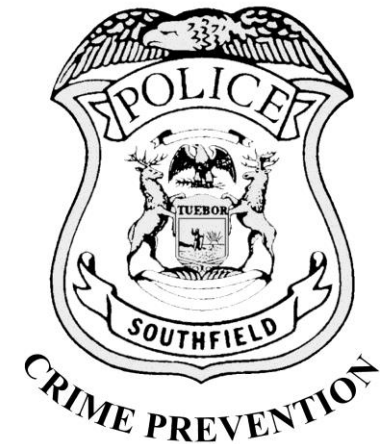
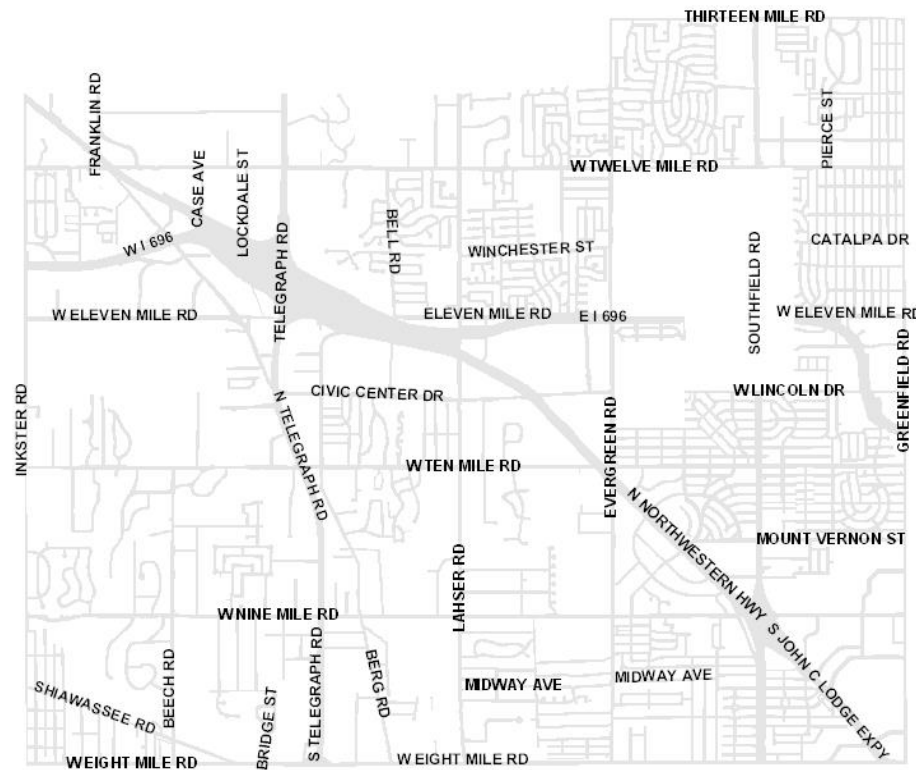

Always use trusted sites and be careful when clicking.

When using an online tax preparation service, look for the tax preparer identification number. The IRS requires all paid tax preparers to have one before filing any returns.

(Grocery and Household Goods)

Officers were dispatched to the 28000 Block of Telegraph Rd. regarding a Retail Fraud that occurred. The suspect was described as a B/M wearing a blue jacket, jeans and a cap. Last seen running E/B 12 Mile Rd. going into a nearby Apartment Complex.

Officers located a subject matching the description given, E/B 12 Mile Rd. and Streamwood. The subject was positively identified as the suspect in the Retail Fraud. He was taken into custody w/o incident and he made admissions to the Retail Fraud. Stolen items were recovered.

(Grocery & Household Goods)

On 02/27/2020, Officers were dispatched to business in the 30000 Block of Southfield Rd. regarding a Retail Fraud that just occurred in the store. The suspect was currently being detained by Loss Prevention Staff.

Officers arrived on scene and spoke to the Loss Prevention Staff. They advised they observed suspect select and conceal several items on her person and then attempted to leave the store w/o paying for the items. Officers established PC for the arrest of suspect and she was taken into custody for Retail Fraud. The stolen items were recovered by Loss Prevention.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Officer was dispatched to the 28000 Block of Telegraph Rd. for a report of a Retail Fraud.

Officer met with Loss Prevention Personnel who advised they witnessed suspect placing several items such as salami, cheese and shrimp, mixing it in with produce bags that were only tagged with the produce items. The suspect then went through the self-checkout line and didn't pay for the items that were put in with the produce. The suspect was taken into custody for Retail Fraud.

Officers were dispatched to the 25000 Block of Shiawassee Cir on a Disturbance. A Female was in the parking lot armed with a pair of scissors. Upon arrival Officers located a male and female in the parking Lot. Officers interviewed both subjects.

Officers observed blood on the female's hands, her appearance was disheveled (messy hair, no shoes). Her eyes were bloodshot, speech was slurred and she smelled of intoxicants.

Investigation revealed that the male & female got into a heated dispute. The female went into Condo and started braking and flipping over furniture. Several items were damaged. The female was also responsible for braking the glass on a Fire Extinguisher Door and throwing the Fire Extinguisher out into the snow. Officers completed their investigation and the female was taken into custody for MDOP.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizens can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
