


Officers recovered two Saw Zaw Blades on the step of one of the busses.</p> | <p><b>Shooting Investigation;</b><br/> <b>Assault w/Intent to Murder- 1- Arrest</b><br/> 01/22/2021 2:49am<br/> <b>21000 Block of Eight and Half Mile Rd.</b><br/> On 01/22/21 around 2:50am, Officers were dispatched to the 21000 Block of 8 1/2 Mile Rd regarding 4-5-gun shots heard. Officer arrived in the area and observed vehicle running in the driveway of residence. The vehicle became occupied and left the residence at a high rate of speed.<br/> Officer pursued vehicle and stopped the vehicle near Prescott and Woodburn. The driver immediately exited the vehicle and yelled back to Officer that there is a female in the vehicle that had been shot. There was also a second male in the front seat of vehicle. The two males from the vehicle were secured and Officer went to render aid to the female that was shot. It was confirmed that a 16-year old female had been shot. She was transported to the hospital by a Southfield FD Life Unit for treatment.<br/> The two males are father and son. The father stated his son woke him up and told him his girlfriend had been shot. The son was uncooperative when Officers questioned him. He changed his story several times and wasn't forth coming with the truth of what occurred. Further investigation by Officers and Detectives revealed that the shooting most likely took place in a shed located in the rear yard of residence. Southfield Police Evidence Technicians processed the scene and collected evidence that was consistent that a shooting took place at this location.<br/> During an interview by Southfield Detectives of the son that was earlier stopped by Officers, information was obtained that another associate of his shot his girlfriend after the two got into a verbal argument.</p> |

Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Lake Ravines Dr. for a report of a trouble with subject. The caller stated that there was an argument between residents and staff at a Group Home. Officers arrived on scene and were confronted with the Homeowner arguing with two teenage females. The two teenage females were yelling very loudly and refused to listen to Officers commands to stop. The two females eventually went into their bedrooms. Officers interviewed the two teenage females & the other female identified as the Foster Parent. The incident began after The Foster Parent recovered some marijuana wrap in one of the girl's bedrooms. An argument about who's it was and where it came from ensued. It started out verbal and then got physical. One of the teenage females (suspect) grabbed a knife and threatened the Foster Parent by raising the knife up over her head. The Foster Parent grabbed a broom to protect herself. The suspect was taken into custody for F/A, she resisted arrest and when she was placed into Officers patrol vehicle she kept taking off her seatbelt & attempted to kick out a window. Officers used restraints to secure suspect. The suspect then stated she wanted to kill herself. The suspect was taken to Hospital for Mental Health Evaluation. The Foster Parent arrived at the hospital and she refused to petition the female and stated she wanted the suspect to come back home? The Foster Parent who had earlier stated she was in fear for her life was now telling Officers and the Doctor that she wasn't in fear for her life. She wanted suspect to come home and didn't wish to pursue criminal charges. The suspect was RPI'd and CPS was notified of incident.

On 01/21/2021 Officers were dispatched to Apartment Complex in the 26000 Block of Berg Rd. Dispatch received a call stating three gunshots were heard outside and a Black Jeep Cherokee was possibly involved.

Officers arrived on scene, located the vehicle in question and observed several areas of the vehicle effected by gunshot. There was a broken liquor bottle on the hood of the vehicle & Officers recovered spent shell casings near the vehicle. There were no persons or victims located in the area. Officers contacted the owner of the vehicle and he stated that the damage to his vehicle was new damage. He believes the person responsible is his ex-girlfriend who has been calling him lately and he hasn't been answering her.

A neighbor, witness advised he saw a B/F with long black hair and a pink jogging suit approaching victim's porch. He observed an Older Model Gold SUV parked by where Officers recovered the spent shell casings. Witness stated the female noticed him and walked back to the car. Witness stepped back into his apartment, at which point he heard four to five gunshots and a car screeching its tires.

Witness did not see who shot at victim's vehicle. Suspect has been identified and incident is under

- Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.
- Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They
