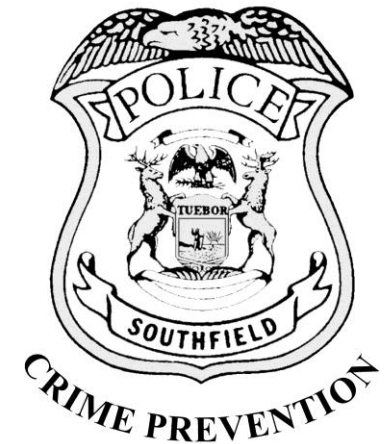
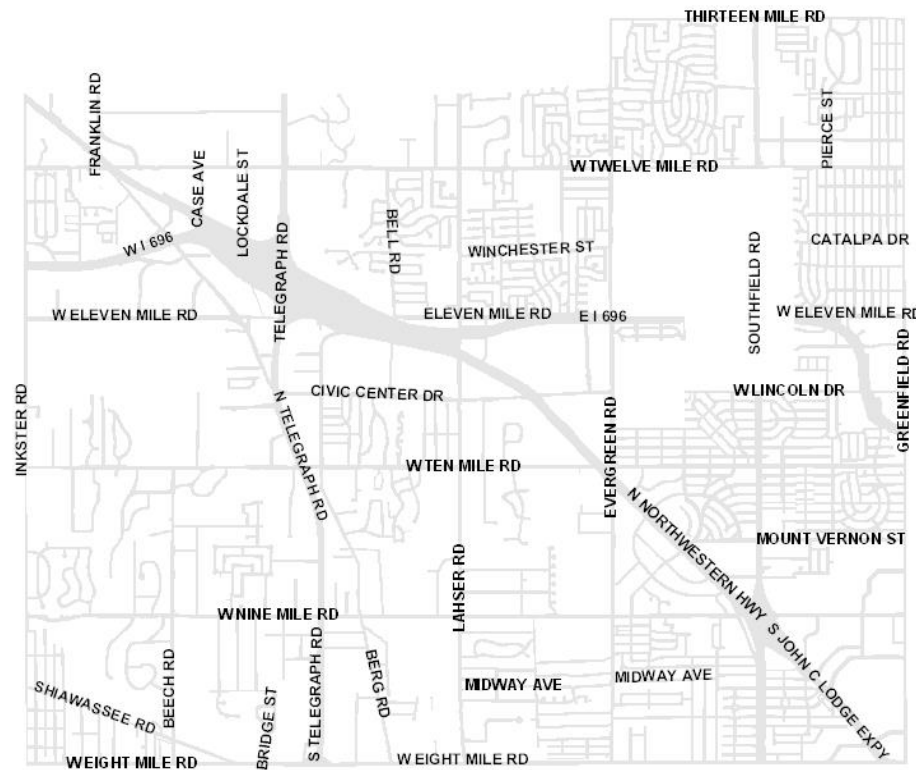

07/13/2021 8:26pm	28000 Franklin River Dr. (Apartments)	Apartment door was forced open.	<p>On 07/13/2021 Officers were dispatched to the 28000 Block of Franklin River Dr. (Apartment Complex) for a Home Invasion. The R/P, reported that he received a phone call from his ex-girlfriend stating she just broke into his apartment. R/P's niece & nephews were in his car and heard the statement.</p> <p>R/P states he also received a text message from his ex-girlfriend stating, "I know you're gonna call the police and tell them that I am the one who kicked in your door, which is fine because I already have a ton of warrants."</p> <p>R/P emphasized to Officers that suspect does not and has never lived at his residence. They had a previous dating relationship which ended back in 2016. Suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.</p>

07/16/2021 12:03pm	15000 Stone Crossing (Apartments)	Apartment door was forced open.	<p>On 07/16/2021 Officers were dispatched to a Home Invasion that had just occurred in the 15000 Block of Stone Crossing Drive. The known female suspect was discovered in the act by the R/P. The female subject fled the scene in a Blue Jeep.</p> <p>Officers spoke to the R/P. He stated that he had returned home on 07/16/2021 at approx. 11:00am. He found his front door wide open. He entered his residence and discovered his (ex-girlfriend), inside of his residence. She saw him, and ran down the stairs toward the front door. In the process of running down the stairs, she dropped her cell phone.</p> <p>The apartment had been ransacked and several articles of clothing are missing.</p> <p>A short time later, the female suspect returned and demanded her cell phone back.</p> <p>Evidence suggested that the female committed Home Invasion. Several items belonging to R/P were in the suspect's vehicle. They were recovered and the female suspect was taken into custody for Home Invasion.</p>

The vehicle's rear passenger window was broken out, the front passenger seat back was lowered and the front passenger lower dash panel was pulled down exposing wires and connectors. When the owner of the vehicle went to Towing Company where the vehicle was being held to pick up his vehicle he discovered that someone had already picked up the vehicle.</p> <p>Follow up investigation by Detectives revealed that the suspect who they believe originally stole the vehicle came into the Southfield Records Bureau and provided fraudulent identification indicating he was the owner of the vehicle and received the release form for the vehicle. The suspect then went to the Towing facility where the vehicle was being held and got the vehicle. Follow up investigation revealed that the fake driver's license had the owners name but everything else including the picture was not the owner. It was later discovered that the picture on the fraudulent ID was the actual suspect.</p> <p>Detectives developed a suspect in this incident and a photo show was presented to witness at the police records bureau and the towing company. Both witnesses picked out the suspect. This case was presented to the OCPO for complaint and warrant.</p>

He observed an unoccupied Dodge Charger Scat Pack with an Ohio License Plate in the south end of the lot. The license plate was only attached by one bolt. The plate came back registered to a 2015 Jeep. (Improper) The Vin# on the vehicle came back as a Stolen Vehicle out of Rochester, Michigan. The license plate on the vehicle was confiscated and the vehicle was recovered.</p> <p>Note: Officers responded back to the Hotel after the front desk clerk called PD to report that a subject came to the front desk saying his Dodge Charger Scat Pack was stolen and he wanted to review their surveillance video. Officers located this subject and his female friend at the hotel. The male subject was on his cell phone when Officers asked him if he was at the front desk asking about his missing vehicle. The subject stated no and then Officers could hear the person on the other end of the phone say, “What the F you go to the front desk for?” Both the male & female were uncooperative and denied any knowledge of the stolen vehicle. <p>Special Attention: Shooting/ Fleeing & Eluding/ Recovered Stolen Vehicle</p> <p>07/12/2021 11:49am</p> <p>27000 Block of Franklin Rd.</p> <p>On 07/12/2021 TCSU Officers broadcasted that they had just heard numerous gunshots in the 27000 Block of Franklin Rd. Additionally, TCSU Officers were following a Black Lincoln SUV and a Black Ram PU Truck. TCSU Officers advised that the window of the Black Lincoln SUV appeared to be shot out. Patrol Officers in fully marked Police Vehicles attempted to stop the vehicle on S/B M-10 & 8 Mile Rd. The vehicle fled from them and continued S/B on M-10. The vehicle exited the freeway and Officers lost sight of the vehicle near Mt. Elliot & I-94. The suspect vehicle is a Black Ram 1500, with an unreadable temporary tag in the top left corner of the rear window. There was no metal license plate attached to the vehicle. The vehicle was occupied by two subjects. The subject in the rear seat was reaching around the cabin of the pickup truck throughout the duration of the vehicle pursuit. TCSU later located the suspect vehicle unoccupied. shooting had occurred. Additionally, it was reported that a subject was admitted into the hospital in Southfield with a gunshot wound, stemming from this incident.

The Dodge Ram returned as stolen vehicle out of Detroit on 07/04/21. There were spent rifle casings in the vehicle and there was also a bullet hole through the passenger side mirror.

Detectives responded to the hospital and interviewed the shooting victim.

The victim was identified and he was suffering from two gunshot wounds. He advised that he did not know who shot him. He wasn't forthcoming with any information!

It was discovered that the victim had an injunctive order with the protected address in the 27000 Block of Franklin. There was a previous Domestic Assault Arrest at the listed residence.

Officers responded to this residence and there was evidence of a shooting. Blood was located outside the door of the apartment. A neighbor advised there was a bullet hole in his child's bedroom window.

Officers observed bullet holes in the neighbor's window and in the bricks adjacent to the window.

No one was injured!

Southfield Police Evidence Technicians processed the scene and processed the recovered stolen vehicle.

Investigation is on-going.

Domestic F/A- 1- Arrest

07/14/2021 6:46am

21000 Block of Virginia St.

On 07/14/2021 several Officers responded to the 21000 Block of Virginia St. on a report of a Domestic Assault. The caller stated his girlfriend had kicked in the bedroom door resulting in the injury of his 11-year-old daughter.

Officers arrived on scene, located the parties involved, separated them and began interviewing them. The female suspect was irate and refused to answer any questions.

R/P advised he came home from work and the female suspect was with a female friend that he didn't know. He suspected they had been smoking crack cocaine. The female suspect asked R/P for \$40.00 which he refused. The female went crazy and kicked open his bedroom door causing the door to swing open and hit his daughter in the hand.

The daughter didn't appear to be hurt seriously but was crying. When R/P closed his bedroom door the female suspect got a knife from the kitchen and stabbed the bedroom door several times. One of the stabs appeared to have gone through the hollow core door.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician recovered the knife.

The female was taken into custody for Domestic F/A.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. **25000 Block of W Twelve Mile Rd.
(Apartments)**

On 07/14/2021 Officers were dispatched to the 25000 Block of W Twelve Mile Rd. for a report of a possible Domestic Assault.

R/P reported her friend was physically beaten by her boyfriend and needed medical attention.

Officers contacted the R/P and victim in a vehicle parked outside.

Officers were informed that the suspect was still inside the residence with his daughter and their son.

Officers observed a visible bite mark on victim's right forearm. Officers also observed swelling to victim's forehead above her right eye and a red mark on the right side of her neck. Victim was complaining of head pain and pain to her left leg. Southfield Life treated victim. She did not want to go to the hospital.

Victim told Officers that suspect choked her to the point she blacked out. She thought she was going to die.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician took photos of victim's injuries. The male suspect was taken into custody for Domestic Assault GBH. Southfield Detective presented case and swore to Domestic Assault GBH Warrant.

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

F/A / Attempt Murder/ Stolen Property/ CCW- 1-Arrest

07/17/2021 6:16pm

Greenfield Rd. & W Twelve Mile Rd.

On 07/17/2021, Southfield Officers were dispatched to 12 Mile and Greenfield for the report of an armed subject. The R/P stated there was a W/M, wearing a baby blue t-shirt waving around a gun at the bus stop.

Officers arrived into the area and observed a bus with passengers inside. Officers contacted the bus driver, who pointed out the person that Officers were looking for. Officers located the suspect and gave verbal instructions to get on the ground and lay face down. The suspect started to lower his hands towards his lap. Officers gave the suspect more verbal instructions and the suspect did not comply.

Officers grabbed onto the suspects arm to gain control of him.

A passenger told Officers the subject had a gun in a black bag by his feet. Officers grabbed the bag and the subject was handcuffed, secured and removed from the bus.

Further investigation revealed that prior to Officers arrival the suspect pointed a handgun at two different persons and pulled the trigger several times while at the bus stop. He then asked the victims to commit a Robbery with him at the nearby Walgreens. The handgun that was recovered in suspects bag was reported stolen out of Lathrup Village. Lathrup PD advised it had just been stolen about an hour earlier and the gun was loaded at the time it was taken. One unspent round was located at the bus stop.

Further information was obtained that when the suspect got on the bus he pointed the gun at several passengers, pulled the slide back & pulled the trigger several times! The handgun was unloaded when Officers recovered it. The suspect was taken into custody.

Nobody was injured during this incident!!!
