**(Commercial- Hookah Lounge)**

On 07/20/20 at 12:50am Officers were dispatched to Hookah Lounge, located in the 28000 Block of Northwestern, for a shooting that had occurred.

Officer arrived on scene and contacted subject who had a gunshot wound that didn't appear to be life threatening. The victim was not originally on scene when Officers had arrived. The victim walked back to the scene of the shooting approx. 15 minutes after Officers arrived. He was treated by paramedics.

Victim initially told Officers that there was an argument and a shooting between individuals that he did not know while he was in the parking lot. He stated that he had gotten shot so he ran from the scene but later came back? The victim was transported to Hospital for treatment.

A witness stated she saw several persons from the bar with guns. Numerous spent shell casings were recovered at the scene.

Numerous persons were interviewed but were uncooperative in the investigation.

Incident is under further investigation.

**Retail Fraud/ Felonious Assault/ Obstruct Police- 2- Arrests**

**(Home Goods Business)**

Original incident involved male and female suspects. When confronted by two security persons from business the male suspect pulled out a knife and threatened them with it. The suspects fled the store with the stolen merchandise prior to Officers arriving.

On 07/28/2020, after reviewing photos of suspects from business, Officer did Clemis Picture link search and was able to positively identify the suspect with the pictures from business.

A Southfield Detective put together photo show with suspect and showed it to the two security persons from business. Both positively identified the male suspect that took items from the store and pulled a knife on them when they confronted him.

Southfield Police TCSU Officers investigated further and located the suspect's vehicle. The vehicle became occupied and Officers followed the vehicle to a location in Detroit. The suspect was taken into custody w/o incident and was found to have a knife in each pant pocket which were taken as evidence. The female passenger in the suspect vehicle was identified as the second suspect from the original Retail Fraud at business in Southfield. She was identified and released pending investigation due to her having a child with her in the vehicle.

Officers also recovered a Stun Gun on driver's side dashboard which was placed into Southfield Property.

The male suspect was transported to the Southfield Jail and lodged.

## **Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles**

### **How to prevent this from happening to you!**

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. ## **A&B/ Resisting Arrest/ Disorderly Conduct**

### **(Hotel)**

On 07/24/2020 at 2:08am Officers were dispatched to the 26000 Block of Telegraph Rd. (Hotel) reference a disturbance in the parking lot between two males.

Officers arrived and met with combatants. Officers had to separate the combatants several times. One of the combatants was highly intoxicated and refused Officers direction multiple times. He eventually went back to his room and his boyfriend left the area. Officers cleared the scene.

At 2:28am Officers were dispatched back to the Hotel regarding a B/M acting disorderly in the lobby. The description of the male matched that of the suspect that was intoxicated and disorderly on earlier run. Officers arrived and observed subject from earlier run standing outside the front doors of the hotel screaming and being disorderly. The subject spotted Officers and began walking towards them. It was later, discovered that the suspect had damaged a sign holder in the hotel lobby as well.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician took photos of Officers injuries and the damaged sign in the lobby.

The suspect was transported to the Southfield Jail and lodged.
