


Officer observed the frame bent and the exterior pane glass broken on the kitchen window. The screen had also been removed from the window. The screen on the dining room window had also been removed. Doesn't appear that entry was made. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene.

No signs of forced entry and unknown if anything was taken. (Several other vehicles in the area were gone through)</p> <p>A Southfield Police K-9 Tracked to 9 mile & Beech and ended at a gas station on the corner.</p> <p>While searching the area Officers observed two black male subjects riding bikes south on Nancy Ave. They were both stopped and identified. One of the female's ex-boyfriend called her and threatened to come to the hotel and assault them and kill them. The two females advised the front desk and security of the situation. When they were attempting to leave the Hotel from the main lobby the suspect entered the main lobby and assaulted his ex-girlfriend. When her friend intervened, he assaulted her as well. The suspect then fled the hotel. It was later discovered that the suspect stole his ex-girlfriend's keys to her 2019 Dodge Durango and busted out the rear window of the other females 2018 Chevy Malibu that was parked in the parking lot. Be on the Look Out Highlights:	Arrests by SPD Officers:
<p>Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!) - If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage. - Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock. -After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels. -If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible. -If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and 	<p>Disorderly/ Resist & Obstruct Police Officer- 1- Arrest 07/29/2020 11:26am 16000 Block of Nine Mile Rd. (Hospital) A male subject refused to wear a mask when attempting to visit a patient in the hospital. When told he needed to wear a mask the subject pushed past security and began a physical altercation. The subject resisted Officers as they were investigating and had to be restrained due to his hostility. Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Officers responded to the 22000 Block of London Ct. on a report of a stalking complaint. R/P states that she is a social media personality and the suspect has been stalking her through various forms of media.

Our Department is familiar with the R/P and has a current investigation involving this suspect. The R/P and her friends observed the suspect peering through her window. Friends of the victim pursued and detained the suspect until the Police arrived.

The suspect resides in another state. Contact was made with the Southfield Detective in charge of the pending case who advised that there is credible history of Aggravated Stalking. The suspect was arrested and lodged.
