Incident#1- R/P stated he heard his car alarm going off and when he went outside he observed his vehicle on fire. He attempted to put out the fire with a neighbor's garden hose with no success. R/P's female friend who is the owner of the house believes it was her ex-boyfriend. They broke up back in October 2020 and he hasn't taken the brake up well. He suffers from mental illness and drinks a lot. He has shown up unannounced several times recently. R/P states she has a PPO against him but he hasn't been served yet. The Southfield Fire Dept. was on scene investigating the cause of the fire.

Incident#2 Officers responded to the same residence on 06/15/2021 at 1:14am for a reported vehicle on fire in the driveway again. Dispatch stated neighbors called in the vehicle fire and this was the same residence where a vehicle was suspected to be set on fire earlier in the day.

Officer arrived on scene at the same time as FD. He observed a White Chevrolet Malibu with the whole front end engulfed in flames. It was confirmed that this is the same vehicle that was burned earlier in the day.

Incident#3 Before Incident#2 report was finalized, Officers were dispatched back to the same residence at 2:59am. The R/P saw her ex-boyfriend on her ring doorbell setting the vehicle on fire again. (3rd Time) R/P saw her ex-boyfriend walk away on foot, via ring doorbell, and believed he was still in the area. Officers arrived in the area and located the suspects Toyota. When Officers located the vehicle, the driver made evasive maneuvers to avoid Officers and fled. Officers pursued vehicle, lights & siren to the area of S/B Telegraph near 7 Mile Rd. where the pursuit was terminated.

Follow Up Investigation:

Southfield Detectives located suspect's vehicle parked in front of residence in Detroit. The Black Toyota Rav4 was parked in front of the residence unoccupied. The vehicle was impounded as evidence. Investigation is on-going.

Red River Dr. & Goldwin St.

Officer was on patrol in unmarked Southfield Police vehicle when he located a stolen vehicle in the driveway of residence in the 19000 Block of Goldwin. Officer alerted other Southfield units in the area. Priority radio traffic was given as the vehicle began moving forward onto Red River towards Goldwin.

A second Officer arrived on scene and the two Officers placed their patrol vehicles side-by-side on Red River to prevent the vehicle from fleeing. Officer exited his patrol car and began to approach the suspect from the passenger side. Officer gave several loud verbal commands to stop the car. The driver put the car in reverse and began fleeing from Officers. The driver then accelerated forward into the ditch.

The vehicle became immobilized in the ditch but the driver continued to push down on the accelerator. To prevent the driver from fleeing, Officer used his window punch to break the passenger side glass of the vehicle. Other Officers were approaching the vehicle when the driver fled the car on foot. Officers pursued the suspect and took him into custody. He resisted Officers as they attempted to handcuff him.

A syringe was located under the suspect after they lifted him up from the ground. There was a second syringe located by the driver's door of the stolen vehicle. After the driver was apprehended he told Officers that he had swallowed heroin and taken heroin earlier in the day. The suspect lied about his identity and about who the owner of the stolen vehicle was. The suspect was conveyed to the Southfield Jail.

(Hotel)

On 06/14/2021, Officers were dispatched to the 26000 Block of Central Park Blvd. (Hotel) for a MDOP report. The manager states the suspect checked in on 06/10/2021 and was staying in one of their rooms. Suspect wanted to add an extra day to his stay on 06/13/2021 and was upset that the sheets had been changed by housekeeping because they assumed he had checked out. Suspect was also upset because he was not getting his security deposit back because he smoked marijuana in the room.

After the suspect left they discovered damage to the room. There was a large bend in the back frame of the sofa, slash marks throughout the Bed Mattress, and the television was stabbed several times. The knife was left in the television, stabbed through the security deposit slip. Suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

- Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.
