



Passenger was seen getting out of the Mazda, and cutting off 2 Catalytic Converters from Ford Econoline Vans.

Passenger Description: Light skinned black male, 18-25 years old, slim build, white t-shirt. Unclear if suspect has blond and red hair or if he is wearing yellow and red.



#### MDOP/ Narcotics Paraphernalia/ Marijuana Sell/ Attempt Escape Flight/ CCW Motor Vehicle-1- Arrest 06/08/2021 6:00pm 29000 Block of Northwestern Hwy Officer was on routine patrol in the 29000 Block of Northwestern when he observed a Green 2011 Dodge Challenger commit several traffic violations including expired plates and no insurance. A traffic stop was made on the vehicle and the vehicle stopped. Contact was made with the driver. During contact with the driver it was discovered that there was a handgun in the glove box. The driver is a convicted felon. A second Officer arrived on scene and the handgun was recovered from the glovebox. There was also suspected marijuana located in the glove box and throughout the vehicle. A Nike Backpack was located that contained a scale and a bible that was hollowed out with a hidden compartment that contained a sum of cash. The subject was taken into custody. While in route to the station the suspect slipped out of one of his handcuffs and he attempted to escape the patrol vehicle by hitting and kicking the back window off its track. Officers pulled into the underground security garage and told the suspect to stop numerous times or he would be tased. Officers pulled the suspect from the police vehicle and handcuffed him again. The suspect made a statement to Officers. "I should have taken you on a high-speed chase and threw that gun." The suspect was walked into the Southfield Jail and placed into the BMU due to his behavior.



#### Special Attention: Overdose/ Life Saving! 8:06pm 29000 Block of Southfield Rd.

#### (Gas Station)

Officers were dispatched to a male that was unresponsive inside a vehicle. Upon arrival, Officers found a male not breathing and unresponsive. Four doses of Narcan were administered by Lathrup PD, Southfield Officers, and Life Support personnel. The male became conscious and alert. He was transported to an area hospital for treatment.

### Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can.
