R/P came into the front desk to make report.
R/P stated male suspect who she has been dating for approx. 3 years, one child in common came to her residence unannounced and confronted her in the parking lot. He assaulted her and took her handgun from her which was holstered on her side. R/P attempted to hand off the handgun to a female friend and that was when her boyfriend snatched the gun.
The boyfriend then fled the area in a silver sedan with tinted windows, possibly a Nissan.
The suspect has been identified and Investigation is on-going.

Tips:

- ❖ Always be aware of your surroundings and report suspicious incidents or persons to your local police

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

Weapons Offense- 1- Arrest

Officers were dispatched to the 16000 Block of W Nine Mile Rd. (Apartments) for a disturbance. Dispatch stated a male and female were fighting in the parking lot in front of the building.

Officer arrived on-scene and located the female half.

Officer activated his overhead lights and identified himself as a Police Officer. The female stated, "You're not the Police" and kept walking. Officer noted that the female's speech was slurred and she appeared to be intoxicated. She eventually stopped walking and spoke to Officers.

The female placed the items she was carrying on the trunk of Officers vehicle. She gave Officers permission to search her belongings.

Officers located a functioning Taser. The female did not have a valid CPL. The female continued be belligerent and refused to answer any further questions. She was taken into custody for having Possession of a Functioning Taser.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.

Arson/ A&B- 1- Arrest

(Condo's)

Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Lahser Rd. for a report of a Domestic Assault that occurred on 05/29/2021. Officers were advised by Southfield Dispatch that Southfield Fire was on scene at the location when the homeowner arrived and informed them that her husband assaulted her the previous night.

Further investigation by Officers they discovered that the female R/P was in fact assaulted earlier in the evening. R/P had visual abrasions on her chest. R/P left the Condo Unit and went to a friend's place for the evening.

The following day R/P called her neighbor. She was informed by her neighbor that there was a fire in her condo and that the Southfield Fire Department was on scene. Further investigation by Officers revealed that the suspect contacted one of victim's friends and made several threats to burning the apartment. This person was contacted and she played back several of suspect voicemails confirming the threats. Officers located suspect nearby in victims Tan Ford F-150. When he saw the Police, he parked the truck and started to walk away from the apartment complex to avoid Officers. Officers stopped the suspect and he was taken into custody after Officers completed their investigation. He was arrested for A&B & Arson.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Officers were dispatched to Hotel in the 22000 Block of Telegraph Road for a report of a male and female physically fighting inside a vehicle in the parking lot. Officers arrived on scene and observed a male and female fighting in the back seat of a Silver Dodge Stratus. Officers observed the male punching the female in the face and head numerous times. Both subjects were ordered to stop and exit the vehicle. Additional Officers arrived on scene and both subjects were interviewed. The male subject was taken into custody for Domestic Assault. While transporting the subject to the Southfield Jail he made an unsolicited statement that he had a bag of marijuana in his pocket. Officers asked the subject if he had anything else. He stated no. While being processed, staff in the jail searched the arrestee and recovered a bag of suspected marijuana and a corner tie of suspected cocaine. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested the suspected cocaine. It tested positive for possible presence of Cocaine. The suspect was charged with Domestic Assault & Possession of Cocaine.

Assault w/ Intent to Murder- 1- Arrest

Officers responded to an area hospital for a gunshot victim. The victim advised the incident took place in the parking lot of Shopping Center in the 28000 Block of Telegraph Rd. in Southfield. Officers responded to location and contacted the suspect and witnesses. The investigation revealed there was a verbal confrontation after a road rage incident. The disagreement resulted in suspect shooting victim in the stomach. The 54-year-old male victim was driven to the hospital. He was listed in serious condition. The Detective Bureau was notified and responded. The responding Officers and Detectives determined there was probable cause to arrest the male for Assault W/ Intent to Murder. The suspect was arrested and lodged. The scene was processed and the investigation is ongoing.
