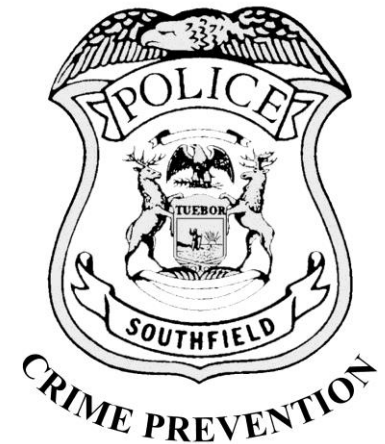
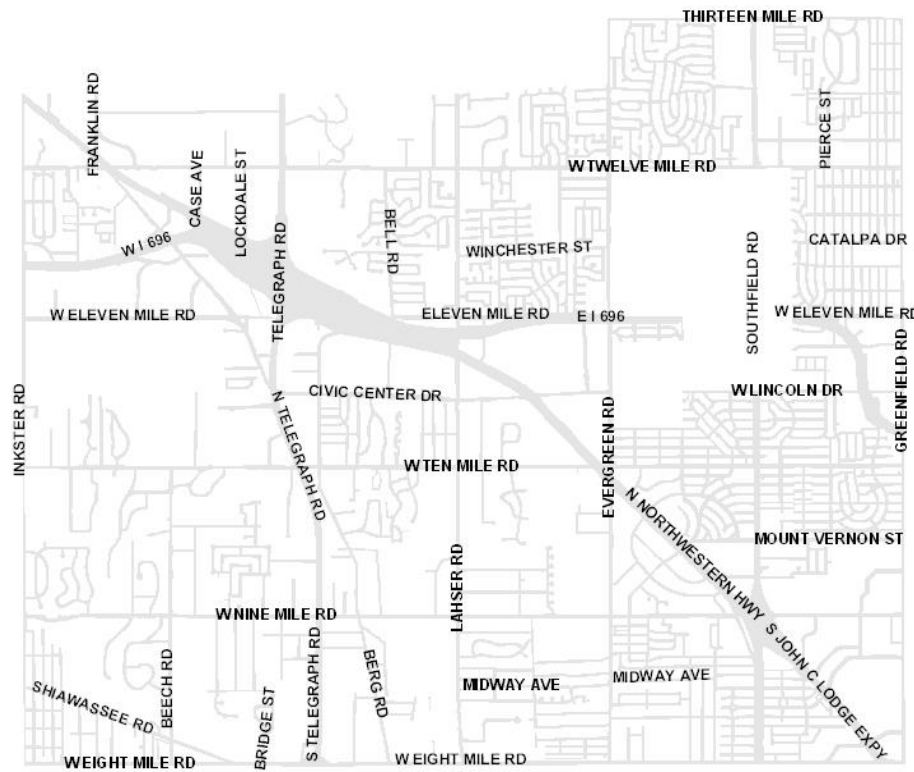

<p>Special Attention, Stabbing Investigation: From: 06/03/2021 4:00am To: 06/03/2021 4:30am 27000 Northwestern Hwy (Hotel) Officers were dispatched to Hospital in another jurisdiction on reports of a stabbing victim. The alleged stabbing reportedly occurred in the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy in Southfield. The victim was an adult male who was later identified. Officers interviewed the victim and confirmed that he had been stabbed at the Hotel in Southfield. The victim told Officers he was with a female that he only knew by her first name. Victim stated the female was being very loud and he asked her to leave the room. The female was upset and charged at victim and stabbed him with an unknown object one time in the left elbow as he raised his arms to defend himself. The victim was treated and released from the hospital. He went with Officers and Detectives to his hotel room and consented to a search of the hotel room. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and collected evidence. Several Officers and Detectives were also on scene. Victim stated he has been hanging out with the female suspect for about two months and has had an on-going sexual relationship with her.

Interview with witness indicates that the victim may have punched the female suspect in the face and that's why she stabbed him.

The male victim was not forthcoming with information about the female suspect and in the end stated he didn't want to prosecute her?

Investigation is on-going.

**28000 Block of Northwestern Hwy
(Fast Food Drive Thru)**

On 06/02/2021 Officers responded to a slumped driver in the 28000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. The driver was reclined in his vehicle and sleeping in the drive-thru at business. The vehicle came back stolen out of Canton. (2020 Hyundai Tucson)

Officers arrived on scene and observed the driver slumped behind the wheel. The vehicle was in drive and driver had his foot on the brake pedal. Officers positioned their fully marked patrol vehicles at the front and the rear of suspect vehicle to prevent the vehicle from fleeing.

Officers woke up the subject and told him to put the vehicle in park. The driver ignored Officers direction put the vehicle in reverse and slammed into the patrol vehicle behind him. He then went forward and slammed into patrol vehicle in front of him. The driver went back and forth several times attempting to flee. Officers broke out the window on vehicle and forcefully removed the driver from the vehicle.

He resisted Officers until they got him handcuffed and secured.

The vehicle was confirmed stolen and the subject was taken into custody. A Southfield Detective presented case to OCPO.

The suspect was charged with the following crimes:

Count #1: R&C Motor Vehicle, Count #2: MDOP to Police Vehicles (Felony), Count #3: R&O Officers, Count #4: DWLS

**26000 Block of Telegraph Rd.
(Hotel)**

Victim came into the front desk to report Domestic A&B/ Kidnapping. Victim told Desk Officer that she was at Hotel in Southfield with a male when her ex-boyfriend showed up at her room and disguised himself as staff and knocked on her door. When the male subject that was with victim opened the door, her ex-boyfriend forced his way into the room and started fighting with the other male.

Victim ran out of the room to get help.

The suspect caught up to her and grabbed her by her hair, started hitting her in the head with a closed fist. The suspect then "forced" her out of the hotel and to his vehicle, a Hyundai Elantra, red in color.

The suspect then drove victim to his house in Detroit where she was assaulted numerous times. Later the same day suspect forced victim back into his vehicle and drove her to his apartment in Southfield. Victim was assaulted again while at this location.

The suspect then forced her to take him to a car detailer in Detroit so her blood could be cleaned from the vehicle upholstery. Victim stated after arriving to the detailer, suspect allowed her to leave.

Note: There are several past Domestic Assaults involving the same two parties. The suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.

Domestic F/A- 1- Arrest

06/05/2021 4:10am

24000 McAllister St.

On 06/05/2021 at 4:10am, Officers were dispatched to the 24000 Block of McAllister reference a Domestic Dispute.

Officers arrived on scene and could hear the male half in an upstairs bedroom yelling at Southfield Police Dispatch.

The female half and her nephew were in the down stairs living room. Officers located them and they exited the residence for their safety.

It was believed that the male half had a firearm in his possession and was uncooperative in leaving his room. Officers called out to male half several times to exit the room but he wouldn't comply.

After several minutes he left the bedroom, walked into the living room where Officers could see him. He was ordered to show his hands and stay where he was. He complied and Officers placed him in handcuffs and searched him.

Further investigation revealed that the male half assaulted victim and a handgun was recovered from the scene. The handgun was reported stolen out of DPD. The male suspect was taken into custody for Domestic A&B/ Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (F/A) A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and recovered the handgun.

Note: This was the third time Officers were called to this residence on this date.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.
