



At 6:00am it was discovered that the business was broken into through the side drive thru window. Review of the store video revealed the following; 2:56am. Unknown light brown male starts forcing entry at the south side drive thru window with what appears to be a pry bar. Suspect enters through drive thru window at 2:58am. Suspect clothing: Black or dark knit cap w/ face mask, Puffy waist length jacket dark red top/ brown lower with brown sleeves, light gray hoodie worn under outer jacket, Black or dark pants and black shoes. The suspect is observed clearing drive thru cash drawer. The suspect then goes to drop safe attached to wire shelving unit and pries the safe from the shelving unit. The suspect exits the rear door with the safe and enters a waiting vehicle through the passenger side at 3:04am. The suspect vehicle appears to be an early 2000's Buick Century, White, 4D with a dent on the driver's front fender near the driver's door causing a larger gap at the lower part of the drivers door. The wheels are 10 spoke chrome finish and there is a black front plate template attached to the front bumper. The windows are clear w/o tint. An undisclosed amount of money was in the cash

B/M, wearing a dark hooded jacket entered business through the unlocked drive through window. The suspect then took cash from the registers and fled out the rear door. Per the manager the same suspect did the same thing last week. Surveillance video shows the suspect entering the drive through window. The suspect opens the cash drawer and takes the money. The suspect can be seen leaving out the rear exit door.
			The suspect has a hood over his head and face making it difficult to see any facial features. The manager stated that the same suspect broke into the business last week and took cash from the cash drawers. The manager stated the suspect was wearing the same jacket in last week's B&E.

From: 11/21/2019 8:00pm To: 11/22/2019 7:00am	24000 Greenfield Rd. (Commercial- Hair Company)	Entry through front door. Door Glass was broken out.	The cleaning company reportedly secured the business and activated the alarm at 8:00pm. Upon arrival, the following morning at 7:00am R/P discovered the break-in. The front steel frame glass entry door had the glass broken. R/P stated he had to disarm the alarm, however there were no alarm activations overnight? Investigation revealed that there was an attempt on the rear steel door by breaking the door handle. The dead bolt was engaged preventing entry. The rear of the building has no lighting; and the business has both exterior and interior surveillance cameras that were in operation. After the failed attempt on the rear (west) door entry was made on the front (east) door by breaking the glass with a pipe wrench that was left on scene near the entry. R/p Believes responsible is an employee. Incident is under investigation.

Special Attention: Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier. How to prevent this from happening to you! Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages. Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package. Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.	OWI/ Possession of Firearm While Intoxicated- 1- Arrest 11/17/2019 11:02pm Telegraph Rd. & W Nine Mile Rd. Officer stopped a vehicle for Traffic Violation. Upon interviewing the driver, it was discovered that she was intoxicated. The driver had a valid CPL and was in possession of a handgun. After sobriety tests were completed the driver was taken into custody for OWI. The driver refused to take breath test and she was taken to local Hospital for a blood draw.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

Leaving the Scene of Injury Accident- 1- Arrest 11/19/2019 3:57pm W Twelve Mile Rd. & Southfield Rd.

Officer was dispatched on a report of a Hit & Run Injury Traffic Crash. Upon arrival, Officers identified the driver that left the scene and located her vehicle at her residence in Southfield.

The driver was located and questioned why she left the scene. The driver advised Officers that someone pulled in front of her and hit her head on, then another vehicle began to chase her while recording her. This was contrary to what witnesses had told Officers. Officers investigation revealed that suspect rear ended another car and the car chasing suspect was doing so because she fled the scene and to get her license plate #. The subject was placed under arrest for Leaving the Scene of an Injury Accident.
