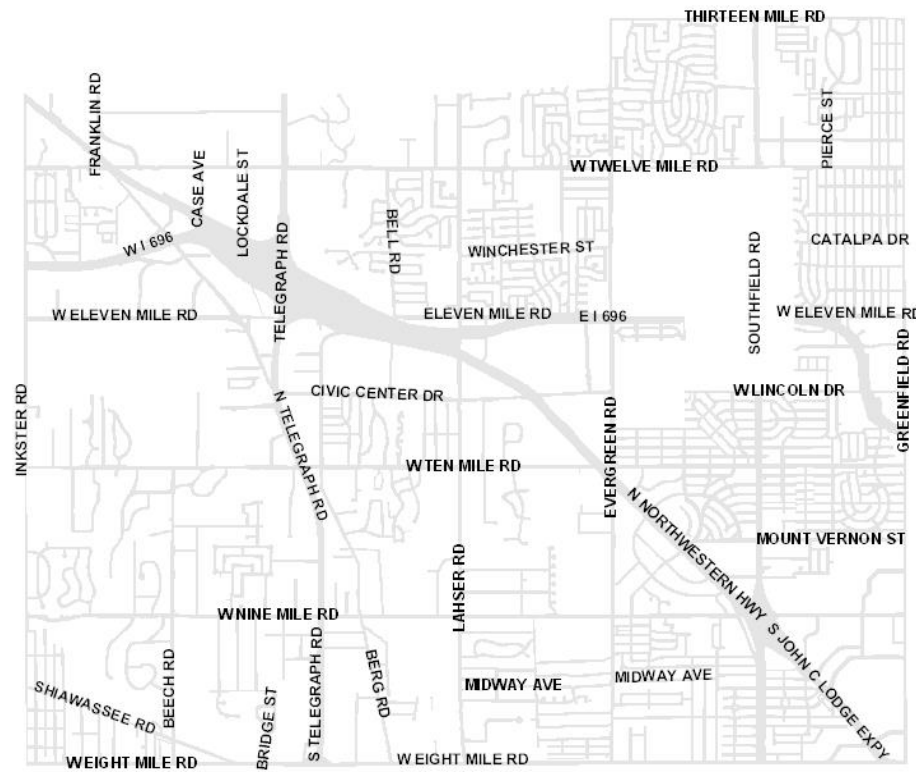

<p>11/26/2020 6:29pm</p>	<p>28000 Bell Rd.</p>	<p>Suspect(s) threw a log through the glass door wall.</p>	<p>Several Officers were dispatched to the 28000 Block of Bell Rd for a Home Invasion in progress. The homeowner came home and heard noises upstairs and realized someone was in his house. The homeowner yelled at suspect(s) to get out of his house. The suspects fled out an upstairs bedroom window. (Broke the window in doing so) R/P saw two B/M's, approx. 6'0"-6'3", medium build, LSW black knit hat, black shirt, and black pants running north through the grass towards Twyckingham Way. R/P got into his car and followed suspects and observed them getting into a Brown Ford F-150 Pick Up Truck. It was dark out and the vehicle fled w/o activating its head lights. When the suspect vehicle got to the corner of Brooks Ln. and Bell Rd. R/P saw a third suspect standing on the front lawn of a house on the S/E corner of Brooks Ln. & Bell Rd. It appeared this suspect was waving at the suspect vehicle to tell them to go on without him. (This suspect had the same description as the ones that R/P saw running from his home). The suspect vehicle left the suspect waving at them and fled the area. It appears that there may have been a total of three suspects involved in this Home Invasion. Officers cleared the R/P's residence for any other suspects and none were found. R/P walked through the home and found several items missing from the residence. MSP K-9 Unit arrived on scene and conducted a track for the third suspect. He was not located.</p>

On 11/25/2020, Officers were dispatched to Apartment Complex in the 25000 Block of Lahser Rd. for a possible Home Invasion & Domestic Assault. Investigation revealed there was no Home Invasion. The suspect had spent the night with R/P and his registered address was at location.

R/P advised that the two had gotten into a verbal argument. The argument became physical and the suspect choked her, knocked her to the floor, kicked her several times and hit her several times with a wooden chair. Victim got away from suspect at some point and called the police. The suspect fled the area in his Black Pontiac Grand Prix.

Victims Injuries: Left ring finger, right index finger, possible rug burns near left elbow, laceration of left ear, swelling on left side of face.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician took photos of victim's injuries. The suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.

Room. (Possible Robbery)**

11/24/2020 1:53pm

27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy

(Hotel)

Officers were dispatched to the Hotel in the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy, reference a suspicious incident. R/P called police to report that she and her sister walked by a room and heard a female screaming. When they looked inside the hotel room they observed a female tied up.

Officers arrived on scene and observed an Asian female who was later identified lying in bed. She was covered in blood, conscious and breathing. It was not readily apparent where her wounds were. She did not speak English. Officers located a Republic of China Passport belonging to victim in a blue backpack that was in the room.

Southfield Life Support Unit arrived on scene and attended to victim's injuries. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician photographed and collected evidence from the scene. Victim was transported to Hospital for treatment.

A witness that was on-scene stated that her sister was walking by the hotel room and observed victim all tied up. She immediately went and got a pair of scissors and cut all the zip-ties from victim. She left prior to Officers arrival because she had to get to work. The witness couldn't offer any other

26000 Block of Central Park Blvd.

(Hotel)

Officers were dispatched to Hotel in the 26000 Block of Central Park Blvd. regarding a tenant making threats to kill the hotel clerk. Officer arrived on scene and located suspect and R/P (maintenance worker). The maintenance worker advised that the suspect was armed with a handgun. Officer held the suspect at gunpoint until additional Officers arrived on scene. Officers retrieved a loaded handgun from suspects coat pocket and he was secured while Officers investigated further. The suspect stated the handgun was his and he had a permit. Investigation revealed that the suspect was unhappy because he was being charged a late fee because he checked out late. The hotel clerk stated that the suspect stated if he didn't get his deposit back he would come back and kill her. The maintenance worker intervened and asked why he would threaten the clerk when she was only doing her job. The suspect then unzipped his coat showing maintenance worker he had a gun. The maintenance worker could see the magazine and butt of a handgun. The suspect never made any threats with the gun. Officers discovered that the suspect didn't have a CPL, (permit to carry) and he was taken into custody for CCW.

While Officers were on-scene a male showed up and advised Officers that he was notified by a friend of victims that she was robbed and asked that he check on her welfare. The male subject advised that he was familiar with the victim but wasn't a close friend of hers. No further details from victim due to her condition. Detectives were notified and investigation is on-going.

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

W Nine Mile Rd. & Evergreen Rd.

Officers were dispatched to Evergreen Rd. and Nine Mile Rd, on a report of subject sleeping behind the wheel of a Dark Colored Sedan. Officer's arrived on scene and observed a Black GMC Terrain in the N/B lane of Evergreen Rd, just south of Nine Mile Rd. Officers observed a small child in the back seat and a subject in the driver's seat that appeared to be sleeping. The vehicle was running, still in drive and the driver had his foot on the brake pedal. Officer's attempted numerous times to wake the driver up by knocking on the window. When the driver finally woke up, he rolled down the driver's side window and Officers could smell a strong odor of intoxicants coming from his person. The subject's speech was extremely slurred while speaking with Officers.

Further investigation, sobriety tests and PBT indicated the driver was under the influence of alcohol. The driver was taken into custody for OWI and Child Endangerment due to having a one- year old child in the vehicle. Officers located a handgun under the front seat during the vehicle inventory. The driver doesn't have a CPL. Additional charge of CCW.

-Note: Most recently on Monday 11/23/2020 during the early morning hours, surveillance video shows at 6:33am a White Dodge Ram 2500 4 door enters the parking lot at hotel in the 26000 Block of American Dr. and drives slowly past a Chevy Malibu and then pulls into frame next to a Dodge Caravan. The driver (B/M wearing a black winter coat with a hood) exits the suspect vehicle and uses a flashlight to look in the windows of the Caravan. He then gets back into the truck and drives over near the Chevy Malibu.

The suspects cannot be physically seen while breaking the window on the Chevy Malibu. Two suspects can eventually be seen with flashlights inside of the Malibu, before getting back into the White Ram 2500 and leaving the parking lot.

Note: Its believed that the same suspects and vehicle were responsible for LFA the same morning as incident at Hotel at business located in the 22000 Block of Telegraph Rd.

Officers were dispatched to the 25000 Block of Shiawassee Rd. (Apartments) to investigate possible Domestic.

Officers located the combatants and interviewed them. It was discovered that the male half was driving on 8 Mile Rd. They were both verbally arguing when the female in the back seat slapped him upside the head while he was driving.

The male stopped the car and pulled into parking lot in the 19000 Block of Eight Mile Rd. He got out of the car, went into the back seat and assaulted the female numerous times. The female stated he choked her to the point she couldn't breathe. The females neck was red and there was bruising and scratches.

The male was taken into custody for Domestic F/A.

Domestic Assault/ FTD (Fraud)- 1- Arrest

11/24/2020 8:49pm

17000 Block of Stratford Dr.

Officers were dispatched to the 17000 Block of Stratford Dr. for a Domestic Assault that just occurred. Officers arrived on scene and interviewed both the combatants. Officers investigation led to the arrest of the male half for Domestic A&B. During the inventory of suspects backpack Officers located a large amount of cash. Also located in his backpack were numerous ID's with suspects name on them. Some of the ID's were from Kansas and Arizona. All the ID's had suspects photograph on them but had different names and were fraudulent ID's. There were several receipts found in the backpack. The names on the receipts matched different names that were on the fake ID's with suspects photograph on them. There were also several debit/ credit cards located in the backpack that appeared to be fraudulent.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected the evidence and took photos of all the items.

Southfield Detective conducted follow up investigation and contacted one of the victims related to Bank Card in her name. It was discovered that the card is attached to her name and her social security number. Victim stated that she never opened this account and did not authorize anyone to use her information to open an account. Additional charge of FTA (Fraud).

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.
