



Officers contacted the victim who was waiting in the main lobby. Victim stated she left her room at approx. 6:30am this morning to go eat breakfast. Before leaving the room, she intentionally blocked the door from closing by putting the "door latch" out so her girlfriend would not need a room key to re-enter the room. While downstairs eating breakfast she stated she received a notification on her cell phone of a purchase at Wendy's on her debit card and a declined message from her "Cash App" application. She stated there was money withdrawn from her bank account. She went back up to her room and noticed her wallet was missing, along with multiple drawers being opened. Officers reviewed surveillance video showing suspect pulling on several doors on the second floor and then entering victim's notel room. The suspect is seen leaving victim's room at 7:15am. Further review of surveillance video shows the suspect leaving what is believed to be a room that he was staying in. Officers attempted contact at this room. There was no response at the door. A search warrant for the room was obtained. Before Officers entered the room, they announced their presence and advised they had a search warrant. There was still no response at the door. The manager attempted to unlock the door but

			the door had been disabled somehow and couldn't be entered. Officers forced entry into the room. Officers contacted subject who was in a bed. He matched the description of the suspect seen on the surveillance video entering victims room. Officers ordered suspect out of the bed. The subject cooperated and stood up for Officers. He was taken into custody and searched. While searching subject Officers located some narcotics paraphernalia and some suspected narcotics. While interacting with subject, he appeared to be under the influence of something. Suspect made admissions to using Heroin and Xanax last night and again this morning. He was taken into custody for B&E Hotel Room/ Fraudulent use of Credit Card/ Possession of Dangerous Drugs.

Special Attention: Fleeing & Eluding 10/28/2021 5:58pm Northwestern Hwy. & Evergreen Rd. (Hotel)

On 10/28/2021, Officer was on routine patrol at the at Northwestern & Evergreen Rd. (Hotel) when he observed a black, Chrysler 300, parked in the lot. This black Chrysler 300, bearing Michigan License Plate had dark tinted windows all around, except for the rear driver's side window. The vehicle was parked, backed into the first spot near the entrance.

Officer conducted a LEIN query on the plate, which returned as a stolen vehicle. Dispatch was notified of the stolen vehicle and its location. There was exhaust coming out of the tailpipe, and shortly after Officer pulled into the entrance to the hotel parking lot, the vehicle began to drive away toward Northwestern Highway.

Officer activated his overhead emergency lights in his fully-marked Police vehicle and activated his siren to signal the driver to stop the vehicle. The driver disregarded his visual and audible signal to stop the vehicle and fled from Officer. The vehicle continued to flee until the pursuit was terminated on S/B Southfield Freeway at 8 Mile Rd. Because of the tinted windows Officer was unable to view any occupants in the vehicle. Investigation is on-going.

Disorderly Conduct- 1- Arrest 10/31/2021 12:54pm 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy (Hotel)

On 10/31/2021, Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) for a trouble with subject. The manager at hotel reported an unknown female was possibly involved in a domestic dispute with an unknown male guest. The male guest checked out already and the female was still at the hotel causing a problem.

Officers arrived on scene. The female was yelling and swearing in the bathroom after she realized her boyfriend had left her.

An employee verified that the female was in the hotel lobby bathroom and advised that she could not remain on the property. She was bothering several of the guests and they were at the front desk complaining about her.

Officers contacted the female. She had locked herself in a stall in the female's bathroom near the lobby. She was screaming and refused to come out of the bathroom. Officers gave warning that if she didn't come out and leave the property she would be arrested. The female stated she didn't care and she had rights to be on public property and Officers had no right to be in the female's bathroom. After several minute's the female came out but then she turned around and tried to go back into the bathroom. Officers prevented her from doing so and she continued to scream and be disorderly in front of several patrons. The manager didn't wish to prosecute for Trespassing so Officers arrested the female for Disorderly Person. The suspect was placed in the back of Officers patrol vehicle and secured in a seatbelt. She unsecured the seatbelt and raised her feet to the window. She kicked the window 13 times with her left foot but did not cause any damage. Leg restraints were placed onto suspect

How to prevent this from happening to you!	was released pending investigation. She was issued Ord. Violation for Disorderly Conduct.
-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)	
 If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage. 	
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.	
-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.	
-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.	
-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with	

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box. **Special Attention:**

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
