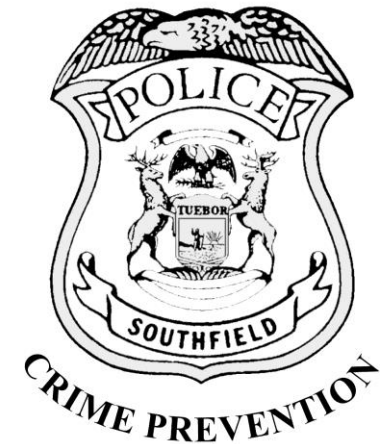
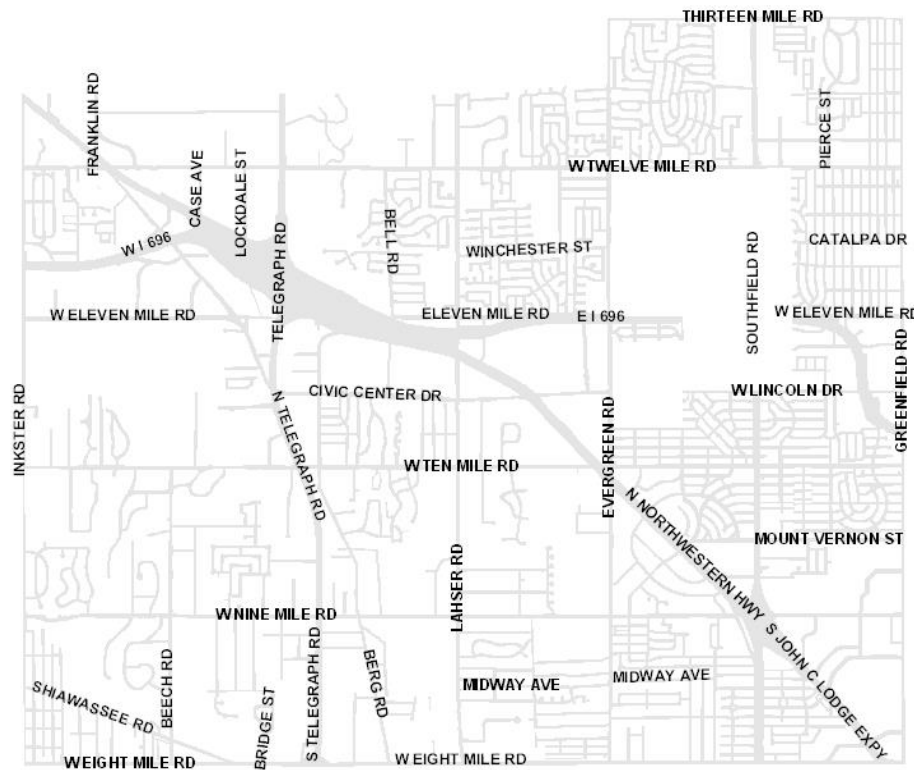

Greenfield Rd. & J L Hudson Dr.

Officers responded to Greenfield Rd. and J L Hudson Dr. for a reported injury accident. While in route to the accident Officer on scene advised the vehicle was unoccupied and another vehicle took the occupants to the Hospital.

Officer went to the hospital and spoke to the three occupants. They all were being treated for minor injuries, non-life threatening.

The driver was 19 years old, the front right passenger was 16 years old and there was a 10- month old in car seat in the back seat.

Officer at the accident scene advised over the radio that a gun was located on the front dashboard in the vehicle. Officer ran the gun and dispatch advised the gun was stolen out of Detroit.

Officer questioned the two older occupants that were in the vehicle and asked who the gun belonged to.

The 16- year old front passenger stated the gun belonged to him. He stated that he found the gun in a field in Dearborn. He stated he did not know the gun was stolen. The 16- year old was RPI'd and contact was made with his Grandmother who he lives with.

The Grandmother advised she would notify the juveniles mother.

27000 Block of Greenfield Rd.

(Apartment Complex)

On 10/28/2021, Officer along with other Southfield units, was dispatched to the 27000 Block of Greenfield Rd. (Apartment Complex), with two reports of shots heard. Both callers heard approx. 9 gunshots, believed to be coming from Apartment Complex.

Officer spoke to a citizen that advised he observed a red vehicle fleeing the scene, after hearing shots coming from the North-West corner of the complex. Officers investigating discovered three unoccupied vehicles that were hit with spent bullets. Spent shell casings and spent bullet & fragments were recovered from the scene. No victims were located and area hospitals were contacted regarding any gunshot victims at the hospitals. None were found.

OWI/ Disorderly Conduct

W Nine Mile Rd. & Northwestern Hwy.

On 10/27/2021 Officer was dispatched to the area of W Nine Mile Rd and Northwestern Hwy on a report of a two- car crash with an unresponsive passenger.

Officer arrived on scene and observed vehicle with heavy front end damage in the left eastbound lane of W Nine Mile Rd. Southfield Paramedics were on scene and had both occupants of the vehicle on the sidewalk south of the accident. The female passenger was transported to the hospital for treatment.

While speaking with the male driver Officer observed subject's speech to be mumbled and slurred. He had difficulty making eye contact and was staring off into the distance.

When asked what occurred regarding the crash, the driver did not wish to make a statement. He then denied being the driver of the vehicle. While asking about the crash, Officer could smell the odor of intoxicants on driver's breath.

He was asked to perform several sobriety tests of which he could not perform properly. He refused to submit to a PBT. He was arrested for OWI and was transported to hospital for blood test.

A search warrant was secured for the blood draw.

The subject became disorderly at the hospital and had to be restrained to complete the blood draw. The subject was then transported to the Southfield Jail where he was processed and lodged.

Special Attention: Fleeing & Eluding

**Northwestern Hwy. & Evergreen Rd.
(Hotel)**

On 10/28/2021, Officer was on routine patrol at the at Northwestern & Evergreen Rd. (Hotel) when he observed a black, Chrysler 300, parked in the lot. This black Chrysler 300, bearing Michigan License Plate had dark tinted windows all around, except for the rear driver's side window. The vehicle was parked, backed into the first spot near the entrance.

Officer conducted a LEIN query on the plate, which returned as a stolen vehicle. Dispatch was notified of the stolen vehicle and its location. There was exhaust coming out of the tailpipe, and shortly after Officer pulled into the entrance to the hotel parking lot, the vehicle began to drive away toward Northwestern Highway.

Officer activated his overhead emergency lights in his fully-marked Police vehicle and activated his siren to signal the driver to stop the vehicle. The driver disregarded his visual and audible signal to stop the vehicle and fled from Officer. The vehicle continued to flee until the pursuit was terminated on S/B Southfield Freeway at 8 Mile Rd. Because of the tinted windows Officer was unable to view any occupants in the vehicle. Investigation is on-going.

Disorderly Conduct- 1- Arrest

**27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy
(Hotel)**

On 10/31/2021, Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) for a trouble with subject. The manager at hotel reported an unknown female was possibly involved in a domestic dispute with an unknown male guest. The male guest checked out already and the female was still at the hotel causing a problem.

Officers arrived on scene. The female was yelling and swearing in the bathroom after she realized her boyfriend had left her.

An employee verified that the female was in the hotel lobby bathroom and advised that she could not remain on the property. She was bothering several of the guests and they were at the front desk complaining about her.

Officers contacted the female. She had locked herself in a stall in the female's bathroom near the lobby. She was screaming and refused to come out of the bathroom. Officers gave warning that if she didn't come out and leave the property she would be arrested. The female stated she didn't care and she had rights to be on public property and Officers had no right to be in the female's bathroom.

After several minute's the female came out but then she turned around and tried to go back into the bathroom. Officers prevented her from doing so and she continued to scream and be disorderly in front of several patrons. The manager didn't wish to prosecute for Trespassing so Officers arrested the female for Disorderly Person. The suspect was placed in the back of Officers patrol vehicle and secured in a seatbelt. She unsecured the seatbelt and raised her feet to the window. She kicked the window 13 times with her left foot but did not cause any damage. Leg restraints were placed onto suspect

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with

for transport. The female was transported to Hospital for a detox and was released pending investigation. She was issued Ord. Violation for Disorderly Conduct.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

-Citizens should always be mindful not to leave anything of value in their vehicles. Especially wallets, purses, cash, handguns, cell phones, laptops, jewelry, or anything else of value. If you must leave your handgun in your vehicle it should be kept in a gun lock box that is bolted down in the trunk of the vehicle. At the very least you should try to hide the handgun somewhere that it would be difficult to find. The first place that criminals will look is under the front seat, in the center console or in the glove box.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
