


Officers were dispatched to the 21000 Block of Lasher Rd. (Country Club) at 4:53am for a report of a B&E. Dispatch advised the R/P stated there was an intruder wearing a grey hoodie inside of the maintenance building. Supervisor from Country Club advises he observed on video at 09/15/2020 at 4:53am a male wearing a gray hoodie making entry into the maintenance shed of the Country Club. R/P believes the male to be a former employee. The employee was fired recently for driving recklessly on a golf court and other reasons. R/P advised that nothing was taken but it appeared the suspect had moved a John Deere Golf Court attempting to drive it out of the garage. Suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.

R/P's ex-boyfriend had picked her apartment door lock to enter apartment and assaulted her while she was asleep. Victim stated that her ex-boyfriend choked her until she almost passed out. He let go of her and left the apartment. R/P and suspect have children in common but don't live together. They stopped dating back in 2018. Note: Officers have been out previously when R/P reported she believed her ex-boyfriend had made a key for her apartment. Suspect has been identified and incident is under investigation.

09/18/2020 4:46am (Entry w/o Permission & Larceny)	26000 Berg Rd. (Apartments)	Suspect entered victim's apartment w/o permission after she answered the knock at the door.	Officers were dispatched to the 26000 Block of Berg Rd on a Domestic Disturbance in progress. Information was given that the male half forced entry into victim's apartment, assaulted her and took a sum of cash from victim. The suspect was wearing a camouflage hoodie and dark colored pants and fled the area. Victim told Officers that her ex-boyfriend knocked on her door and when she answered her ex-boyfriend immediately entered her apartment and assaulted her. Victim stated that her ex-boyfriend was highly intoxicated and she broke free from him. She immediately called 911. Once he realized that she had called the Police, he fled the area. Victim stated after her ex-boyfriend left she noticed that her money that was on the kitchen table was taken.

Special Attention: Fatal Crash

09/19/2020 9:05pm **24000 Telegraph Rd.**

Several Southfield Officers were sent to the area of the 24000 Block of Telegraph Rd. on a single vehicle rollover injury accident. The vehicle had rolled over, hit a tree and was up against the wall of a business. Several Officers and Southfield Fire Personnel assisted with extracting subjects from the vehicle and subjects that were trapped under tree branches. Six occupants were in the vehicle at the time of the accident. They were all transported to area hospitals. Two occupants were pronounced deceased. One occupant remains in critical condition. The remaining three are believed to have non-life-threatening injuries. All the occupants were teenagers.

Retail Fraud III/ Possession of Cocaine- 1- Arrest

30000 Block Southfield Rd.

(Household Goods & Grocery)

Officers were dispatched to business, located in the 30000 Block of Southfield Rd, on a Retail Fraud in progress.

Asset Protection Specialist from the store called police to report that a repeat offender was walking around the store concealing merchandise. The suspect concealed a total of three bottles of champagne; on his person and left the store w/o paying for the merchandise.

After exiting the store, suspect entered a Dark Colored Dodge Journey in the parking lot. Officers arrived on scene and located the Dodge Journey and contacted the suspect. Officers could clearly see three unopen bottles of champagne resting on the passenger seat.

The suspect admitted to taking the merchandise w/o paying for it. He was taken into custody for Retail Fraud III.

While collecting the stolen merchandise from the suspect's vehicle Officers located suspected cocaine in the vehicle.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of the suspected substance and it tested positive for possible presence of cocaine. Second charge of Possession of Cocaine.

Special Attention: Fight/ Disturbance

27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy.

(Hotel)

Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block (Hotel) of Northwestern Hwy. for a fight in progress.

R/P states there is a female and 3 other men fighting in one of the hotel rooms. Subjects were fighting and destroying the room.

Officers arrived on scene and observed several items damaged in the room.

Information was developed that two females started fighting and then several males also got involved in the ruckus. Several of the combatants fled prior to Officers arrival and the ones that remained refused to cooperate. No one on scene wished to make a complaint.

MDOP> \$1,000.00- 1- Arrest

20000 Block of Rampart Cir.

Officers were dispatched to the 20000 Block of Rampart Cir. for a report of the R/P's girlfriend attacking his 2012 Grey Malibu. Officers investigation revealed that the two combatants got into a verbal argument after returning home from the gym.

At some point during the Domestic Dispute the female half was responsible for damaging the males' vehicle. Officers documented the damage to R/P's vehicle and established probable cause to arrest female half for MDOP> \$1,000.00.

Domestic A&B- 1- Arrest

(Commercial Food)

Several Officers were dispatched to business regarding a large fight. Officers arrived on scene and interviewed several people.

Investigation revealed that a patron came into business and wasn't happy because they didn't have his order ready. He was observed on surveillance video throwing a cup at the cashier and striking her in the face. The suspect attempted to leave but several employees grabbed onto suspect so he couldn't leave. While the suspect was being held two employees were observed hitting suspect in the face.

The original suspect and the two-employees observed assaulting the suspect were all taken into custody for A&B.

09/17/2020 8:04am

18000 Block of Goldwin St.

Officers were dispatched to Domestic Disturbance in the 18000 Block of Goldwin St. R/P (victim) states he has legal Guardianship of his wife who has been diagnosed with some type of Mental Health Issue. R/P lives with his wife and their son in common. R/P advises that his son wanted to remove his mother from the house to an unknown location. R/P told his son that he couldn't because he has legal custody. R/P's son then knocked his father into the wall causing injury and a hole in the wall. R/P's son grabbed his mother and forced her from the home and put her into his vehicle.

Note: It was reported that the R/P's wife stated "No this isn't right" as she was forcefully taken from the house.

The vehicle was being driven by suspects girlfriend. R/P stood behind the vehicle so she couldn't leave. R/P's son then got behind the wheel and backed into his father's leg causing injury.

After the incident R/P received text messages from his wife's daughter asking to take his wife back to Texas. R/P told her no, that he was her legal Guardian. It appears that R/P's son and his wife's daughter have conspired to take his wife w/o his permission. The suspects have been identified and incident is under investigation.

Dangerous Drugs- 1- Arrest

09/18/2020 7:45am

W Eight Mile Rd. & Beech Rd.

Officers were on patrol, 8 Mile Road near Beech Daly Road. Officers conducted a license plate verification on the vehicle and found the vehicle's license plate to be expired and the vehicle to have no financial responsibility per SOS.

During contact with the driver it was discovered that he had two outstanding warrants. The warrant out of Redford for Resisting & Obstructing was confirmed. Officers conducted a search incident to the arrest of suspect's vehicle. During the search of vehicle, Officers recovered a prescription pill bottle with information of medication and who it was prescribed to had been altered/scratched off.

The bottle contained numerous unknown pills.

Officers identified the pills as Oxycodone, a Schedule 2 Controlled Substance. Officers took the driver into custody for Possession of a Scheduled II Drug w/o a valid prescription.

Attempted Murder/ Shooting/ R/A-

1- Arrest

09/17/2020 4:41pm

Evergreen Rd. & Boardwalk St.

Officers were dispatched to Evergreen and Northwestern on a report of a shooting. The caller stated that a White SUV was chasing a Black Vehicle and firing shots into the vehicle. Upon arrival, Officers conducted an area check and were unable to locate either vehicle. At 5:08pm, MSP advised dispatch that they stopped a black vehicle in Detroit. The vehicle contained three occupants and two of the male occupants were suffering from gunshot wounds. The victims were transported to an area hospital. Both victims reside in the City of Detroit and the injuries are non-life threatening. The Southfield Detective Bureau responded and the investigation is ongoing. The driver of the black vehicle made admissions that they had robbed the subject in the white vehicle for some marijuana cartridges for a Vape and the driver shot at them hitting two of them.

The driver of the black vehicle who was not injured in this incident was appeared for Appeared Bakkery and the incident is under further.

The driver of the black vehicle who was not injured in this incident was arrested for Armed Robbery and the incident is under further investigation. Southfield Police Evidence Technicians processed the scene where incident took place and evidence was located and collected.
