Mr. Matthew Berke would like to be placed on your July 9, 2018 Study Meeting agenda to discuss his proposed Special Use Request to allow for a restaurant in a retail center of less than four (4) tenant spaces.

This project was originally approved by the City Council in 2016 as a Site Plan because the retail center was proposed to have four (4) tenant spaces and a restaurant is a permitted use under that scenario. The building is currently under construction and the owner, in leasing the spaces, has found a tenant that needs more square footage and would like to combine two of the four tenant spaces into one thus creating three tenant spaces. Should Council approve of this Special Land Use, the retail center would be fully leased.

The property is located at 29775 Southfield Road on the west side of Southfield Road between W Twelve Mile Road and Webster in front of the Home Depot store. If Council finds the project satisfactory at this Study Meeting, this item will come back to you at your July 30, 2018 Regular Meeting for final review. Planning Department Staff will also be available to answer questions on the proposal.

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Re: Due Diligence – General Development Company Former Northland Mall

Dear Sirs and Mesdames:

<u>Background:</u> General Development Company ("GDC"), is a Southfield, Michigan privately held commercial real estate development firm specializing in industrial, office and build-to-suit projects. Services include build-to-suit development, construction management, general contracting, real estate consulting and more. GDC has experience developing numerous projects including Oakland Technology Park in Auburn Hills, MI. Examples of projects located in Auburn Hills include Corporate Headquarters for U.S. Farathane, Henniges Automotive and Faurecia North America.

GDC is requesting authorization to enter into a 6-month due diligence agreement, with an option, by the City, to extended it 3 months if need. GDC is interested in 20 acres on the south west side of the property referred to as "The Boundary District" (see attached map). This agreement would permit GDC the ability to perform due diligence on the subject property with intent to consider a future purchase agreement. The due diligence would include, but not limited to, investigating the site, undertaking demographic market analytics, developing financial pro-forma and other relevant documentation. This arrangement would be a non-binding agreement and would not require a financial exchange by the City or company during this period. After the 6-month period and possible 3-month option both GDC and the City would review the work product and evaluate development purchase options.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> During the 6-month period, with a 3-month extension option, for the "Boundary District" property the City will have the ability to sell the subject property should an alternative development opportunity occur.

Recommendation: It is recommended that your Honorable Body find an immediate need to act under the Council Rules of Procedure and adopt the following resolution to approve a 6-month non-binding agreement with a 3-month extension option of the City with General Development Company to perform due diligence on 20 acres located at the southwest corner known as the "Boundary District".

Re: Northland Redevelopment Infrastructure Support Expenditure Pacific Medical Buildings and Edward Rose

Dear Sirs and Mesdames:

Background: As previously discussed, Pacific Medical Buildings (PMB) and Edward Rose continue to move forward with their development plans on the former Northland Mall property. Each has progressed to various stages of their respective due diligence process. A continuing issue of discussion relates to the cost of infrastructure (roads, sanitary and storm sewer, water) improvements necessary to support each development

At its June 27, 2018 meeting the Northland Steering Committee reviewed a Source and Use of funds analysis regarding these infrastructure improvements. The attached document will show a total use of funds totaling \$7,750,000. These expenditures are delineated among sanitary sewer, water, storm sewer, road improvement (JL Hudson Drive-Greenfield to Providence), and demolition (northern part of the mall). The analysis also shows the source of funds coming from Water and Sewer Bond funds (\$4,000,000) and the Northland Fund Balance (\$3,500,000).

It is expected the city infrastructure expenditures will be repaid through the sale or lease of the Northland property and the Tax Increment Finance Authority. Repayment is predicated on a taxable development taking place at the former Northland property.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Funds for the report were provided in the General Fund Support Services Account (No. 101-950-9500-38180).

Recommendation: It is recommended that your Honorable Body find an immediate need to act under the Council Rules of Procedure and adopt the attached resolution that Council authorize up to \$3,500,000 from the Northland Fund balance to support the infrastructure improvements for PMB and Edward Rose development.

Dear Sirs and Mesdames:

On February 26, 2018, City Council approved entering into an agreement with Edward Rose and Sons ("Edward Rose") pursuant to which Edward Rose was given an exclusive ninety-day option on approximately 30 acres of the former Northland Mall property to undertake its due diligence activities. Edward Rose has been actively performing its due diligence activities with respect to the property; however, the ninety-day period has now expired. Edward Rose is requesting a ninety day extension of the due diligence agreement to continue its activities preliminary to potentially entering into a purchase agreement with the City relative to a portion of the former Northland Mall property. Staff is recommending that the City Council approve a ninety-day extension of the due diligence agreement with Edward Rose.

<u>Recommendation:</u> It is recommended that your Honorable Body find an immediate need to act under the Council Rules of Procedure and adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign the proposed ninety-day extension of the due diligence agreement with Edward Rose and Sons, upon review and approval by the City Attorney.

<u>Background:</u> At its February 12, 2018 meeting, Council voted to assist the Martin Luther King Taskforce in applying for a Community Foundation of Southeast Michigan grant. The intent of the grant was to aid the Martin Luther King Taskforce in developing a program to create education curricula programs and activities that will preserve and share the history of the civil rights movement and introduce, inform and illuminate the next generation of powerful lessons learned to make an impact on society.

The Community Foundation of Southeast Michigan approved a \$25,000 grant to aid the Martin Luther King's Taskforce's youth education program. It is now necessary for the city to accept the grant on behalf of the taskforce and act as the fiduciary in its administration.

A representative of the taskforce will be present at tonight's meeting to discuss the grant and the taskforce's youth education program and answer any questions.

Fiscal Impact:

The City is proposing to act as a fiduciary agent on behalf of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Task Force, Inc. There is not likely to be a financial impact.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that Council find an immediate need to act under the Council Rules of Procedure and approve accepting the Community Foundation of Southeast Michigan's \$25,000 grant intended to aid the Martin Luther King Taskforce's youth education program and acting as the fiduciary in the administration of the grant.
