After smoking, two subjects, male & female got out of the car and went into residence in the 28000 Block of Glasgow.</p> <p>Victim and his female friend remained in the vehicle until two unknown B/M's approached the car and pulled victim out at gun point. Victim was forced to lay face down in the street and was robbed. The suspect's ran off to the west. He was unable to provide any descriptions other than 2- B/M's with dark colored hoodies.</p> <p>Note: A Southfield Police K-9 Unit was called to scene for a track. <p>Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!) - If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage. - Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock. -After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels. - If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible. -If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers 	<p>PWID Methamphetamine- 1- Arrest 04/10/2017 12:45am 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) Officers were dispatched to the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy (Hotel) on a narcotics complaint of selling methamphetamines from one of the Hotel Rooms. Officers went to the room with Security from the Hotel. Officers knocked on the door and the person renting the room answered the door. Officers were given permission to enter the room to speak with the subject. After entering the room Officers observed in plain view on the bed plastic baggies containing suspected Methamphetamine. There was also narcotics paraphernalia and a scale in the room. Officers located additional suspected Methamphetamine and packaging materials. The suspect was taken into custody for PWID Methamphetamine. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected evidence, suspected Methamphetamines and Field Tested a sample of the suspected Methamphetamine. Result was positive for possible presence of Methamphetamine.</p>

The passenger was taken into custody for CCW.

It was determined that the vehicle wasn't involved in the incident in Farmington Hills. The driver of the vehicle was advised and released.

Aggravated Felonious Assault-

21000 Block of Greenview

Suspect and victim have only hung out a few times prior to today's incident and their friendship was platonic. Suspect invited victim over to his home in the 21000 Block of Greenview Rd. Victim arrived at suspects home and the two began to drink some Vodka.

At some point during the evening suspect wanted to have sex with victim. Victim told suspect no, that she wasn't that kind of girl and didn't want to have sex with him.

Later that evening suspect allegedly did some cocaine, took his clothes off and again said he wanted to have sex with victim and made advances on her. Victim again stated no.

At some point suspect got angry and assaulted victim hitting her several times and biting her. Victim fled the residence and called the police. Officers observed what appeared to be bite marks on victim's body. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected evidence and took pictures of victim's injuries.

Several Officers responded to suspect's residence on Greenview. Officers observed suspect through the bedroom window sleeping on the ground. The room was in disarray and the blinds were pulled off of the window; which was consistent with victim's story.

The suspect was awakened and answered the door when Officers knocked. Suspect was taken into custody w/o incident.

Trespassing/ A&B Police Officer/ Resisting Arrest- 3- Arrests

26000 Block of Central Park Blvd.

(Hotel)

Officers were dispatched to report of a physical fight in progress at hotel in 26000 Block of Central Park Blvd. involving approximately 15 individuals. The Night Manager of the hotel stated he was observing the fight via security cameras.

Upon pulling up to the scene Officers observed 10-15 people standing on the stairs leading up the second floor of the hotel on the west side. Individuals were yelling and disorderly, but no physical altercation was observed. Officers separated the group of individuals in the parking lot and went up to the hotel room where the disturbance originated.

The door was locked. Officers knocked on the door and announced police. The individuals inside the apartment refused to open the door and stated they were sleeping.

Officers met with the Night Manager and he advised that he wanted everyone from that room evicted.

Officers went to the room and the manager unlocked the door.

Officers announced that everyone in the room needed to vacate the premises or would be subject to arrest for trespassing.

Everyone left the room except two subjects that were in an upper loft of the room. They were both very agitated but eventually left the room.

While Officers were continuing to clear everyone from the property the same two subjects that earlier refused to leave came back on the property as did a female that was advised to leave the property. They were advised again to leave the property. All three suspects refused to leave the property.

All three subjects were arrested for Trespassing.

The two male subjects resisted arrest and Officers had to use the

necessary force to affect the arrests.

One of the male subjects hit Officer in the back of his head. He was charged with Assaulting a Police Officer.

Retail Fraud II/ Obstruct P.O./ DWLS- 1- Arrest

28000 Block of Telegraph Rd.

(Commercial Retail)

Officers responded to the 28000 Block of Telegraph Rd. to assist in an area check for a Retail Fraud suspect.

Information was that a 50 year old white male just committed a Retail Fraud at the business on Telegraph Rd. and fled the location E/B on 12 Mile in a Gray PT Cruiser.

Officer located the suspect vehicle stopped at the traffic light at 12 Mile & Lahser. Officer pulled in behind the suspect vehicle as it began travelling E/B on 12 Mile from Lahser.

The suspect vehicle turned onto S/B Murray Crescent, immediately stopped and the driver got out of the vehicle.

Officer got on his PA System and ordered the subject back into his vehicle. A second Officer arrived on scene and together they took suspect into custody for Retail Fraud.

The subject immediately made admissions that he had stolen meat from the business and that he had given the meat back to someone from the store after they caught him. The subject also made admissions that he had stolen meat from another business in a neighboring community. That jurisdiction was notified of the recovery of goods from business in their city.

Officers responded to dispatched run regarding a vehicle crash where a light pole was struck near 3000 Town Center.

Officer located the vehicle. It was occupied by three subjects and there was obvious damage to the vehicle. The driver seemed to be confused and wasn't sure where she was and what she hit. There was a strong odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle.

Officer suspected the driver had been drinking and conducted OWI investigation. It was determined that the driver was intoxicated and she was arrested for OWI. During the search incident to the arrest Officer located a vial of suspected marijuana in one of the driver's pockets.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of the suspected marijuana. The result was positive for possible presence of marijuana.

The driver was arrested for OWI & Possession of Marijuana.

Officer was dispatched to location on a report of a subject slumped behind the wheel of a vehicle. Upon arrival, Officer made contact with the driver and suspected that he was under the influence of some type of narcotics. An OUIIN investigation was conducted and the subject was placed under arrest for OUIIN.

PWID Cocaine Heroin & Marijuana/ Obstruct Criminal

Investigation- 2- Arrests

04/15/2017 5:24pm

Providence Dr. & Coach Light Dr.

Officer while on routine patrol passed suspect vehicle in the Plaza Parking Lot (9 Mile & Greenfield Rd.). Officer immediately detected the odor of marijuana after passing suspect vehicle. The vehicle also had no visible license plate attached to vehicle.

The occupants in vehicle parked their car and went into a business in the plaza. Officer set up surveillance of vehicle and waiting for occupants to return to the vehicle.

A short time later Officer observed two black males returning to the vehicle. While the males were walking to the vehicle they were looking all around the parking lot and were being very cautious to see if anyone was watching them.

After entering the vehicle a third black male approached the driver side of the vehicle, made contact with the driver and it appeared that a narcotics transaction took place.

After observing this the vehicle left the parking lot and went west on

9 Mile Rd. Officer called for backup and stopped the vehicle at the entrance to an Apartment Complex on Providence Dr. Additional Officers arrived at the stop to assist.

Officer's investigation revealed that the driver had no identification and the passenger gave false identification and an alias name.

After both occupants in the vehicle were removed Officers recovered a plastic baggie that was discarded by one of the subjects with suspected cocaine on the ground adjacent to their vehicle.

Further investigation Officers recovered another plastic baggie with suspected Heroin that was thrown from the vehicle when Officer was following the vehicle.

A Southfield Police K-9 Unit conducted a search of the vehicle. There were multiple positive hits for the presence of narcotics throughout the vehicle.

A manual search of the vehicle resulted in several items of evidence that are consistent with narcotic delivery being seized.

One of the suspects also had a large quantity of currency on his person.

In addition, one of the suspects had multiple misdemeanor warrants and a NCIC warrant out of another jurisdiction.

The second suspect had a Parole Violation and a Probation Violation warrant out of the 3rd Circuit Court.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected, packaged & tagged several items of evidence. He also separately Field Tested samples of suspected Heroin, Cocaine & Marijuana. All Three tested positive for possible presence of Heroin, Cocaine & Marijuana.

Both suspects were taken into custody for PWID Controlled Substances.
