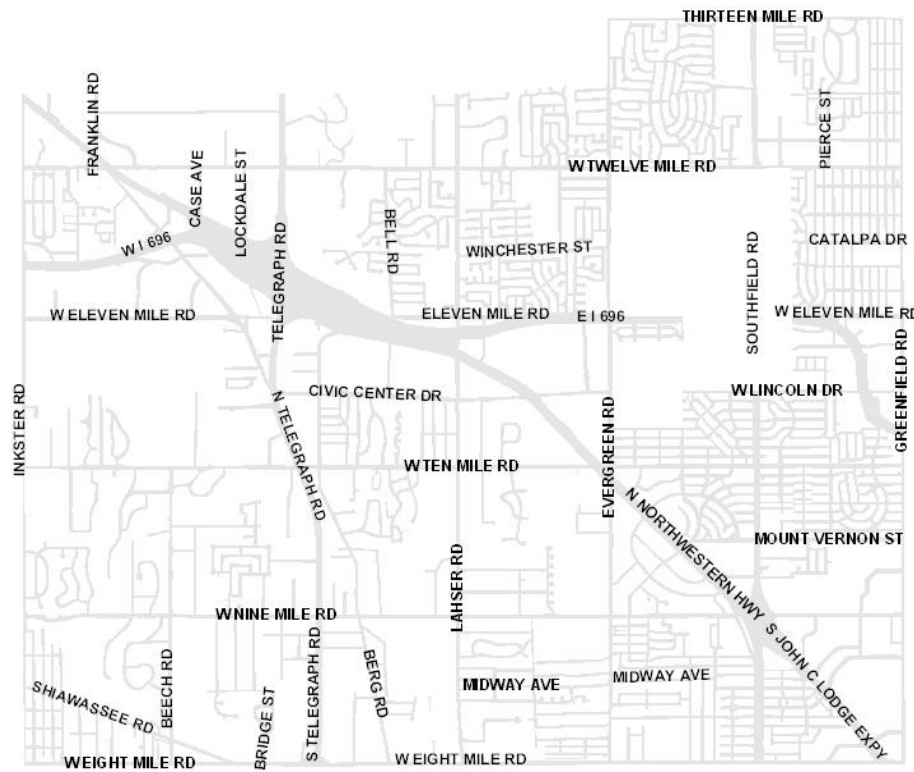

<p>From: 04/22/2019 6:00pm To: 04/23/2019 6:00am</p>	<p>22000 Telegraph Rd. (Commercial- Construction)</p>	<p>Door was forced open. There was also an attempt to enter another building with a sledge hammer.</p>	<p>R/P states he arrived to work at 6:00am and discovered the outer storage building (north side of property) had its south wooden pedestrian door forced open. The door was secured with a padlock. Victim advises (3) large sledge hammers were taken from the building.</p> <p>There was evidence of attempt entry to the main building that sits south of the out building. The north side steel pedestrian door between garage doors showed signs of damage from what appears to be sledge hammer strikes. Entry wasn't made into this building.</p> <p>On the west side of the out building there were two automobiles belonging to R/P. The vehicles are not currently being driven.</p> <p>The front windshield and right front headlight lens were damaged on the Saturn Vue and the left rear tail light lens was damaged on the Expedition. Nothing appears to be taken but several things were damaged.</p> <p>Note: It appears that this incident may be related to several B&E/ MDOP's that occurred recently at business in the 24000 Block of Nine Mile Rd. In those incident's a suspect was seen going over the fence from this business.</p> <p>The incidents are similar because there were B&E's and MDOP's where windows were broken out but entry wasn't gained.</p>

**24000 Block of W Nine Mile Rd.
(Office Building)**

Suspect(s) are jumping the wall that separates this location from the 22000 Block of Telegraph Rd.

Entry on all three incidents were by throwing an object through the glass door or a window. One of the incidents a window was broken out but there was no entry into the building. Incidents are occurring in the early morning hours.

Suspect Description on one of the incidents:

One subject wearing a black and grey striped zip up jacket, black sweatpants with a diamond design on the calf and white gloves.

Surveillance Video on one of the incidents shows a heavy-set W/F coming over the fence from the 22000 Block of Telegraph Rd. at which time she climbed on top of a construction trailer and subsequently came over the fence separating both properties.

Victim stated he left his apartment at approx. 9:00am this date and returned at approx. 12:00pm. After arriving home, he observed suspect vehicle and black male parked outside his residence. After walking past suspect and vehicle the suspect immediately left the area. Victim stated the suspect was a black male approx. 25-30 years of age, stocky build, short hair wearing a black shirt. Victim stated the suspect vehicle was a Silver Dodge Smaller SUV with passenger side damage. Victim stated when he entered his residence one of his TV's was sitting on the floor just inside the front door. Victim stated the glass sliding door to the rear of his residence was sitting open. Victim stated he checked the interior of the home and found his Play Station Video Game Console had been taken. No signs of forced entry.

Upon arrival, the front door was found to be forced open. Officers stood by for K-9 Unit to make the scene to check the interior of the house. K-9 Unit arrived and cleared the house. The homeowner arrived back at the house and checked for any missing items. Nothing was found missing. Victim has video of the incident but wasn't available at time of reporting.</p>

He returned to his home on 04/24/2019 at 11:00am. Upon returning, he observed that the bottom glass pane on his exterior kitchen door had been removed. He began to inspect his home, and discovered that a small safe had been stolen from the residence.</p>

Taken from victim's apartment was a 22" Flat Screen TV that was on the TV stand in her living room. Victim had a Laptop sitting on a dresser in her bedroom that was also taken. No suspect information.</p>

(Residential- Condo's)</p>	<p>Lock Box had been broken into.</p>	<p>R/P stated she went to the home at approx. 12:00pm and found the vanities, sinks and toilets had been ripped out of both bathrooms and taken. One toilet that was broken was left in the garage. Officers observed items were missing from bathrooms and observed the walls and flooring had been damaged during the removal. The lockbox on the front door had also been broken into. Both bathrooms appeared to be recently renovated. Victim had a dispute with one of his contractors, possibly related. Incident is under investigation.</p>

(Residential- Apartments)</p>	<p>Entry was made by prying open apartment door.</p>	<p>Victim states sometime between 04/26/2019 and 04/28/2019 someone pried the apartment door open and entered victim's apartment. Several electronic items were taken from the residence. No suspect information.</p>

<p>From: 04/28/2019 12:00pm To: 04/29/2019 4:30pm</p>	<p>25000 Greenfield Rd. (Residential- Apartments)</p>	<p>No forced entry observed. Old damage from previous Home Invasion was still present.</p>	<p>R/P was the last to leave the apartment on 04/28/2019 at approx. 11:00am following the initial Home Invasion Report at which time she reportedly locked the resident door with the only key known available securing the dead bolt. R/P returned the same day at approx. 4:30pm and observed the entry door partially open and the lock and handle in place. There was no evidence of forced entry, but it was obvious that the apartment had been gone through with several items thrown about. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and collected evidence.</p>

Victim activated the phone on that date, it worked until Saturday April 27, 2019 until it was deactivated by carrier after it was reported as stolen by suspect. Victim contacted suspect who told him to activate it through another carrier. Victim refused and asked for the return of his money. Suspect refused his request.</p> <p>Southfield Detectives contacted the suspect about the incident and he stated that he had just ordered a new phone. The company had sent him two phones. He took it upon himself to sell the extra one on Facebook knowing that it was sent to him by accident.</p> <p>Suspect agreed to return the money that was paid by victim. Both parties met at our PD and the exchange was completed. Victim didn't wish to prosecute. He only wanted his money back.</p>

When she returned from the store, walking up her driveway, a man snuck up behind her and forcibly removed the purse that was hanging from her left wrist. The man fled West on Woodhaven and jumped over the chain-link fence at the West end of the street (dead-end street).</p> <p>Victims left middle fingernail was broken off and she had a small abrasion on her left wrist.</p> <p>A witness (Neighbor) saw the suspect following the victim. Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

- Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until
