


Victim states she had a verbal argument with her boyfriend and decided to end the relationship and change the locks on her residence. Victim stated her now ex-boyfriend told her previously that he was going to do something to her, but he was not specific.

Victim is afraid that suspects violence may increase. Victim lives in Detroit but works in Southfield where incident occurred. Victim was advised and given instruction on how to obtain a PPO. Suspect has been identified.

#### 23000 Block of Hazen St.

On 05/04/2019 Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Hazen St (area of Ten Mile and Berg) for LFAs just discovered.

Dispatch advised the R/P observed a Burgundy SUV in the area and a B/M wearing a Red Jacket exit his vehicle and appear to start breaking into parked vehicles in the area. Dispatch also advised the R/P had her vehicle broken into and a gun was stolen.

Officers advised they observed a B/M matching the description of the suspect behind business at Ten Mile and Telegraph.

When Officers turned their vehicle around to make contact with the suspect he began running E/B across Ten Mile Rd and then S/B on Berg. Another Southfield Officer was in the area and began traveling on S/B Berg at Ten Mile. The suspect was running on the W/B Side of Berg Rd. Officer observed the suspect reaching towards his waistband & pockets while he was running. Officer cut suspect off with his patrol vehicle and positioned it in front of the suspect. Another Southfield Officer chasing the suspect on foot caught up to suspect and took him to the ground. The suspect was handcuffed, secured and placed in the rear of patrol vehicle.

The suspect drop two objects while he was being chased. Officers later, located a holster and firearm on the W/B side of Berg south of Ten Mile Rd right in the area where suspect was arrested.

Officers confirmed that the handgun that was recovered was

# Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

- -Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- -After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- -If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- -If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police

### (Hotel)

Officers were dispatched to the 28000 block of Northwestern Hwy. (Hotel) for an unresponsive subject.

While Life Support Unit was attempting to wake up the subject, Officers observed several small baggies containing a white substance in a partially opened nightstand next to the bed. Upon closer investigation, the substance appeared to be suspected Crack Cocaine. One of the baggies was opened as if it was recently consumed.

On a desk in the room, Officers also observed a light dusting of a powdery white substance. The substance appeared to have lines in it as if it was cut with a razor blade.

Southfield FD medically cleared subject and stated that he was not suffering from any medical conditions or an overdose.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of the suspected substance and the result was positive for possible presence of Cocaine.

The subject was taken into custody for Possession of Cocaine.

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

### How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

### **Retail Fraud/ Resist & Obstruct-**

1- Arrest

(Goods & Groceries Business)

Officers were on routine patrol when Southfield Dispatch broadcasted a Retail Fraud in progress at business in the 28000 Block of Telegraph Rd. Two B/M's were seen taking a liquor bottle from the store. Dispatch informed officers they exited the store and entered a White Ford Escape and put out a license plate for vehicle. Two females also exited the store and entered the vehicle. The vehicle then left the area. Suspect was a B/M wearing a white t-shirt, blue jeans, had braids and light complexion.

A short time later, Officers located the suspect vehicle unoccupied at a nearby Hotel. Investigation lead to a room where the suspect was located. The suspect refused to put his hands behind his back and began to resist officers. The suspect had to be physically taken into custody and was arrested with evidence recovered from the business. Once in the jail, the suspect continued to resist Jail Personnel & Officers. He was eventually secured in a cell.

Officers attempted to stop vehicle for traffic violation. The suspect refused to stop and a short pursuit occurred.

Officers terminated on S/B Telegraph at 9 Mile. Suspect vehicle: Maroon Hell Cat Charger was entered into LEIN as a Wanted Felony Vehicle. Officers obtained the License Plate # from vehicle. Driver: Younger B/M wearing a neon yellow dorag and a dark colored hoodie.

The lone occupant of the charger was later identified and his place of residency was located.

Southfield Officers conducted surveillance at a residence in Detroit and observed suspect leave the residence on foot. Suspect walked to a nearby party store. Officers entered the party store and took the suspect into custody w/o incident. Suspect was transported to Southfield Jail, processed and lodged.
