


(Gas Station)	Cinder Block through the front door glass.	<p>On 12/05/2017 at approx. 3:09am Officers were dispatched to the 25000 Block of W Nine Mile (Gas Station) on a "Interior front motion" alarm. Upon Officers arrival, the front right door appeared to be smashed out with a gray cinder block. There was glass on the ground near the exterior and interior of the door.</p> <p>A Southfield Police K-9 Unit arrived on scene and started a track. K-9 tracked west from the location to Riverdale St. where the track ended and it appeared suspect(s) had a vehicle parked. Officers checked the interior of the gas station for suspects. Nobody was inside.</p> <p>It appeared the suspect tried to gain entry to the area behind the counter. The registers and employee area was closed off by glass and a locked door. The suspect attempted to throw a cinder block through that glass door but was unsuccessful gaining entry. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene. It appears that some 5 Hour Energy Drinks and possibly some other misc. items were taken.</p>

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Special Attention: Crime Prevention Tip's for the Holidays!

With the Holidays approaching citizens should be extra careful when shopping. Citizens should never leave anything of value inside the compartment area of their vehicle. If you must leave valuables in the car be sure to put them in the trunk. If you don't have a trunk then I would recommend you take items home.

Women should be extra careful when carrying a purse. Don't ever carry your purse over your shoulder and don't ever leave your purse in a shopping cart unattended. You are an easy target for someone to take your purse or take your wallet from your purse if you do this.

I would recommend that citizens not carry a purse; instead they should carry a wallet or something that can be concealed from thieves

21000 Block of W Nine Mile Rd.

(Gas Station)

Victim reported to Officer that he mistakenly left his wallet on the counter at the Gas Station in the 21000 Block of Nine Mile Rd.

When victim returned to the gas station the wallet was gone.

Surveillance video from gas station shows a customer, B/M, 30's taking the wallet from the counter and then entering a newer Red Challenger. Suspect then left the scene.

R/P cancelled his credit card but discovered that there had been three attempts to use the credit card at businesses in Southfield.

Southfield Officer in another unrelated incident, later reported that he had arrested a subject that had a wallet in his possession belonging to the victim in this incident.

The suspect was contacted in the Southfield Lock-up by Southfield Detectives

The suspect was interviewed and made admissions that he had taken the wallet and attempted to use it three times in Southfield.

All three attempts were declined.

1- Arrest

12/07/2017 1:15pm

21000 Block of W Nine Mile Rd.

Officers were dispatched to investigate suspicious occupied vehicle. Officers located the vehicle but it was unoccupied. Further information was developed that the two occupants had gone through a nearby business and they are now in a Red Dodge Challenger on the other side of the business.

Officers located the Red Dodge Challenger, it was occupied by one subject and there was a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle.

Contact with the occupant revealed that he had just smoked a blunt. Officers recovered suspected marijuana, a scale and packaging materials.

The occupant was arrested for PWID Marijuana.

Further investigation by Officers revealed that the occupant was in possession of stolen wallet that was taken in an earlier Larceny at the Gas Station in Southfield.

It was also learned later that the suspect in this arrest Fraudulently attempted to use a credit card from the stolen wallet three times in Southfield. Additional charges were added.

7) 23000 Block of Evergreen Rd.

(Apartments)

In the past two week's there were three vehicles attacked and one Home Invasion.

LFA's- The windows were broken out and the vehicles were ransacked.

Occurred late night, early morning.

Home Invasion- Someone forced entry into apartment by prying open the apartment door.

TV, Computer and a Play Station are missing from the apartment. Occurred sometime between 5:30am- 3:30pm.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach

or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.
