Victim's ex-girlfriend continued to message that she was damaging certain items in his house, covering victim's vehicle with shaving cream and pulling out his groceries from the refrigerator. Victim and his girlfriend drove home and discovered a white creamy substance on vehicle parked in his driveway. Further inspection revealed entry door to residence was forced open and the interior of residence was ransacked including groceries were removed from the refrigerator. (Commercial- Bank)</p>	<p>Undisclosed Amount of Cash was Taken From Bank.</p>	<p>Bank Teller stated she noticed the suspect enter the bank and she said he looked familiar. Teller thought the subject looked like the same person who robbed the bank last month. The suspect first went over to a table in the lobby and was writing on a piece of paper. The suspect then approached her teller window and passed a Bank Deposit Slip with writing on it. The note demanded money from teller. The teller gave suspect an undisclosed amount of currency. The suspect then fled the bank with the currency and demand note. Suspect was a B/M, 60-70 years old, wearing glasses and had bad teeth. The suspect was wearing a yellow hoodie with army green color over the hoodie. Suspect also had a salt and pepper short cropped beard. Southfield Officer while in route to bank observed subject matching the description of suspect from Bank Robbery running across 9 Mile Rd and then entering a bus in front of Providence Hospital. Officer pulled his vehicle in front of the bus, got out of his vehicle & ordered suspect off the bus. Officer patted suspect down and felt a large bulge in his left pant pocket. Officer located a large amount of money inside his pocket (later confirmed to be same amount taken from bank) and observed a gray knit hat inside his jacket. Subject also had a pair of gloves</p>

			<p>in his jacket pocket.</p> <p>A Southfield Police K-9 Officer and his K-9 initiated a track from the bank.</p> <p>K-9 tracked from the bank to the bus where suspect was located.</p> <p>An article search by K-9 also located the “Bank Note” that suspect used in the Robbery within the same path that suspect took to the bus.</p> <p>A Southfield Police Evidence Technician collected the “Bank Note” as evidence.</p> <p>It was discovered that the amount of currency that was recovered from suspect was the same amount that was taken in Robbery.</p> <p>The suspect was taken into custody for Bank Robbery.</p> <p>FBI Agent on scene advised that suspect is wanted in a rash of Serial Bank Robberies in the Metro Detroit area over the last 2 1/2 years.</p> <p>A Southfield Police Detective and FBI Agent interviewed suspect regarding this Bank Robbery and other Bank Robberies that he was suspected of committing.</p> <p>The suspect made admissions to committing several Bank Robberies including the 3- Bank Robberies in Southfield.</p>

Between the dates of February 2- 9, 2016, Police Department from the State of Arizona had a Home Invasion/ Double Homicide.

Their investigation led to one of the suspects and a person of interest (Husband & Wife) possibly hiding out at a residence in Southfield. They requested our Departments assistance.

Southfield Police Detectives located suspect(s) and their vehicle. Southfield Police Detectives set up and maintained surveillance of suspect vehicle and residential apartment.

In conjunction with Detectives from PD in Arizona, FBI Organized Violent Crimes Task Force, the Southfield Police Investigations Division, and Southfield PD SERT Unit, a search warrant was obtained by Southfield Police Detectives, executed and both subjects were apprehended without incident.

1- Arrest

Officers were conducting a Property Inspection at the Hotel due to complaints of illegal activity.

Officers observed a vehicle pull in and the driver went to room and observed suspicious activity. Officers were able to stop the vehicle for a traffic offense and upon investigating the occupant arrested him for a 46th District Court Warrant for Domestic Violence and found the driver to be in possession of marijuana.

The arrestee stated that he purchased the marijuana from the room that he went to at the Hotel.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested the suspected Marijuana. The result was positive for possible presence of Marijuana.
