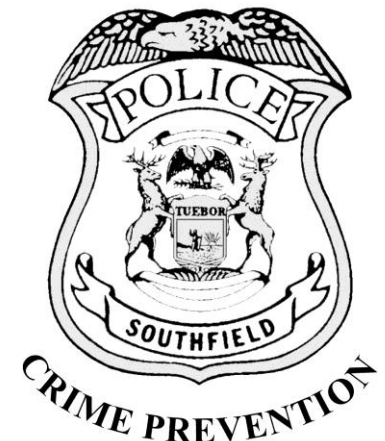
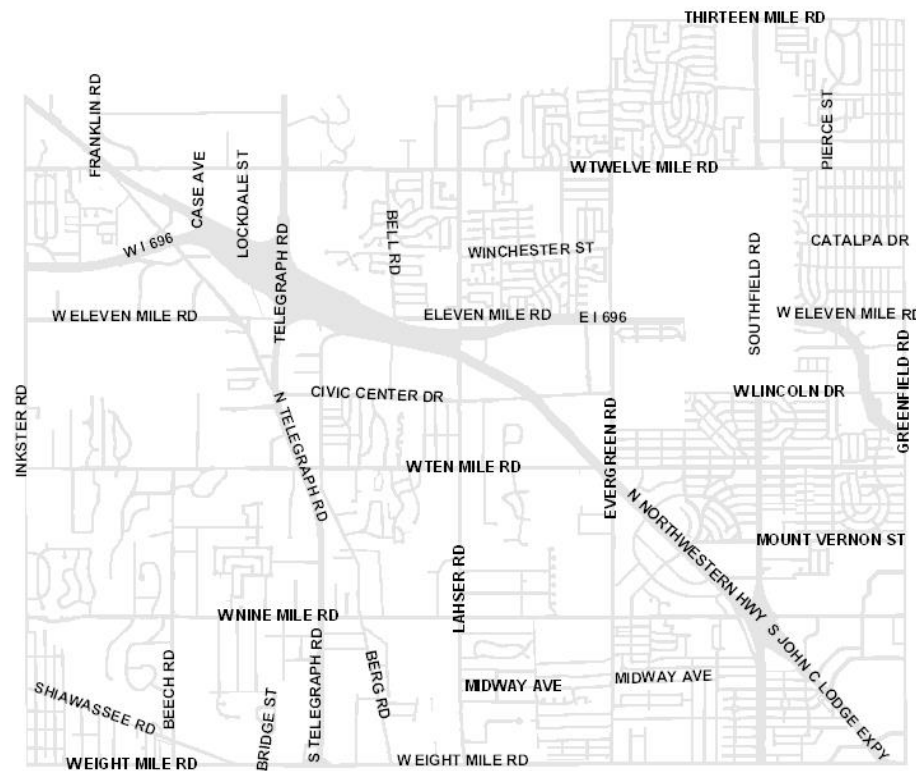

From: 03/02/2016 3:13am To: 03/02/2016 3:25am	23000 W Nine Mile Rd. (Commercial- Pizza)	Front glass was broken out.	<p>Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of W. Nine Mile Rd (Commercial- Pizza) for a report of broken glass on the front door called in by snow removal personal.</p> <p>On scene Officers observed that the bottom glass portion of the front door of business was smashed out and the middle window to business next door was cracked but still intact.</p> <p>Two cash registers were damaged but nothing was taken.</p> <p>Surveillance video from business shows at 3:23am two subjects kick and break the front door glass and enter the store where they start attacking both registers with a small mallet and crowbar.</p> <p>The subjects exit without anything a minute later at 3:24am.</p> <p>The suspects had their faces covered but one had a gray or green hoodie with text or graphic on the front of it, white winter hat, red gloves, and had a dark color backpack with a logo on it. The other suspect had the same colored dark jogging outfit on with a hoodie that covered his head/face.</p> <p>The third suspect was difficult to see but had a black hooded jacket on (hood over his head).</p>

03/06/2016 3:50am	20000 W Twelve Mile (Commercial- Nails)	It's unknown how entry was made through the front door.	<p>Officers were dispatched to business at approx. 7:40am.</p> <p>Officers met with the owners and were advised they have video of the break in.</p> <p>The video shows a suspect at the entrance of the business at approximately 3:48am. He makes entry into the business at 3:50am. He exits at 3:51am.</p> <p>The video shows the suspect as a B/M, between 30-35 years old, medium build, 5'-10"-6'-0", and a mustache. He was wearing gloves, a dark color hoodie, coat, and pants. In the video, the suspect walks toward the cash register at the front of the store and picks it up. He takes the money that is inside. He then exits the business. There was an undisclosed amount of money inside the register.</p>
03/06/2016 4:27am	28000 Northwestern (Commercial- Food)	Attempt Only.	<p>On 03/06/2016 at 4:27am, Officers were dispatched to business (Fast Food) for an alarm.</p> <p>Upon arrival, Officers observed the front door glass was attacked by an unknown suspect(s).</p> <p>The glass was still intact but there was an attempt to break into the business. No entry was made.</p>
