(Pharmacy)	Broke out Bullet Proof Glass on the east side of store using a sledge hammer.	<p>On Saturday morning 02/09/2019 @ 3:44am Officers were dispatched to the 23000 Block of Southfield Rd. (Pharmacy) to investigate an alarm.</p> <p>Officers arrived on scene and discovered good B&E. A rear window was broken out and entry was made into the business. Officers cleared the building and did not locate anyone inside.</p> <p>While checking the building Officers observed multiple pill bottles on the floor, a large glass window lying on the floor and a large black metal safe on the floor. Owner arrived on scene and confirmed that safe containing controlled substances was taken.</p> <p>Surveillance video shows two tall and thin build males approach the window on the east side of the building. Both males were wearing clothes fully covering their body and had gloves and black masks.</p> <p>One of the suspects struck the window multiple times with a sledge hammer until the window broke and they gained entry. Once inside the pharmacy the suspects stole black safe containing controlled substances.</p> <p>Video showed a Nissan Pickup Truck either Red or Burgundy pull up and the suspects placed the safe into the pickup truck and fled the area.</p> <p>Note: The suspect vehicle matches the description of Pharmacy B&E's that recently occurred in other jurisdictions.</p> <p>Suspect Descriptions:</p>

(Multi Office Building) Several Officers responded to the 23000 Block of Greenfield Rd. regarding reports of shots fired. Officers located one subject that had been shot. Officers rendered aid until paramedics arrived. The subject was treated by paramedics and transported to the hospital. After the victim was transported to Hospital he gave Officers an Alias name and was uncooperative with Officers regarding the investigation. The victim eventually gave his real name. It was discovered that suspect had numerous warrants. One out of Southfield. Further investigation revealed that incident occurred after two groups of people got into an argument while inside the Office Building in the 23000 Block of Greenfield Rd. The suspect and two accomplices fled the scene prior to Officers arrival. Incident is under investigation. Officers were dispatched to Domestic Assault in progress. Victim states that he and his roommate had gotten into an argument over the phone earlier. Officer stopped vehicle for traffic violation. There was furtive movement by rear seat passenger, prior to and during the stop. After the vehicle stopped the rear seat passenger opened his door and fled on foot.

Additional Officers arrived on scene and were given the direction suspect fled in. Other Officers arrived on scene and assisted in securing the two other passengers.

The driver was identified and it was verified she had a suspended driver's license. She was taken into custody for DWLS.

The right front passenger was identified and came back clear and was later released.

Officers located the suspect that fled from the vehicle and he was taken into custody.

Officers conducted an inventory search of suspect vehicle and located a loaded handgun in the mesh pocket located on the back of the driver's seat, directly in front of where the suspect that fled from the vehicle was seated.

This suspect was taken into custody for R&O/ CCW & Felony Warrant. The suspect made admissions that he had the handgun for protection and the reason he fled was because of the warrant.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Fleeing & Eluding/ Possession of a Fraudulent Transaction Device- 1- Arrest

02/06/2019 1:02pm

12 Mile & Telegraph Rd.

Officers were on routine patrol when they attempted to stop a vehicle for a traffic violation. The driver of the vehicle failed to stop and a pursuit ensued. Officers lost sight of the vehicle at Northwestern & Berg. A short time later, Officers received information that the suspect vehicle was seen driving into the entrance of the Southfield Apartment Complex on Berg Road. Officers conducted an area check and located the unoccupied suspect vehicle in the parking lot. Officers observed two subjects walking on foot in the courtyard of the complex. One of the subjects was in possession of a fraudulent credit card. The suspect was placed under arrest for possession of a fraudulent transaction device. The second subject was released pending further investigation. It is believed that these two subjects were from the vehicle that fled from officers.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with

Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.
