How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach

01/19/2018, TCSU Officers were dispatched to Apartment Complex in the 16000 Block of Lamplighter Court regarding a subject breaking into cars.

The witness advised the suspect was a B/M wearing all black with a facemask on. Witness observed the suspect with a backpack going from car to car attempting to get in. Witness observed the suspect in a Black Chevy Monte Carlo in front of her address.

TCSU Officers arrived at complex and began conducting surveillance of the Apartment Complex.

Officer from unit located the suspect and began watching the subject on foot. Officer observed the suspect going from car to car checking door handles and going through several vehicles.

A marked unit pulled into the area as the suspect was exiting a 2004 Ford Taurus. The suspect observed the fully marked patrol vehicle and he began crouching down alongside the driver's door of the vehicle.

Officers moved in to apprehend the suspect and the suspect began to run on foot. Just prior to the subject running an object fell from the suspects person. This item was later identified and recovered to be an operational flash light/stun gun. Officers ordered the subject to stop multiple times by yelling "stop police".

The suspect continued to flee N/B across a field toward Mt. Vernon St. The suspect attempted to jump an 8-ft. fence with negative results.

The suspect was ordered to the ground where he complied. Suspect was taken into custody.

The suspect had numerous items in his backpack that were stolen from several different vehicles.

or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.
