**Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles**  
**How to prevent this from happening to you!**

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to take the front wheels & tires.

- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers

Officers responded to Hotel on report of a female possibly being held in a vehicle against her will.

Officers found the vehicle and secured the female. Officers identified each of the three (3) remaining occupants of the vehicle. The driver identified himself with an alias name that came back with no record on file.

Officers ordered the driver out of the vehicle for further investigation. Officers conducted a pat down of the driver. Officers found a Michigan Identification Card and the picture matched the driver. Officer conducted traffic stop for speeding. (Radar 83mph- 55mph zone) The vehicle was occupied by two subjects.

After stopping and approaching the vehicle Officer immediately could smell the odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle.

The driver was questioned about the odor and she responded that it must be her clove cigarettes? The driver had an officer safety flag and she also had contact on her driving record for a drug related incident. The driver gave Officer permission to search the vehicle.

Prior to searching the vehicle Officer questioned the passenger of the vehicle if he had any weapons on him. The passenger responded that he had two (2) handguns in his possession. Officer retrieved the two handguns from the passenger's waistband.

The passenger stated that he had applied for a CPL but he didn't have a valid CPL to carry at this time.

The passenger was taken into custody for CCW. On the way into the station the subject made admissions that he had marijuana and a small scale concealed on his person. Several baggies of marijuana were recovered from subject's crotch area. A scale was also recovered from his pants pocket.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested the suspected marijuana. The result was positive for possible presence of marijuana. Suspect was also charged with Possession of Marijuana.

Officers were dispatched to the 20000 Block of Southfield Rd. (Gas Station) for a fight between a male and female.

When Officers arrived they located the male half outside and the female half was located inside the gas station.

The female half had red marks on her neck and a scratch to the left side of her cheek. Female half was uncooperative, refused to allow pictures of her injuries and advised she didn't want to press any charges.

Witness stated combatants arrived at the gas station at about 1:00am. The female ran from the car looking scared. The male ran after female and hit her in front of the doors to the gas station. The male also pushed female into a garbage can knocking it over and caused her to fall to the ground. Witness could hear female yelling at male to stop. The female came inside of the gas station and male remained outside until Officers arrived.

The male half admitted to being drunk & high and made admission that he had marijuana on his person. Marijuana was later recovered from male half and a sample of the suspected marijuana was Field Tested by a Southfield Police Evidence Technician. The result was positive for possible presence of marijuana. The male half was arrested for Domestic A&B and Possession of Marijuana.
