(10:30am) Witness had never seen the two suspects before and continued to monitor them.</p> <p>At approx. 12:30pm witness observed the two suspects at her neighbors condo. The female was observed opening the screen to window. Witness went to get her phone to call the complex management. When she returned she could see the blinds moving from the same window and someone looked out the window.</p> <p>Witness then observed the male suspect come out of the apartment building and she took a photograph of him on her cell phone. Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers

Several Officers responded to Apartment Complex in the 23000 Block of Riverside Dr. on report of a Domestic Assault in progress at the complex.

Officers arrived on scene, conducted their investigation and spoke to witnesses. Investigation revealed that the female half of the domestic was chasing after the male half who was holding onto their baby.

At some point, she eventually struck the male while he was holding the baby. The female also struck two vehicles, sending one vehicle into the natural gas meter of the adjacent building, rupturing the line and causing a leak. The gas company had to respond to scene.

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
