


## Commercial Burglaries:

(Commercial- Deli)	2- front glass entry doors and a large glass window on the west side of the business were broken.	<p>Surveillance video indicates on Wednesday morning at 3:06am, an early model GMC Yukon XL enters the parking lot in the 20000 Block of Lahser Rd. near the Deli and three subjects exit the vehicle and approach the business.</p> <p>At 3:11am, the vehicle then backed into the glass entry doors and windows on the west side of the business, breaking them open. The suspect vehicle then proceeded to drive in reverse through the store and collided with a large glass window on the north side of the business. The three subjects who were standing outside of the vehicle then proceeded to take an ATM machine from the Northwest corner of the business and placed it into the trunk of the suspect vehicle. The three suspects then entered the suspect vehicle and the vehicle fled the scene.</p> <p><b>Suspect Vehicle Description:</b> Early model GMC Yukon XL.</p> <p><b>Suspect #1:</b> Driver of suspect vehicle, description unknown.</p> <p><b>Suspect #2:</b> Masculine physique, thin build, wearing an all-black hooded sweatshirt (Nike Logo on left breast) with the hood up, and face covered by fabric (possibly a mask), black pants, light colored gloves, and white tennis shoes.</p> <p><b>Suspect #3:</b> Masculine physique, thin build, wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt with the hood up over his head, and fabric covering his face (possibly a scarf or</p>

			<p>mask), light colored gloves, black pants, and white shoes.</p> <p><b>Suspect #4:</b> Masculine physique, thin build, black hooded sweatshirt with the hood pulled up over his head, fabric covering subjects face (Possibly a scarf or mask), wearing black pants with red and white stripes, and black shoes.</p>

07/20/2018 1:24pm	20000 Sherman Ave.	Entered through unlocked door wall.	<p>R/P was at his sister's house to take delivery of a new TV for her. After the delivery was made and the R/P helped the driver place the TV inside the living room. R/P retreated into the house and went upstairs with his nephew. A short time later his nephew was looking out the window and observed an older B/F stealing the TV. The B/F suspect opened the unlocked door wall, took the new TV out of the house, and loaded it into her van.</p> <p>Southfield Officers arrived and located the suspect. The suspect was a caretaker for victim's neighbor. She stated she took the TV and put it in her vehicle for safe keeping, concerned that someone would steal it? Officers weren't buying the suspects story and she didn't have permission to enter the residence or take the TV. Officers took the female suspect into custody for Home Invasion and Larceny.</p>

The homeowner was home when his alarm was activated.</p> <p>The neighbor (witness) stated that he was home and heard the closing of a car door. He looked outside his window and saw a black car parked one house down from his home. He said he saw the car was occupied by three people, two males and one female all wearing black hoodies and with something covering their faces. The black female was heavy set and resembled the build of his neighbor's daughter who he hadn't seen lately. He heard a boom, heard an alarm going off, then saw a black male and the female run away from his neighbors (victims) garage. Witness went back to his bed room window and could see that his neighbors garage door had been kicked in.</p> <p><b>Suspect Description:</b></p> <p><b>Suspect #1</b> Heavy Set black female, wearing a black hoodie. After placing the male half into the police vehicle, he damaged the interior of police vehicle and spit on the windows.

## Special Attention: Larceny of Air Conditioning Units:

Continuing to see Larceny of Air Conditioning Units from Apartment Complexes throughout the city. Most recently there were 13- Units stolen from two Apartment Complexes in the area of Eleven Mile Rd. & Greenfield Rd.

Officers stopped a U-Haul Truck containing several air conditioning units believed to be the ones taken from these Apartment Complexes.

TCSU Officers investigation led to the arrest of two subjects for the Larceny of these AC Units.

This past week we had 4- AC Units stolen from a Multi Office complex in the 28000 Block of Greenfield Rd.

Surveillance video shows at 4:37am an unknown subject wearing a hoodie, shorts and gym shoes appears on screen alongside the building.

The subject disappears then returns at 4:38am near the A/C units accompanied by another unknown subject wearing a hoodie with dark colored pants and shoes and begins to disconnect the units. At 5:16am, what appeared to be a White Dodge Ram with chrome running boards pulled up next to where the subjects were cutting the A/C units. The pickup truck had a black and silver enclosed trailer attached to it. The subjects loaded the AC Units in the trailer and fled the area.

## Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
