Officers positioned their vehicles so as to not allow suspect to flee. The suspect however put his car in reverse and drove at Officers narrowly hitting them and striking their vehicles.</p> <p>Suspect was able to flee complex out onto 12 Mile Rd. where marked units were waiting and engaged in pursuit of vehicle.</p> <p>Pursuit went e/b on 12 Mile Rd., to s/b Telegraph Rd. where suspect struck another vehicle and the pursuit ended. The suspect then bailed from his vehicle and attempted to flee on foot.</p> <p>Officers pursued suspect and apprehended him. The suspect resisted arrest and Officers used the necessary force to affect the arrest.</p> <p>It was learned from Officers pursuing suspect that the suspect threw the stolen catalytic converter out the window of his car during the pursuit. It was recovered by other Officers.</p> <p>Officers also recovered suspect's wallet. Located inside the wallet was the registration to another vehicle that was used in several other LFA's that occurred in Southfield. Officers were dispatched to Hotel for an intoxicated subject in the café. Officers arrived and spoke to the Hotel Manager. The manager stated that subject was still in the café; he was intoxicated and they wanted him removed from the hotel.

Officers located subject in the café and advised him that management was evicting him from the hotel and he had to leave the hotel. The subject refused to leave. The subject was removed from the hotel by Officers.

Friends of the subject offered to take the subject to another hotel. Officers agreed to stand by until arrangements could be made to pick up subject. While waiting for a ride the subject continued to be disorderly yelling and screaming at patrons coming to and from the hotel and making threats towards Officers and telling them that he can do whatever he wants.

At this point Officers arrested subject for Disorderly Conduct. The subject resisted arrest and Officers had to use the necessary force to handcuff the subject and place him into their Police vehicle.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

Officer gave chase and eventually caught up with the suspect and took him into custody. Further investigation revealed that this subject had discarded his shorts with suspected marijuana, a holster and a handgun while being chased.

A Southfield Police K-9 Officer responded to scene and conducted an article search of the route suspect fled on foot. K-9 recovered a holster that had been discarded and recovered a handgun that had been discarded in the bushes.

This subject was arrested for CCW/ Possession of Marijuana and R&O.

The driver of the vehicle was arrested for the confirmed Felony Warrant. The other occupant was released at scene.
