



Manager for Apartment Complex advises on Tuesday July 2, 2019 between 8:00am- 9:00am suspect(s) stole a total of eleven (11) A/C Units from the complex. The lines leading to the units were all cut. One witness observed an unknown B/M 40-50 year in age, wearing a white shirt, blue workpants, and black shoes, walking around the complex with an air conditioner in his hands. Witness stated she observed the B/M on 06/02/2019 at approx. at 8:00am.

# CCW/ R&O 1- Arrest 07/08/2019 7:52pm W Eight Mile Rd. & Lahser Rd.

On 07/08/2019 Officers were patrolling the area of Lahser Rd. and Eight Mile Rd. when they observed a Blue Ford Fusion travelling N/B Lahser north of Eight Mile Rd.

Officers ran the plate on vehicle and it came back through SOS as having "No Insurance". Officers stopped vehicle w/o incident. There were three subjects in the vehicle and the driver was asked to exit the vehicle because the vehicle was going to be impounded. The driver refused to exit the vehicle, locked his door and rolled the window up. After several requests to exit the vehicle and the threat to break the window out the driver finally unlocked the door. The driver was taken into custody for R&O. After searching the vehicle Officers recovered a loaded handgun which was under the front seat where the driver was seated. The driver was also charged with CCW.

### Note:

On 07/09/2019 Southfield Police Detective put a BOL to All Officers regarding these LFA's of A/C Units. Several photos were attached to the BOL indicating that there were two possible suspect vehicles. One of the vehicles was a light colored or white older Dodge Ram Pick Up Truck with a sunroof. One of the photo's shows the vehicle leaving the complex. It appears there are A/C Units in the back of the truck. The second vehicle was an unknown Dark Colored Sedan.

Citizens that live in apartment complexes and observe anyone that looks like they're working on a A/C Unit and it's during the daytime should immediately call the management office to see if anyone should be working on units in the complex. If they say no, call 911 to report incident.

If you witness the same thing during the evening or early morning hours immediately call 911 and give police dispatch as much information as you can about the suspects and their vehicles.

# Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you hear any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. # Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

## How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
