(Department Store)	Attempted to force open the loading dock door.	<p>On 06/11/2019 at approx. 1:43am, Officers were dispatched to business in the 30000 Block of Southfield Rd. on a B&E in progress.</p> <p>Upon arrival, Officers observed damage to the far west loading dock door at the n/w corner of the building. The loading dock door was open approx. 3-6 inches. There were fresh pry marks on the door. The suspects were unable to gain access into the business.</p> <p>The alarm company advised dispatch the two suspects ran south once the alarm on the building sounded. They ran towards North Dr. into Apartment Complex. Both suspects were carrying backpacks.</p> <p>K-9 Officer responded and initiated a track. K-9 Ruger tracked south along the back of business. The track continued over the concrete wall into the Apartment Complex. K-9 tracked through the center of the complex. The track led directly to apartment in the 18000 Block of South Dr. Officers knocked on multiple doors in building but the residents could not provide any viable information and the suspects weren't located.</p> <p>At 3:35am, dispatch advised Officers the alarm company called back and stated the same subjects returned to the rear of the store. The subjects were at the same loading dock door they previously attempted to B&E. Same description of the males from earlier. Suspects were gone before officers arrived.</p> <p>Officers arrived and started another K-9 track from the</p>

			<p>rear of business. K-9 tracked south along the building. As they got to the concrete wall that borders Apartment Complex, Officers observed two suspects walking directly in front of the address K-9 previously tracked to. Once the suspects saw Officers, they took off running on foot in separate directions. As officers gave chase on foot, the suspects disregarded verbal commands to stop. Officers caught up to the suspect dressed in all black. Officers took suspect to the ground. He complied and laid on the ground. He was handcuffed without incident.</p> <p>The second suspect was located by another Southfield Officer. He also fled on foot from Officer. Officer gave chase and caught up to suspect and he was taken into custody w/o incident.</p> <p>Both suspects in custody for Attempt B&E/ R&O. K-9 Officer conducted an article search of the area where the suspects fled on foot for any articles of evidence. K-9 alerted to a bush along the west side of the pool where one of the suspects fled on foot. K-9 located in the bush a pair of gloves and a stocking hat with eye holes cut into it. The hat and gloves were collected as evidence.</p>

It has no license plate on it but does have a paper plate or license plate in the back window on the right side. It has a gray panel covering the rear tow hitch. The vehicle has chrome door handles. The rims on the vehicle are also significantly different than most Chevrolet Equinoxes as they have more spokes.</p> <p>Follow up Investigation by Southfield Detectives. After receiving the serial numbers for the stolen items Detectives verified that three of the items had been pawned at a nearby Pawn Shop on the same day of the theft.</p> <p>Detectives went to Pawn Shop and met with the manager who confirmed the items were in his possession. The items were purchased from suspect who presented himself as the rightful owner. The suspect arrived at pawn shop in a Black vehicle possibly Chevy Equinox or GM type SUV (Similar to what witness had reported) which was parked in front of his store.</p> <p>A Law Enforcement Property Hold Request was served to the manager of the pawn shop.</p> <p>One suspect has been identified and incident is under further investigation.</p>

(Condo's) Victim stated he was getting out of his vehicle, when an unknown B/M came up and "punched" him in the neck. Victim stated they struggled out in the parking lot and the suspect began to run east through the apartment complex. Victim did not know that he had been cut with a knife. The suspect was wearing a white beanie with a skull design and a blue jumpsuit. After the assault was over, the male took off east through the complex and the victim attempted to pursue the suspect. During the traffic stopped it was discovered that the driver had

Southfield Detectives received info from Bank Fraud Investigator on a High Dollar Fraud Purchase where a High- End Watch was supposed to be picked up at the Jewelry Store in Southfield. Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles

How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

-After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.

Special Attention: Vehicle Wanted for Fleeing & Eluding

Southfield Rd. & W Nine Mile Rd.

On 06/14/2019 at 11:50pm Officer was traveling e/b on Nine Mile East of Providence Dr. when he observed a Red Chevy Malibu travelling w/b with no headlights activated.

Officer turned around drove behind the vehicle and activated his emergency lights and observed the vehicle accelerate at a high rate of speed while crossing into the center lane e/b towards s/b Southfield Service Drive. Officer notified dispatch that he was in pursuit of a Red Chevy Malibu and put out the License Plate information.

Officer activated his lights & siren as the Malibu turned s/b on Southfield Service Drive and continued to flee. The Malibu continued s/b on Southfield Service Drive south of Eight Mile Rd.

Officer terminated the chase and notified dispatch that the vehicle was continuing s/b on Southfield Service Drive.

Officer was able to identify the registered owner of the vehicle and incident is under further investigation.

Suspect Vehicle:

2015 Red Chevy Malibu

-If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.
