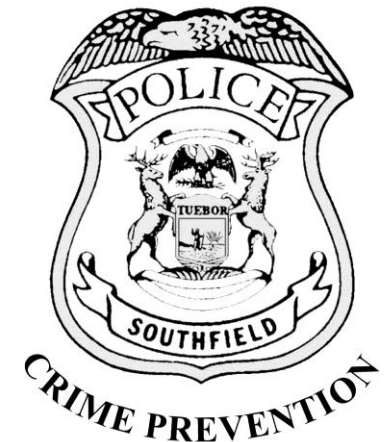
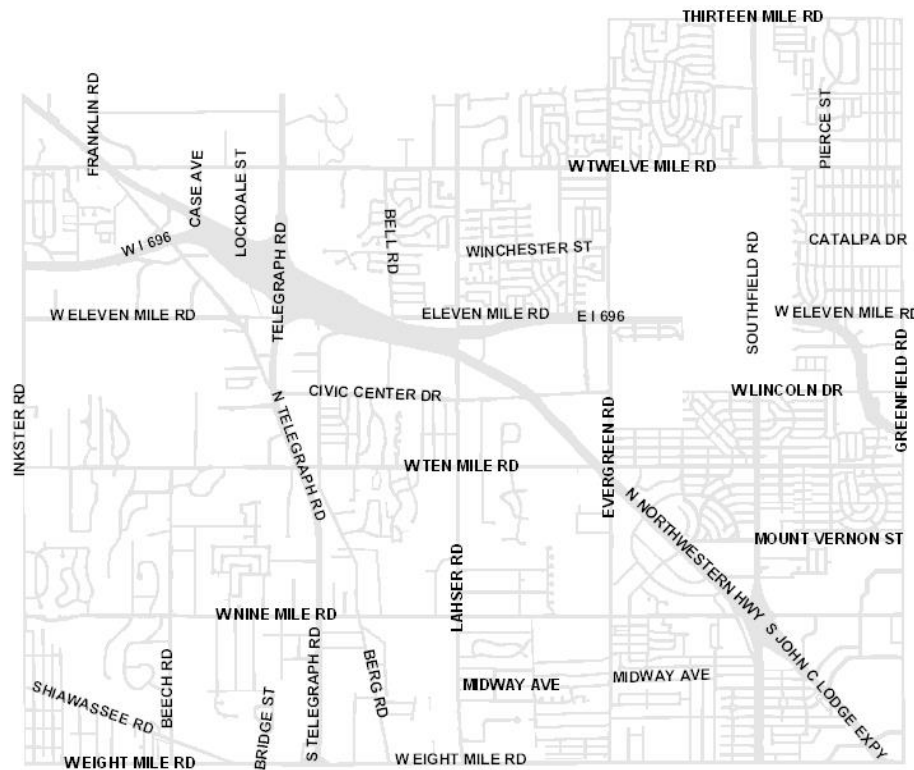

<p>Special Attention: Attempt Murder 05/27/2018 9:58pm 16000 Block of North Park Dr. Officers were dispatched to Hospital in the 16000 Block of 9 Mile Rd. reference a shooting victim just admitted to the hospital. Victim was being treated when Officers arrived. Prior to being dispatched to this incident at 9:41pm on 05-27-2018, there were several shots heard near the 16000 Block of North Park Dr. Officer spoke to a witness from this incident that provided the following information: Witness states he was in the parking lot of the old Michigan Inn next to North Park Drive. He observed a White Pick Up Truck pull up next to an Unknown Type Sedan. Witness heard several gunshots and then both vehicles fled in different directions. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician searched the area where witness stated shots were fired and one spent shell casing was located and recovered in the intersection. Victim states the car he was in was his friends who was driving the car. Victim was the front seat passenger in the vehicle. Victim states he heard several shots during the incident. None of the shots came from the vehicle he was in. Victim wouldn't provide any more information. Officer was on routine patrol when he ran plate on vehicle, a Black 2000 Chevrolet Impala.

The registered owner returned with multiple Felony Warrants out of for Resisting a Police Officer/Flee and Elude (3rd Degree)/ and Unarmed Robbery. Vehicle was occupied one time.

Officers stopped the vehicle near 8 Mile & Evergreen Rd.

As Officer was exiting his patrol vehicle the driver made furtive movements towards the center console of the vehicle.

The driver was ordered to place his hands on the steering wheel and he complied. As Officer approached the vehicle he could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle.

After identifying that the driver of the vehicle was the registered owner he was taken into custody for DWLS. A subsequent search of the vehicle, incident to the arrest Officers located suspected marijuana in the center console of the vehicle.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician Field Tested a sample of the suspected marijuana.

The result was positive for possible presence of marijuana.

Subject: News Release

On April 6, 2018 at approximately 1:30 p.m., the Southfield Police Department responded to Apartment Complex in the 27000 block of Greenfield Road regarding a Home Invasion. Video surveillance captured a black male suspect, approximately 6'0", heavy set, bald, with a mustache and goatee and pierced ears entering the home by forcing the front door open. Some of the items that were stolen include: miscellaneous jewelry, small electronics, a 43-inch Visio TV, and a 55-inch Samsung TV. The suspect also stole the family's pet dog, a 9-month-old brown and white American Bully. The dog's name is Gucci.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

- Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.



-Lots of lighting around the area(s) that you park your vehicles is also very beneficial. Criminals don't like to work in well lighted areas. They prefer to work in darkness because it's difficult to see them.

Special Attention:

Larceny of Packages that were ordered and delivered via Common Carrier.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages.

Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package.

Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
