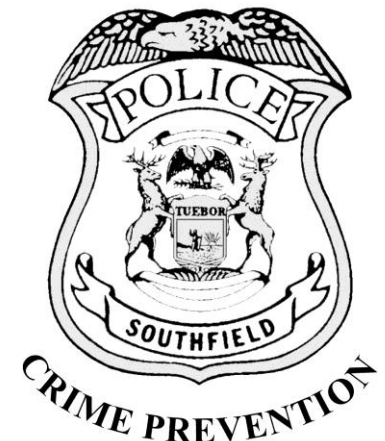
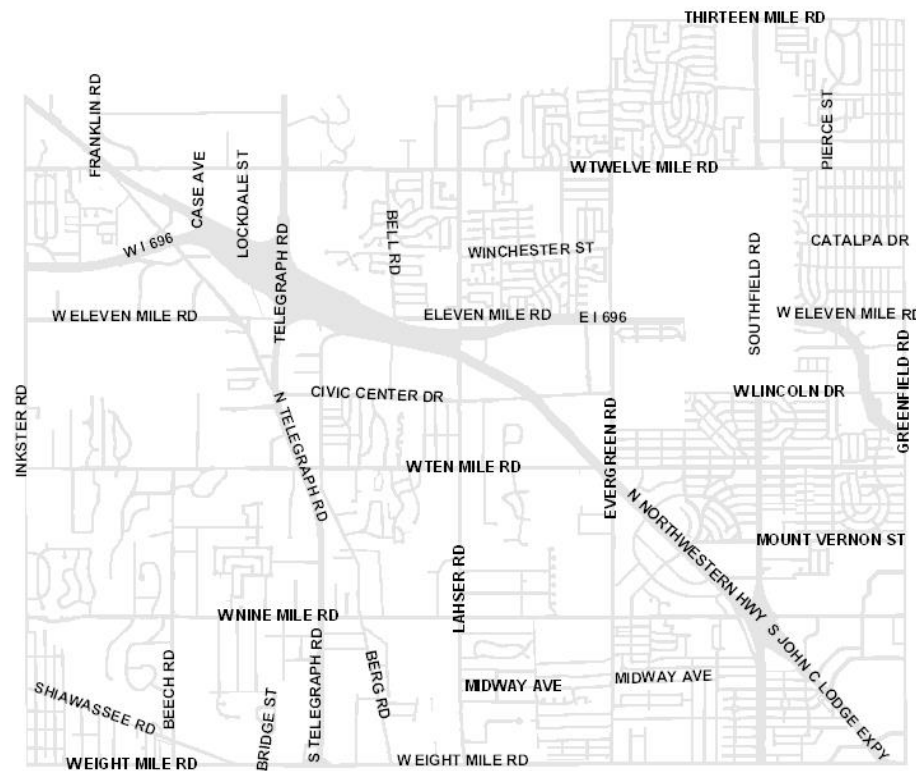

The foot prints stop at the parking lot inside the condo complex.</p> <p>Further viewing of surveillance video, the suspect appears to be the same person in the previous break in's. The suspect is wearing a unique jacket with a pattern of stripes. The video only shows the suspect at the south part of the building walking to the east side. Shortly afterwards the suspect is scene running back</p> |

## **F/A with a Knife/ Suspicious Circumstances Alleged Robbery/ Felony Warrant Arrest- 1- Arrest**

**18000 Block of Hilton Dr.**

Officers were dispatched to the 18000 Block of Hilton Dr. for a report of a Stabbing.

Officers arrived on scene and followed a trail of blood to up to the residence and inside the residence at 18921 Hilton Dr.

Officers located a female and a male who was bleeding from a stab wound. There was also damage to property at the residence and a vehicle parked out front had front end damaged and the front windshield was smashed.

The male was transported to hospital for treatment by SFD Life Unit. The male was treated at the hospital and Officers were advised he had non-life-threatening injuries and would be released after receiving stitches.

Further investigation by Officers revealed that the female half smelled of intoxicants and she had been partying at a Bar in Detroit. Officers suspect when she came home the male half was upset with her and a physical fight broke out.

Both the male and female were uncooperative with Officers and it appeared that they were both trying to convince Officers that the male was robbed and stabbed in the parking lot.

Officers suspect that the female stabbed the male half with a knife. A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene and collected evidence. The female was arrested for a Felony Warrant out of MSP for OWI. This incident is under further investigation.
