


Surveillance video captured a Silver Sedan driving S/B onto Sutherland at 5:22am and park on the side of the liquor store. Suspects are seen walking back and forth in front of the store for a few minutes. (Fast Food Business)

Manager states that a White, Pontiac G6, occupied by two black males came through the drive thru, ordered food and then pulled over into the parking lot to eat their food.

A short time later, the driver (suspect) walked up to the drive-thru window. The suspect claimed that he didn't receive one of his burritos.

The manager was certain that he had received all his food and told the suspect to go back to his car, and to not be standing in the drive-thru because it was dangerous.

A few moments later, the suspect went over to the south side of the store, picked up a brick paver, and threw it through one of the south-facing windows of the store, causing extensive damage to that window. There is surveillance video of the incident.

A message from Acting Police Chief Brian Bassett for a job well done:

At approximately 3:30pm on Monday 10/08/2018 we received a call from a woman stating her husband was currently in the kitchen with a knife yelling "someone is going to die." Dispatch immediately relayed the information and Officers were on scene within minutes. As Officers arrived the subject was in the apartment building parking lot still holding the knife. The subject refused to put down the knife and made several advances toward Officers. Officers on scene were able to deescalate the situation and take the subject into custody without injury. He was later transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment.

Southfield Police Dispatchers and Officers involved did an outstanding job of coordinating and managing the fluid scene. As I monitored the radio traffic, I heard our Officers and Dispatchers handling a dynamic and volatile situation with the utmost skill, care and professionalism. Our team's response turned this potential tragedy into an opportunity to get the individual the help he needs, while ensuring the safety of all individuals involved and nearby. I am always proud to serve beside all of you, and situations like this confirm I serve with the best.

Officer attempted to stop a Blue Chrysler 300 for a traffic violation. The suspect refused to stop and a pursuit was initiated. Officer terminated the pursuit when it left the city limits on S/B Telegraph at 8 Mile Rd. The vehicle was entered in LEIN as a wanted vehicle.

Note: While in-route to the hospital the subject made these statements:

He apologized for his actions. He informed Officers that his life is a struggle and he would never hurt anyone but doesn't want to live anymore. He stated he served six years in the US Army and understands the lethal force distance. He stated he knew if he walked towards Officers with the knife he believed they would have used lethal force on him, which is what he wanted.

His intention wasn't to harm anyone or the police.

This is what is commonly referred to as Suicide by Cop.

In this incident however, the subject was taken into Police Protective Custody w/o the use of lethal force and transported to hospital and turned over to Hospital Staff where he will hopefully get the help he needs!

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles How to prevent this from happening to you!

- -Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)
- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.
- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.
- -After parking your vehicle turn your wheels all the way to the right or the left. This will make it difficult to get the lug nuts off the front wheels.
- -If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.
- -If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and

Officers gained control of the subject's arms, got him handcuffed and into custody.

It was discovered that the subject suffers from ADHD and Opposition Defiance Disorder.

How to prevent this from happening to you!

Recently several citizens have had packages that were delivered to their residences and apartments stolen prior to them retrieving the packages. Citizens can prevent this from happening by scheduling a specific time to have the package delivered and be waiting for the package. Citizen can also schedule the package to be picked up by themselves at the common carrier facility.
