


Commercial Burglaries:

Date/Time	Address (block range)	Method of Entry	Description/Suspect Information
10/17/2016 5:12am	29000 Greenfield Rd. (Commercial- Restaurant)	Broke glass out on rear door.	<p>R/P (employee) for restaurant states the restaurant was closed the night prior at 10:00pm.</p> <p>R/P states she showed up at restaurant the following morning at 10:10am and discovered the business had been broken into.</p> <p>Video of incident shows the same suspect that broke into the business two weeks earlier was observed on this incident at approx. 5:12am breaking the glass to the rear entrance of location and made his way directly to the upstairs of the location where the money was kept in a floor safe. The suspect was unable to gain entry into the safe but did damage the handle of the safe with a hammer. R/P stated that nothing was taken that she could tell at this time.</p> <p>While looking at the video R/P identified the suspect as the same person who broke into the restaurant and stole an undisclosed amount of cash a couple weeks ago on 9/28/2016.</p> <p>Suspect was a former cleaning crew person for business and has several warrants in lein.</p> <p>Southfield Detectives reviewed surveillance videos from both B&E's and it was clear that it was the same person on both incidents. Suspect has been identified and the case has been submitted to OCPO for warrant review.</p>

<p>From: 10/18/2016 8:30pm To: 10/19/2016 10:00am</p>	<p>22000 Greenfield Rd. (Commercial/ Doctors Office)</p>	<p>Entry through unlocked door. Desk drawer was forced open.</p>	<p>R/P Doctor from suite advises sometime between 8:30pm and the following morning at 10:00am someone gained entry into suite through a door that may have been left unlocked by maintenance. Once inside the suite suspect forced open a desk drawer. The drawer contained an empty cash box that had been opened. (cash box was not locked and no cash was in it) Nothing else appeared to be disturbed. Information was developed that an employee saw the suspect in the hallway of the building at 8:36am. Security was able to pull up video surveillance of the suspect. The suspect is a B/M, wearing jeans, a black shirt, blue vest, black/white tennis shoes, and wearing a Chicago Bulls hat, medium complexion approx. 20-30 years old, and 5'-7" -5'- 8" tall. A Southfield Evidence Technician processed the scene and developed several latent from the cash box.</p>

(Commercial- Dental)</p>	<p>A lower level window was shattered.</p>	<p>R/P for business stated she locked the building up on 10/19/16 at 3:30pm and set the alarm. R/P returned the following morning at 7:35am to open the building. When she entered she deactivated the alarm. She walked through the building and discovered a large picture window on the lower level was shattered. There was nothing disturbed inside the business and there were no alarm trips.</p>

<p>From: 10/19/2016 7:00pm To: 10/20/2016 7:50am</p>	<p>15000 Providence Dr. (Commercial Café- Connected to Apartment Complex)</p>	<p>Attempt only. A bolt holding the roll up door was damaged and the roll up door was off the track.</p>	<p>Owner reports that when she arrived to open the café she noticed metal shavings on the floor on both sides of the store's roll up gate. The gate is secured by pushing a bolt through a hole and placing a lock on the bolt. The bolt was damaged and the gate's side track was loose and it was not like that when the business was closed the day prior. R/P also reports that the lights in the lobby area in front of the café were turned off. No entry was gained into the café and no property is missing.</p>

(Leasing Vehicle)</p> <p>Detectives located the vehicle parked at Hotel in the 27000 Block of Northwestern Hwy in front of hotel room.</p> <p>Information was developed that two females staying in that room were associated with the stolen vehicle.</p> <p>Detectives went to the room and knocked on the door. There were in fact two females in the room.</p> <p>Investigation revealed that one of the females rented the vehicle and the other female took the vehicle for approx. two weeks and just brought the vehicle back a couple days ago.</p> <p>The female that had the vehicle for two weeks gave an alias name and made admissions that she was a Heroin Addict. 10/23/2016 12:00am	26000 American Dr.	Undisclosed amount of cash was taken.	<p>Victim works for Cab Company. He received a call for service from subject that gave only his first name. Victim picked up subject and two other subjects in a neighboring community.</p> <p>Victim states he drove the three suspects to a residence in Detroit where he thought they bought some drugs. Victim then drove the subjects to the area near a hotel in the 26000 Block of American Dr. in Southfield for their final destination.</p> <p>Victim parked his minivan. They all remained in the vehicle until one of the males handed money to pay for the cab fare. He stated he was attempting to give the three suspects change when one of the suspects grabbed the money out of his hands. All three suspects took off running east towards a nearby hotel.</p> <p>Officers responding to incident couldn't locate suspects. They did speak with the person working the front desk at the hotel.</p> <p>The Front Desk Clerk advised Officers that the suspects did not come into the lobby of the Hotel.</p>

R/P (Shooter) called reporting that he shot a male subject who had ran up on him and sprayed something at him. R/P believed he was going to be assaulted or robbed so he shot the subject. Victim was taken to hospital in stable condition. The R/P (shooter) was brought into the station to be interviewed. Investigation is ongoing at this time.

CCW/ PWID-

Southfield Rd. & W Eight Mile Rd.

Officers were on routine patrol when they observed poss. narcotics activity (hand to hand) between two young B/M's on foot and occupant(s) of a vehicle parked in the parking lot at business in the 16000 Block of 8 Mile Rd.

Officers followed and stopped the vehicle after it left the parking lot.

Upon stopping the vehicle Officers could detect a strong odor of marijuana emanating from the interior of the vehicle.

The lone driver of the vehicle was asked to exit his vehicle and was advised a K-9 Unit was going to do a sweep of the vehicle.

During the sweep of the vehicle K-9 alerted on a black & white bag in the interior of the vehicle. Inside of the bag were several plastic bags with suspected marijuana and a scale.

Further search of the vehicle Officers located additional plastic bags with suspected marijuana and a handgun was located under the driver seat.

A Southfield Police Evidence Technician processed the scene, took photos, collected evidence and Field Tested a sample of the suspected marijuana. The result was positive for possible presence of marijuana.

The driver of vehicle was arrested for CCW & PWID marijuana.

There was also an undisclosed amount of cash that was confiscated and forfeited.

The two subjects that Officers observed doing the hand to hand buy with suspect were not located at this time.

Special Attention: Larceny from Vehicles
How to prevent this from happening to you!

-Citizens should never leave anything of value inside their vehicle. (Especially Handguns, Purses, Wallets, Cash & Cell Phones!)

- If you have a garage you should park your vehicle in the garage and lock the garage.

- Wheel Locks are a deterrent but don't leave the wheel lock key in the interior of your vehicle, especially the center console or glove box. This is the first place they will look for the wheel lock.

- If you don't have a garage, try to park your vehicle as close to your residence as possible.

-If you here any loud noises near where your vehicle is parked, especially during the late night or early morning hours, attempt to look outside without alerting anyone and if someone is tampering with your vehicle immediately call 911, (Do Not Approach or Scare the Suspects Away) give Police Dispatchers as much information about the suspect(s) and suspect vehicles as you can. Stay on the phone with Dispatchers until the Police arrive.

Officers responded to a suspicious subject. The caller was a resident in the area. She stated that there was a subject with a back pack pacing back and forth on the sidewalk and walked onto the porch of her neighbor's house across the street.

The caller stated she has never seen this subject before and knows that the homeowner isn't home.

Officers responded and located subject matching the description walking e/b on Concord at Concord Ct (1 block east of Dover). The subject was on his cell phone. The subject was stopped and questioned. During questioning the subject made admissions that he had a gun in his back pack but stated it wasn't his.

Officers located and retrieved the handgun. Inspection of the handgun revealed that someone had filed off the serial number and was completely unidentifiable and needs to be further processed.

The suspect couldn't offer any reasonable explanation for being in the area. He was arrested for CCW & Possession of Firearm with Altered Serial #.
